It was standing room only at Lane Community College's first annual graduation ceremonies as an overflow crowd heard Dr. Miles Romney, Vice-Chancellor, State System of Higher Education, give the graduation address at North Eugene High School on Sunday afternoon, June 5.

Graduates received degrees or certificates from Chairman of the Board of Education Mr. William W. Bristow, Jr. This year's graduation class numbered 165 students.

Dr. Dale Parnell, LCC President, served as Master of Ceremonies; student speakers were Mr. Charles Solomon, 1965-66 Student Body President, and Mr. Robert Wimberly, 1966-67 Student Body President. Mr. Carol deBroekert, Assistant Professor of History, represented the LCC faculty on the speakers' platform. Miss Margaret Haskell, President of the LCC Christian Youth Fellowship, presented the Invocation. Mrs. Dona Ransome was the organist.

More than 800 persons attended the graduation and were hosted by the faculty wives at a reception following the services.

#### LCC's OWN KLCC

Lane Community College is moving ahead with plans for a new eudcational FM radio station to be used in training of radio station personnel, according to Roger Houglum, Electronics Division Chairman. The LCC Board of Directors has authorized the preparation of an application to the Federal Communication Commission for a "construction permit" for such a new station. When completed, the station would be licensed to Lane Community College. To indicate the school affiliation, the call letter KLCC will be requested.

Radio station KRVM, licensed to the Eugene Public Schools, will be largely staffed this coming year by a paid professional staff resulting in fewer training opportunities in program production and station operation for LCC radio students. However, a few second year radio Communications students will probably be auditioned next fall for positions on the KRVM staff.

Facilities sought in the application will be FM Chanel 212, 90.3 mc, with a power of 10 watts. When the station is moved to the new campus, current plans call for increasing the transmitter power to 250 or 1000 watts at a site on Blanton Heights. This would insure coverage of all the Upper Willamette Valley.


# DIPLOMAS AND REPORT CARDS

#### LAST "BELL" FOR ARCH

The last day of school will have special meaning for Arch Bell, veteran LCC instructor, when he closes up shop for summer vacation this year. Mr. Bell, Auto Mechanics instructor, will retire this June after 20 years of teaching. He began his teaching career at the Eugene-Vocational school in 1946, joining the LCC Staff July 1, 1966.

Thursday afternoon at the Staff picnic Mr. Bell was presented with a set of woods by LCC president Dale Parnell as a parting gift from fellow Staff members.

#### FIRST DAY OF SUMMER

Summer Session classes will get under way June 21 at LCC with an anticipated enrollment of 450-500 students. Dean of Students I. S. Hakanson reports an expected enrollment of 300 in the College Transfer Program on the Springfield Campus, and between 150-200 for the new Occupational Exploratory courses which are designed to allow students to explore several different occupational areas during the eight-week Summer Session.

Students planning to attend LCC Summer Session only are asked to submit an application form and a completed request for transfer of credits; students planning to attend during the regular Fall Term also should submit an application form, a transcript of high school credits, transcripts from all post high school institutions, and a completed physical examination form.

Verified schedules may be picked up June 20. Classes begin June 21 and continue through August 12.

#### ADULT ED SCHOLARSHIPS

Over 200 Adult Evening Program students have received high school completion diplomas at graduation services held throughout Lane Community College District during the past weeks. Communities holding exercises include Cottage Grove, Creswell, Crow, Eugene, Florence, Oakridge, Pleasant Hill, and Springfield.

Winners of this year's Board of Education Scholarships were announced as part of the graduation activities in the District. The Scholarships, donated by the Directors of the LCC Board of Education, are for use at Lane Community College. Winners include Marie Tibbs, Florence; Lillian Hughes, Cottage Grove; Elias Ghali, Eugene; Ernestine Bracy, Oakridge; Barbara Elliot, Springfield.

#### DENTAL ASSISTANTS HIRED
