IN CASE YOU MISSED IT IN THE MEDIA--The Cooperative Science Museum Commission has been awarded a \$410,000 grant from the Ecomonic Development Administration to erect a building in Baker Park. Eugene, Lane County, IED, and SWOMSI will contribute additional monies to raise the project total to \$750,000. Construction is expected to begin next spring. Partners, besides those mentioned, include the U of O and LCC. Lewis Case is our man on the CSM Commission.

ABOUT THAT SEPTEMBER 21 ELECTION--The \$1,424,794 beyond the 6% limitation is the same amount as last year's levy. Annual cost for the owner of a \$25,000 home is \$9.15. A total of 20.6% has now been cut from the original budget proposal. The total LCC property tax rate (for the levy, tax base and bond retirement) would be \$1.35 per \$1000 true cash value or \$33.75 for the year on a \$25,000 home. Your LCC property taxes should be lower than last year unless your 1976 property reassessment exceeded 19.3%.

TANK TRANSPORTATION BID AWARDED--The LCC Board of Education met briefly at noon last Tuesday to hire the Progressive Transportation Co. of Irwindale, CA to haul two huge water storage tanks to the campus. The tanks, which have a capacity of 54,000 gallons each, will be instrumental to a plan to reduce campus heating costs and thus save an estimated \$107,000 annually. It's complicated, but the plan in a nutshell is to heat water at night and then siphon the heat from it each morning to warm the buildings. The saving accrues because EWEB charges for its electricity based on peak usage; this plan will reduce the peak usage dramatically and cut costs by a fourth. The tanks are federal excess property and thus free to LCC except for the \$16,250 transportation cost. They're big: 65 feet long, 13 feet high, 12½ feet wide and weigh 101,100 pounds each. That height makes it necessary to truck them on "back roads" because I-5 overpasses are too low. They're supposed to arrive September 10 and to be in service in October.
