As it turns out, the proposal of any business offering this kind of discount to staff members just because they are employees of the College is apparently a violation of State ethics laws. As a consequence, I have notified the Club Wholesale representative that our staff cannot participate in their program for large employers.

I feel bad that the invitation to participate in the program was run in the DAILY, and I want to apologize for any inconvenience it has caused any of you.

I did find out some useful information for those of you who are still interested in this service: a free membership to Club Wholesale is available through SELCO for a slightly different purchasing membership. I am sure that you can find out the details from SELCO.

THIS WEEK - Roofers are stapling down loose ends of asphalt composition shakes on six LCC buildings. The \$201,747 project cost is the first major expenditure of funds from the four-year \$725,000 serial levy approved by voters last March 31 for capital projects. Brown in color, the asphalt shakes resemble the original cedar shakes installed when most of the structures were erected about 1968. David Wienecke, Campus Services, says the new coverings should protect the buildings until well past the turn of the century. Newly roofed this summer were Electronics, Business, Administration, Performing Arts, Industrial Technology, and Siuslaw Area Center. LCC's Board of Education chose to reroof with composition shakes rather than cedar after learning that more than \$1 million could be saved campus-wide by using composition shakes.

ON THE AIR - Watch and listen for LCC's radio and television advertising in coming weeks. A one-minute radio spot featuring the stories of four students is being aired through Sept. 3. A 30-second television commercial produced last spring is running on the three local commercial television channels through Sept. 4.

Says David Wienecke, who brought the story to the attention of The Daily: "Everyone involved in resolution of this emergency truly went above and beyond the call of duty to meet the needs of the student. To me this behavior exemplifies what makes LCC so special. Congratulations on another job well done!"

GOOD WORK - George Alvergue has this to say about Charlene Blinn of Counseling: "In all of the planning and execution of the efforts to set up and staff booths at Springfield Broiler Festival, two planned visits to Valley River Center, and the Eugene Celebration, one person has been the hub who tied all of the loose strings together. Without her efforts, I doubt whether we could have been as successful in this effort as indications from the Broiler Festival have shown. Charlene Blinn has been a marvel. With minimal direction, she has literally crystallized long over-due efforts and it appears as if we are in an effective marketing mode."
