Q&A

Questions and answers about changes at Lane related to process redesign.

Q. How will I know if my job will be affected by redesign?

A. During the information gathering sessions in May and June, the Students First! Redesign Team talked with the process owners of services to students. The team also talked with a broader group called "other providers" who provided services to students but maybe not in the Center Building or not on the main campus. While many people's jobs will be affected by redesign (including all the members of the redesign team), those most affected will be people currently in Counseling/Testing, College Finance, Financial Aid, Admissions, Student Records, Career Information Center, and Job Placement.

Q. If it is, what will happen to my job?

A. Lane's redesign is done WITH you, not TO you. If you are a member of the Students First! project group where some changes will take place, you will be invited to be integrally involved in redesigning your own work. The first step has been for you to let the team know what's working and what's not. The redesign team will make recommendations based on your input and a very rich variety of additional research, and you will make those recommendations become a reality in the workplace.

Remember: When you delete a spouse from insurance coverage because they are no longer a dependent, the college will offer them the option to self-pay for coverage for a period of 36 months or longer. Cindy Cable continues as board chair

Cindy Cable continues as chair of the Board of Education in 1996/97 and Michael Dubick continues as vice-chair, both by unanimous vote at the July 11 board meeting. Unanimous votes also continued appointments to community boards including Roger Hall, LCC Foundation; Michael Dubick, Lane Council of Governments; Peter Sorenson, Senior Companion Program; Jim Pitney, Retired Senior Volunteer Program, Cindy Cable, Oregon Community College

Association; and Pat Riggs-Henson, Lane Regional Workforce Quality Committee. Reappointed as district clerk was Jerry Moskus, and as deputy clerks were Linda Fossen, Marie Matsen, Mary Spilde, Larry Warford, and Verne Whittaker.

The board gave conceptual approval to three changes in management working conditions for 1996/97; the annual cap on dental insurance will rise from \$2,000 to \$5,000; the professional development fund will increase by \$10,000; and salaries will increase by 2.64 percent plus a step for those eligible. The board requested more information on a tuition waiver proposal. President Moskus said the cost to the college of the three approved changes would not exceed 3.99 percent.

In other action the board unanimously approved athletic track resurfacing, purchase of a computerized wheel alignment system, and a brand name exemption for another network server. The board acknowledged the retirements of Peggy Marston and Dave Sherman and approved the appointments of Jerry Baarson as industrial technology instructor; Ruth Bichsel as social science instructor; Beverly Hickey as early childhood instructor; and Stacey Kiser as science instructor.

The board plans no August meeting although a telephone meeting may be held if needed. A board retreat will be held July 27-28 at Driftwood Shores. The next regular meeting will be September 11 in the Boardroom.

Students First! proposals tested on staff

The Students First! Redesign Team tested its draft proposals with selected staff groups and in an open forum last week. The team incorporated suggestions after each session and will present revised proposals to the Process Redesign Leadership Team on July 26. From there, proposals will go to the Executive Leadership Team in mid-August. In the meantime, an implementation team is being formed.

Summer academy for African-American youth

A summer academy for at-risk African-American ninth- and tenth-graders will be held at Lane from July 21-Aug. 9 sponsored by the African American Community Coalition and LCC. Fifteen students have been accepted. "They show the potential for academic success beyond high school, but are at risk of dropping out," says coordinator Greg Evans. The kick-off will be Sunday, July 21 at noon in the Blue Door Theater.

The program includes morning classes in math, writing, public speaking, and African-American history. Afternoon workshops will cover SAT test-taking skills, spirituality, crosscultural communications, violence, AIDS, and several other topics. To instill the concept of community service, students will spend the afternoon of Aug. 7 removing graffiti around town.

Classroom faculty are William Powell, writing; Hal Sheller, math; Jeff Scott, Oregon State University, African-American history; and Bobby Green, Lane County commissioner, public speaking. Workshops will feature speakers from throughout the community.

A budget of \$13,900 has been funded by the sponsors. The academy is free to participants. For more information call Greg Evans at 2340.

FTE credit enrollment for summer term is up 4 percent from a year ago. Second week reports show a significant 10 percent rise in lower-division credit courses while enrollment in professional-technical classes is down slightly. "We don't know why enrollment is up," President Jerry Moskus told the Board of Education on July 11, "since enrollment typically declines when employment is good. But it's good news for Lane."

Q&A

Questions and answers about changes at Lane related to process redesign.

Q. Why are we changing? Lane is doing okay.

A. In our information gathering, we found that Lane's students and customers spend a lot of time trying to navigate through our complex systems, policies, and dispersed physical locations to enroll and complete transactions. The changes that the redesign of services to students brings will simplify policies, streamline systems, and bring together services in physical locations so that most students will stop in only one place to receive most of their services. This leaves them more time for their studies. Also, less employee time will be needed to help students get from one place to another or understand complex policies.

Q. When will all this happen? There is so much proposed that it can't all happen at once.

A. Because a significant amount of what is being proposed will be phased in with changes in physical facilities, there will be several years of moving toward full implementation. One aspect of implementation that the team has looked at is a pilot STUDENTS FIRST! CENTER. This smaller version of the envisioned center and its LCC-wide implications would enable us to test the proposal ideas and fine-tune some of the changes before we roll them out in a full implementation.

Representatives from Vancouver, British Columbia visited the Dislocated Worker Program at Lane on July 22 and 23. The purpose of the visit was to learn more about Lane's program to improve their own, says Training & Development Associate Director Ellen Palmer. Canadians are dealing with resource problems common to the northwest, including mining and timber. Lane's DWP program has been nationally known for years. Canadians began inquiring after their media picked up a story in the New York Times in October 1994 which described how retraining programs such as Lane's helped Oregon prosper even with natural resources in decline.
