DOWN TO FOUR - Only Lane, Mt. Hood, Central Oregon and Umpqua Community Colleges are still without voter-approved operating levies for next year. The latter two are on the August 8 ballot; the other two will decide at July 12 Board meetings whether or when to try again. Mt. Hood is considering not trying a fourth time this year; it would have to eliminate 102 full-time jobs and 500 classes to live within its tax base.

FROM OCCA DIGEST - Portland CC has purchased 8 acres at 82nd and Woodstock for a Southeast Center. The land has a building on it with 86,000 square feet under roof...The Linn-Benton Faculty Association has signed a 3-year contract with the college. Of the 107 faculty due back this fall, 26 will receive the new annual maximum of \$20,390...The Rogue CC Faculty has signed a 2-year contract calling for a 6 percent across the board pay hike. The Rogue Board refused to require faculty members who don't belong to the bargaining association to pay dues to it...The Legislative Emergency Board is being asked to loan Linn-Benton CC \$1 million to repair its heating-cooling system. Plastic pipes which leak and collapse will be replaced by steel pipe...According to the Census Bureau, the median age in the U.S. as of 1977 was 29.4 years...The New York Times reports that manufacturers of football helmets, whose annual sales total about \$20 million, have damage suits totaling \$110 million pending against them.

BOARD MEETING - The Board of Education will meet at 8 p.m. Wednesday night in the Board Room. The agenda includes: 1) a decision whether to hold a September 19 budget election and setting of a levy amount. It could be substantially lower than the \$784,000 requests of May 23 and June 27 because of lower payroll costs now expected, more cash carryower than anticipated, and an expected enrollment increase of 4 percent next year. 2) approval of \$31,000 to fund 16 small construction projects previously approved by the Board. The list includes soundproofing of Forum 301-2 and razing the store at Christensen's Resort. 3) approval of \$295,000 to purchase and install the Executone Communication System in lieu of the present telephone system. 4) seating of 2 new Board members and election of a new chairman.

ONE MORE TIME - LCC will try to get its two cents worth in a third election try on September 19. The Board of Education will seek voter approval of a one-year, \$555,000 levy beyond the six percent limitation. That's \$230,000 (29 percent) less than the budget proposals rejected by voters May 23 and June 27. The smaller request was made possible by a larger cash carryover than was anticipated, new projections of increased tuition revenue, and unspent Board contingency funds. The proposed levy would cost an estimated \$1.37 per thousand dollars of assessed value. That's two cents more than last year's tax rate for LCC and the lowest LCC rate in 10 years. The owner of a home assessed at \$40,000 would pay an estimated additional 80 cents for the year for LCC.

MORE ON LAST WEDNESDAY'S BOARD MEETING - Larry Perry of the South Eugene High School faculty was elected Board chairman for this year; Jim Pitney, Junction City dairyman, was named vice chairman...Some \$295,000 will be spent from state construction allocations to purchase a new telephone system for the main campus. It's the Executone Communications System.... The High School Completion-Adult Basic Education collective bargaining agreement for this year was ratified....A Management Group salary package of 7.05 percent was approved.... Mary Ann Manderino was appointed acting associate department head of Health Occupations for 1978-79; Bob Radcliff is the new Health and Physical Education department head for this year; Barry Vaughn was hired as Printing/Graphics manager. Leo Smothers of the Science faculty resigned to accept a teaching job in Iceland.

CONSTRUCTION - Work will be getting underway on 16 small construction projects on campus and at outreach centers. About \$31,000 will be spent for: a fume hood in Science, a well and pump at Christensen's Resort, campus signing within buildings, enlarging a room in the Study Skills Center, partitions for Air Technology, study area for Machine Technology, welding exhaust for Apprenticeship, landscaping for the Apprenticeship Annex, an electronic dish for KLCC, landscaping of the south campus, acquiring a quonset hut for Siuslaw Skills Center, razing the store building at Christensen's Resort, soundproofing a study area in the Forum, installing an exhaust hookup in Air Technology, replacing shield drives in the boiler room, and soundproofing Forum 308/309.

Department in putting on the Explorer Olympics; and from Glenn Pullen of the Education Department of Tasmania for library information and courtesies extended by Associate Dean Keith Harker.

ANOTHER WIN - For the second year in a row, LCC has won a cost reduction incentive award from the National Association of College and University Business Officers and the United States Steel Foundation. A \$1,000 check was received last week in recognition of the college's avoiding the spending of \$1½ million for new equipment and materials by acquiring cost-free federal excess properties. LCC has received thousands of items at a cost of \$110,000 for people and transportation. When new, the materials cost the federal government about \$6 million. Last summer NACUBO and USSF awarded LCC a \$10,000 prize for its energy management program, which has cut campus electrical consumption and demand by about one third. Dean of Administrative Services Tony Birch masterminded both award applications. Howard Bird has coordinated the excess property program.

TWO YEARS LATER: DOES IT WORK? - LCC's energy management system is well on the way toward its promised payoff in 3 years. Dean Tony Birch says the system saved \$83,447 in 1976-77 and \$117,748 in 1977-78. System cost was \$290,000. In the first 8 months of fiscal year 1977-78, the system cut the energy cost by 35 percent over the previous year. And the average monthly energy consumption for those 8 months was only 63 percent of the average monthly consumption in 1970-71, though the campus has grown by 146,000 square feet under roof since then.

FOODSERVICE CHANGE - The Snack Bar will remain open through the summer and the Cafeteria, which was to have reopened July 31, won't reopen until September.

ANSWER - The Answer program, which is operated through C/CR, offers staff the opportunity to ask questions about college operations anonymously. Questions which seem to be of general interest sometimes are included in The Daily.

- Q: In the midst of a tax revolt, why is LCC buying a \$400,000 phone system which will save only \$70,000 over the next four years? The campus is only 9 or 10 years old, how can the present lines be worn out? Will the college have to pay Bell for existing lines?
- A: 1. We are paying only approximately \$300,000 for a system.
 - 2. Our present system is not worn out but rather it is filled to capacity and very inadequate for meeting the needs of our customers--the students.
 - We will be saving approximately \$65,000 per year and the system will pay for itself in less than five years. By using Plant Funds to purchase the system, cost we now bear in the General Fund (which is supported by the local taxpayer) will be reduced.
 The lines are not worn out; they will be utilized as part of the new system.

FROM OCCA DIGEST - Mt. Hood CC failed to pass a levy this year and so has cut \$1.72 million from its budget. The cuts eliminated support for community schools, all non-reimbursable classes, and the equivalent of 100 full-time jobs. A sampling of effects: There now is no college nurse; the Independent Study Center was combined with library services and three positions eliminated; 28 classes eliminated in health sciences, 63 sections eliminated in business, 42 in health & P.E., 38 in the industrial division, 47 in communications, 35 in math and physics, etc. Some 400 FTE students won't be provided for.
