THE BOARD OF EDUCATION will meet at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Board Room, and will install Lynn Moore as Board member from Zone 3 for a four year term. Other agenda items include: Request for approval of Proposal being submitted for funding from the Economic Development Administration; and two items from previous sessions--Recognition of ABE and High School Completion part-time employees as an LCCEA Bargaining Unit, and ASLCC Budget Funding Alternatives. Following the meeting the Board plans to tour the new Word Processing Center.

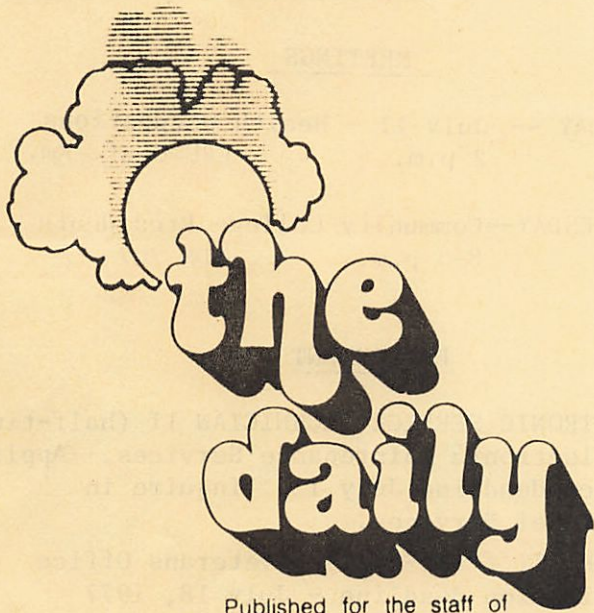

Wednesday Evening, after seating Lynn Moore from Springfield as the newest member of the Board of Education, the Board elected Catherine Lauris as chairman and selected Larry Perry to be vice chairman for 1977-78. Among other items of business, the Board approved submitting a request for construction funds through the Local Public Works grant together with the City of Eugene and the Eugene School District 4-J. The project, if funded, will build several activity rooms and physical education offices adjacent the auxiliary gym on campus. The Board voluntarily recognized the ABE/High School Completion part-time instructors as a bargaining unit, affiliated with OEA/NEA. Discussion was held regarding methods of funding the ASLCC activities. The Board also agreed to tour the West Lane facilities around Florence on Wednesday, July 27.

FROM OREGON NEWSPAPERS--After a 10-second public hearing at which no one spoke, the Linn-Benton CC board approved the college's 1977-78 budget and authorized levying \$3.33 million in taxes to support a \$7.4 million (up 15 percent) operating budget. Because none of the taxes require voter approval, LBCC will start its 10th year without an election to get money--a first for the college...The Mt. Hood CC District Foundation has agreed to provide the school with \$4,000 for athletic tuition waivers in an effort to reduce the amount of public funds used for sports.... The Central Oregon CC board was told by its dean of instruction that the school should give more attention to the educational needs of nontraditional students in the future....Clackamas CC President Dr. John Hakanson recommended to that board that the CCC football program be abolished. The recommendation came in an effort to soothe voters before a third budget try August 9.

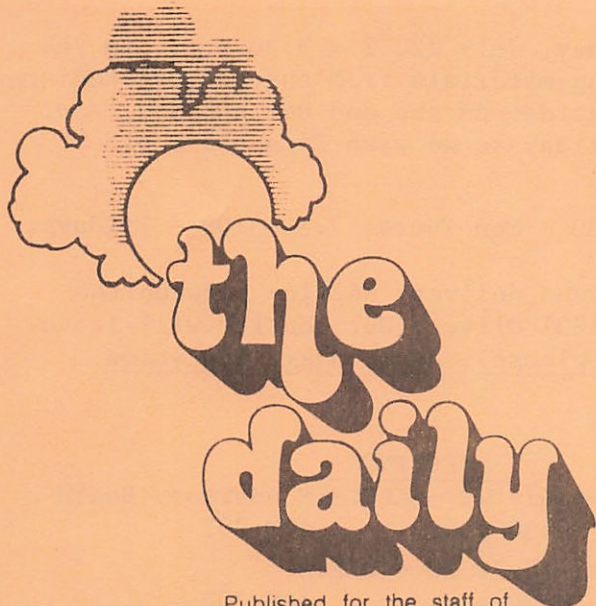

BEST IN NATION - LCC's energy management program has been judged best in the country and the college awarded a \$10,000 Cost Reduction Incentive Award by the National Association of College and University Business Officers. Dean Tony Birch received the award Thursday in San Francisco. LCC is tops in a competition open to 3,000 institutions of higher education. By storing and reusing heat, the energy management system is cutting the College's electric bill by over one third.

FROM OREGON NEWSPAPERS - Clackamas CC is offering voters a property tax reduction from \$1.46 this past year to \$1.33 next year if its third levy try of the year is approved on August 9. ...President Jack Brookins of SWOCC is chairing an OCCA committee spending the rest of 1977 studying whether Oregon colleges should abandon national athletic competition....Mt. Hood and Clatsop CC won voter approval of operating levies on June 28....Legislative approval of \$20.8 million to reimburse CC for past construction financed by local monies means \$3.1 million for LCC....Former Blue Mountain CC President Wally McCrae has been appointed to the State Board of Education....Blue Mountain CC, which hopes to win OECC approval for an ADN program over ECSC, already has more than 100 applications for admission....A Connecticut court has ruled against a University of Bridgeport student who sued for \$400, alleging that a course she took was worthless. The judge said the courts should not interfere in curricular issues.

WHY WE'RE ALL CONFUSED - "The problem with the spoken or written word is that we all don't have the same meaning for the word," writes R.W. Mullenberg in Inter-Face. "There are some 600,000 words in the English language, but the educated adult uses only 2,000 in daily conversation and the 500 most commonly used have 14,000 dictionary definitions.
