ENROLLMENT INCREASE - Enrollment in LCC's summer credit classes is up some 26 percent over last summer, at a time when enrollments in colleges across the country are reported leveling off. In terms of full-time equivalency (FTE), the count is up by 70.

LCC GOES TO WASHINGTON - A videotape of some of the college's and Lane County's special projects, such as the solar house built by LCC construction students and an experimental fish hatchery (a solar greenhouse), was the highlight of an appropriate technology roundtable held in Washington D.C. last month. The session was funded by the National Science Foundation for representatives from the nation's community colleges to explore efforts being made on their campus to develop new technologies. The term "appropriate technology" refers to the development of innovative, inexpensive, conservation-minded ways of doing things. The 20-minute tape, which was produced by Tito Balducci and directed by Ken Sweet, both of Media Productions, and narrated by Gina Ing of KLCC, will air on Teleprompter Cable station KOZY channel 11 at 6:30 p.m. Friday, August 10.

BOARD MEETING - The Board of Education last week approved the concept of giving up to 68 talent recognition tuition grants, starting in September 1980. They will settle the details at a later meeting as to the kind of talent which will win the awards. They will consider high school honor students, athletes, those with talent in music and drama, etc. A few probably will go to low achievers, those who could do college work if helped to get their study skills upgraded. In other business, a lease was approved for use of the Lane Cooperative Museum in Baker Park at a cost of \$33,000 for 33 years. LCC will use the facility to teach astronomy and other courses for up to 10 hours a week. Appointed to the KLCC Advisory Commission were Eugene Lawyer Michael L. Williams and Eugene Accountant Leon Glaster. Mary Winston of the Kaufman Senior Center and Kay Porter of the U of O Center for Gerontology were named to the RSVP Advisory Council.

Most who received retrenchment letters, however, will continue with the College. Unfortunately, more adjustments will have to be made in the future as enrollment changes.

ENROLLMENT - Although it's too early to make a formal statement about fall term enrollment, Registrar Bob Marshall says it's a good sign that there have been 140 more students apply for admission this year than at the same period last year. "We're holding our own and are maybe just a little ahead, and that always helps," says Marshall. The 140 are all first-timers to LCC.

LEVY REDUCTION - LCC will have its operating levy reduced by up to \$25,000 this year because of an Oregon Supreme Court ruling. The court ruled that property held by Pacific Power & Light in 28 counties was overvalued during 1975-76. The resulting refund of property taxes will come out of this year's collections. PP&L will get \$5.5 million refunded state-wide. All the community colleges except Treasure Valley must contribute to the refund.
