LCC TO HOST STATE BOARD

The State Board of Education will be on campus Tuesday, February 7, for an all day, full agenda meeting. The Board will meet in the Studio on the Eugene Campus during the morning, and will tour the facilities after lunch before adjourning to the Lane County IED Office later in the afternoon.

ENROLLMENT GROWTH CONTINUES

Latest figures show a total of 4,811 full and part-time students enrolled Winter Term at LCC, an increase of 1,888 over Winter Term for 1965-66. Of these, 1,443 are enrolled in college transfer programs; 2,810 are in occupational programs; the remainder are in MDTA and other special programs.

Classes are being held in 40 different locations to accommodate the record enrollment.

STAFF ASSOCIATION MEETS

The LCC Staff Association has scheduled a meeting for staff members on Thursday, February 9, at 4:00 pm, in the Studio on the Eugene Campus. Main topic of discussion will be Health and Medical Insurance proposals. However, this will be an open agenda meeting if anyone has items to bring up at this time.

The occasion turned out to be a real "Date With a Dream" for SB President Robert Wimberly, who announced his engagement to Shirley Ann Urych of Salem during the evening. LCC now has 247 staff members, including 91 full-time instructors, 77 part-time instructors, 18 administrators, and 61 classified staff members. Counselors are included in the faculty count.

KPNW TURNED ON

At exactly 8:30 am Monday morning, February 20, LCC's own radio station KPNW signed on the air with its first regularly scheduled broadcast day. Preliminary reports from listeners indicated the FM station had an excellent signal in Springfield, Junction City, and in the Eugene area.

Since the station will be used as a training laboratory by Radio Communications students planning to work in commercial broadcasting stations, a typical commercial station format of "music and news" will be followed, with emphasis on a middle-of-the-road approach to music.

KPNW is heard on 90.3 megacycles, FM channel 212, with a power of 450 watts.

AAJC CONFERENCE

Board Chairman Lyle Swetland, Vice-Chairman Dean Webb, Budget Committee Chairman Richard Williams, President Dale Parnell, Dean of Instruction William Hein, Dean of Students I.S. Hakanson, and Gerald Rasmussen, President of the LCC Staff Association, will represent Lane Community College at the National Conference of the American Association of Junior Colleges in San Francisco February 27-March 3.

GOALS GAINED

27 students are now enrolled in MDTA sponsored classes held at the Labor Temple Campus. Four major study areas are involved: reading development, refresher math, basic shop skills, and occupational exploration.
