LONG-RANGE PLANNING - Where do we go from here? How did we get here? How do we get from here to there? Those are among the questions that President Schafer is challenging the newly appointed Long-Range Planning Steering Committee to answer. The citizen-staffstudent committee met for the first time Thursday and chose two former Board members as officers: Charlene Curry as chairer and Bob Mention as vice chairer. A series of subcommittees, to include broad staff representation, will be organized to develop goals, plan activities, and conduct reviews.
