SUMMER BRINGING NO LETUP IN ACTIVITY

As the 1966-67 College year draws to a close LCC is already deep in plans for the coming year. Activities scheduled so far include the Administration-Division Chairman retreat August 3 & 4; call for bids for the last group of new campus buildings on August 15 (Phase I); and plans to work through the summer for two important committees: Professional Growth Program Development, and Accreditation Self-Study. The Staff Load, Staff Evaluation, Audio-Visual, Culinary Arts, Curriculum and Program Development, Family Life Curriculum and Program Development Committees will complete projects already under way this summer.

MURIEL GETS TEETH INTO DEGREE PROGRAM

Muriel Peterson, Head of the LCC Dental Program, will spend the summer attending the University of Iowa summer session. Mrs. Peterson has received an award covering tuition and fees, plus a \$600 stipend, under the Dental Auxiliary Teachers Summer Education Program which is supported by the U.S. Public Health Department.

Mrs. Peterson will be eligible for the same award for three additional summer sessions.

KPNW AND THE TORCH SNOOZING

Construction at the new campus site is moving 'full speed ahead' as contractors dig in to complete excavation for all the campus tunnels which will connect the campus buildings. Grading for the outside PE Activity Area, Medical Technology Building, and PE Building is being completed and work is beginning on parking areas and roads.

In addition to excavation work, more columns for the Automotive Diesel Building were being erected as of June 15, as well as pouring of concrete. Concrete footings for the Industrial Technology and Apprenticeship Building have been poured also.

Contractors working at the site at the present time include C. H. Durbin Company, site grading; Wilson Construction Company, Science, Electronics, and Forum buildings; Verne Harding Company, Mechanics building; and Robert Morrow Company, Business Technology, Industrial Technology, and Administration buildings.
