ELECTION NUMBER THREE--The Board of Education meets Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. (third consecutive Wednesday). The agenda this week includes the setting of the next levy election, a canvass of the June 29 election, paying construction claims, possible allocations for Adm. Bldg. remodeling and general construction planning, discussion of Board Scholarship award procedures, and more work on updating Board policies. The levy election probably will be September 21; amount of the levy probably will be same as sought at the June 29 election.

AS FOR ELECTION NUMBER TWO--The college carried Eugene 4J with 55% of the vote, but lost in the other 15 school districts. District-wide, LCC's yes vote totaled 47% compared to 31% on April 20. As usual, 78% of the yes votes came fron Eugene 4J and parts of Springfield. South and Central Eugene were heavily positive with yes votes of up to 79% in some precincts.

SAME AS LAST YEAR--LCC's third attempt to get voter approval of an operating budget levy will be September 21. Amount being sought beyond the 6% limitation is \$1,424,794 and that's the same size levy as was approved by voters a year ago on June 17, 1975. The tax rate, however, would drop about 16% from \$1.61 per \$1000 true cash value to \$1.35. The cutback since the June 29 election defeat totals \$75,000 but the proposed budget remains the same. A higher than expected cash carryover into the new fiscal year reduced the amount of revenue needed.

NEW LEADER--The LCC Board of Education last week picked Jim Martin of Springfield as 1976-77 chairman and Catherine Lauris of Eugene as vice chairwoman. Edward Cooper was seated as Al Brauer's successor and Steve Reid was sworn in for a second term.

EXCESS BUT NOT EXCESSIVE--Howard Bird, our man in federal excess property, told the Board last week that he has acquired instructional and other equipment worth about \$375,000. New, it cost the federal government about \$1.5 million. And, Howard assures, there's much more to come.

KEEP IT LIKE IT IS--The first 1,384 responses to a survey seeking public input as to future instructional priorities indicate that most people want LCC to stay comprehensive. They want courses and programs which meet varying needs. Some respondents, however, would like a strictly tech-voc school. The ranking assigns No. 1 priority to techvoc programs, with other services in this order: 2) transfer courses which are part of tech-voc programs, 3) basic skills courses, 4) courses which transfer into bachelor degree programs, 5) non-credit courses for adults. The complete survey should be available late this month.

GRANTS--1) Allan Gubrud, Physical science prof, has received a three year \$137,400 grant from the National Science Foundation to develop physical science audio-video learning modules. 2)LCC will share in a Title 1 award of \$55,631 given the UofO to study ways of reaching non-traditional learners. 3) Through the League for Innovation, LCC will participate in a U.S. Research and Development Administration-funded National Institute on Energy Education in Community Colleges. Instructional Operations Dean Gerald Rasmussen will go to Brookdale Community College in New Jersey in early August for a planning conference. It is hoped that the colleges can develop courses in energy education.
