FUNDING BILL MOVES ALONG - The Legislature's SB 5510 to fund community colleges has been unanimously approved by the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. It was reported out "do pass" with amendments that raised the amount of state support by \$484,596 beyond the Governor's recommendation. The total for the biennium is \$98.5 million. Lane would get \$7.5 million for 1979-80 and \$8.2 million for the year after, assuming the College meets its FTE goals. The bill now goes to the floor for total Legislative approval.

BIG DROP - The reduction in LCC's property tax rate for 1979-80 will be considerably larger than estimated earlier. The estimate of a 2-cent reduction was a miscalculation. The actual drop could range from 7¢ to 15¢ per \$1,000 true cash value. If LCC's levy on the June 26 ballot is approved, the rate should drop from this year's \$1.33 to an estimated \$1.26 or even \$1.18. A 15 percent increase in valuation would produce the 7¢ drop and a 20 percent increase in valuation in the college district would produce the 15¢ reduction. Please pass on the happy news to friends and neighbors.

INSTRUCTORS OF THE YEAR - Leland Halberg, math, and Jay Marston, biology, are this year's outstanding instructors. Chosen by a faculty-administration committee, they will receive plaques at Wednesday's Board of Education meeting. Halberg has been here 14 years and previously taught in Eugene 4J for 7 years and the Air Force for 4 years. He co-authored a math text with Howard Zink. Off duty, he has been a U of O track official for 19 years and helper at the Oregon and National Academies of Artistic Gymnastics for 7 years. Marston, at LCC 11 years, taught previously at Moses Lake, WA high school. Active in curriculum development, he created such popular courses as Ecology and the Environment, Poisonous Plants of the Northwest, and a marine biology course based on a 40-mile walk along the Oregon coast. His experiment with talking plants a few years ago drew wide attention. He recorded, on a physiograph, plant reactions to such things as fire, water, wind and ab attack with a knife.
