**MIGRANT CHILDREN NEEDS**--On April 29, State Representative Nancie Fadeley met with Early Childhood Education students who are studying the needs of migrant children. Their class, called Deprivation and Children, introduces problems of various disadvantaged groups, focusing on the effects of children. Ms. Fadeley told of the migrant situation in Oregon and legislation affecting migrants. Following the class session a group of seven students formed a task force to investigate the minimum wage laws for farm workers, with the intention of working toward legislative change. The participating students are Kathy Anderson, Cynthia Hiller, Cindy Rice, Tamaro Rodenbough, Becky Sakrison, and Shelley Wallace.



BOARD OF EDUCATION--The LCC Board will meet in public session tonight at 9 p.m. The major item on the agenda is acceptance of the election defeat April 20 and discussion of the date for the second budget election. In his agenda comments, President Schafer cited the following as reasons for the budget defeat: property valuation increases, CETA positions being picked up on local taxes, heavy turnout of voters in the outlying areas, voters against any tax increases, the desire to defeat the first budget, the payment of federal income taxes just before election, and reaction against the 4-J principal transfer. President Schafer says the April 20 budget was "a good budget adequately reflecting the operational needs of the College...Therefore, we propose not to effect major program cuts at this time." He proposes eliminating all CETA funding from the budget and identifying a cash carryover. The effect of the proposed cuts would reduce the proposed tax rate to \$1.41 per \$1,000 true cash value from \$1.61 currently. He also proposes that the Board set June 29 as the date of the next budget election.

TORCH EDITOR--Second year Journalism student Kathleen Monje was selected Monday evening as the Torch editor for the 1976-77 school year. She has served as treasurer for the ASLCC and chairwoman of the ASLCC Budget and Finance Committee. A resident of Eugene, Ms. Monje will take over the \$110 a month post in the Fall.

**BOARD OF EDUCATION**--A decision was delayed until May 12 for the date of the next budget election and what cuts will be made in the budget proposal. President Schafer has recommended that June 29 be set as the date of the next election and that the budget be reduced \$285,000 before going to the voters a second time. If accepted, Schafer's recommendations would mean a 14 per cent decrease in the property tax rate from the current year's rate--from \$1.61 to \$1.41 per \$1,000 true cash value. The Board was presented with survey results compiled after the defeat suggesting that the major reason for no votes was a dissatisfaction with the high cost of property taxes generally.

In other business, Dean of Instruction Gerald Rasmussen indicated recommendations would be coming to the Board in the next couple of meetings for four department and program reorganizations. Those include Paridental/Paramedical - Nursing, Interdisciplinary Studies, Learning Resources, and Women's Studies.

BOARD OF EDUCATION--The Board went beyond the administration's recommended \$325,000 budget reduction last night, and cut the proposed budget another \$150,000, for a total reduction of just under a half a million dollars from the defeated April 20 election. As a result, district voters will vote June 29 on \$1.5 million outside the six per cent limitation on a total budget of \$14 million dollars. The tax rate will drop from \$1.61 per \$1,000 assessed evaluation this year to \$1.37 per \$1,000 evaluation -- a 15 per cent reduction. The administration proposed cuts which will eliminate all CETA funding from the budget and identify a cash carryover. The area of the additional \$150,000 cut from the budget will be determined at a future board session. With the budget reduction, it is estimated that the total LCC taxes levied on a property will be less if the budget is approved unless the property's re-evaluation exceeded 17.5 per cent.

In other action, the board voted in a 4-to-2 decision to disband the Interdisciplinary Studies department.

GREATER OREGON--Greater Oregon Health Insurance, which provides medical and visual insurance for classified, faculty and management employees, is under order of the Insurance Commissioner to increase its reserve from \$25,000 to \$250,000 as required by the 1975 legislature. There has been an indication that insurance rates will increase next year and since LCC has an opportunity to call for bids (within its contracts) and is aware of the possible rate increase, it will do so in hopes of keeping the costs down and services up. The call for bids has been announced and the company providing the required coverage plan at the lowest rates will be selected, effective July 1. In the meantime, Greater Oregon has assured LCC that all claims will be paid. The Personnel Office is studying the situation, attempting to keep up on new developments, as are insurance committees on campus. Lorraine Dillon, ext. 258, is available to assist with any problems anyone might have with insurance or claims.
