Grand opening set for Cottage Grove center

LCC at Cottage Grove will hold a grand opening for its new facility at 1275 South River Road on Tuesday, Sept. 16, from 1-2 p.m. The center is Lane's first major project funded by the \$42.8 million construction bond approved by voters in 1995.

Festivities will begin with the dedication of a flagpole provided by the Veterans of Foreign Wars. A few brief speeches will be followed by a ribbon cutting. A tour will be given, ending with refreshments.

Additional tours will be held at 4 p.m. and 7 p.m.

"We're looking forward to providing the residents of South Lane County with continued high quality community college services in the new building," says center Director Don Strahan.

The 18,519-sq.ft. building has six classrooms, four computer labs, a student resource room, a telecourse room, a student lounge, a conference room, a general reception area, and offices. The building was designed by gLAs Architectural Group, built by John Hyland Construction, and the site was donated by South Lane School District.

Board member recalls how KLCC got its call letters

Board of Education member Larry Romine noticed an obituary for J. Hobart Wilson who died on Aug. 20 at age 87. "Hobie helped cause KLCC to get its call letters," Romine recalls. Wilson had bought a radio station and wanted call letters KPNW but found that Lane instructor Roger Houglum had applied for and received that designation. "Hobie went to Dale Parnell who felt that LCC should get the call letters KLCC. But KLCC was assigned to a Navy ship in the Pacific." However, the ship was being decommissioned so Lane got the KLCC letters and released the KPNW designation.

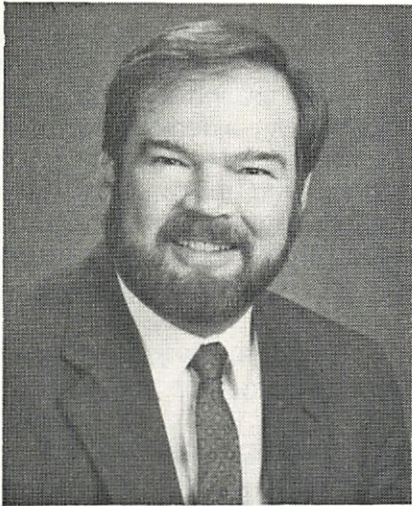

Insurance in retirement

- Faculty employees must have two years of immediate prior coverage with OEA Choice or HMO Oregon before retirement to be eligible to carry their insurance into retirement. Once you retire, you cannot add a dependent or change insurance carriers.
- Management employees need to remember that changing insurance carriers and/or adding dependents must be done at the open enrollment prior to the date of retirement so that the insurance coverage may continue into retirement.

Insurance reps available for questions on Wednesday

Employees interested in changing from one medical insurance plan to another, or in adding a dependent to medical or dental insurance coverage, may do so during open enrollment. Faculty open enrollment is Sept. 15 through Oct. 15. Any changes in coverage will be effective Nov. 1. Classified and management open enrollment is Nov. 10 through Dec. 12. Board report

The Board of Education reviewed a list of nearly \$1 million in non-recurring budget add-backs and program adjustments at its September 10 meeting. The add-backs were made possible in part by state funding which was undecided at the time Lane adopted its 1997/98 budget, which reflected \$1.4 million in cuts.

In action, the board approved: WEGROUP as construction architects for the bond-funded addition to Campus Services Building; GLAS as construction architects for other main campus bond-funded projects; Morris Kielty Construction as contractor for the Oakridge Community Learning Center; and KLCC application for full-station status in the Florence area.

The board awarded a fuel contract to Pilkenton Air for Flight Technology; rejected bids for maintenance of college copiers; reappointed Harold & Leahy as college legal counsel; awarded the printing contract for OSBDCN workbooks to Simon & Schuster of MA; and awarded a contract to Harvey Birdseye to teach semiconductor manufacturing for the Hyundai project.

Also approved were Mary Brau as coordinator of student outcomes assessment and curriculum development, Jeffrey Harrison as interim English instructor; Douglas McCready as nursing instructor; Matt Schubert as interim associate chair of Family & Health Careers; Katherine Swett as nursing instructor; Bill Woolum as interim chair of English, Foreign Language and Speech; and Ken Zimmerman as interim English instructor; Marie Matsen as vice president for College Operations; the management employees working conditions for 1997-98; and the president's salary and contract through February 2000.

The board began reviewing an update of budget principles and criteria and will continue discussion at its next meeting on October 8.

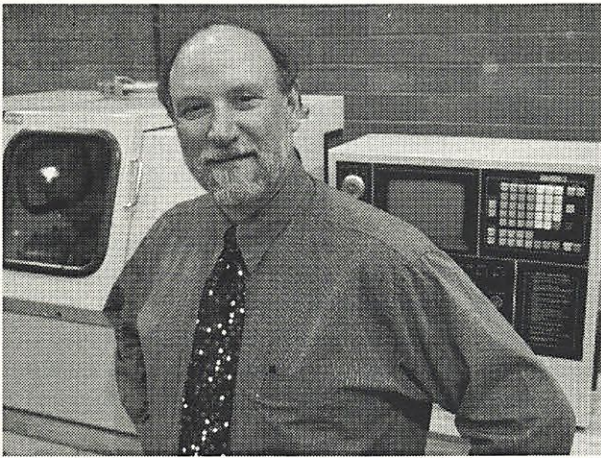

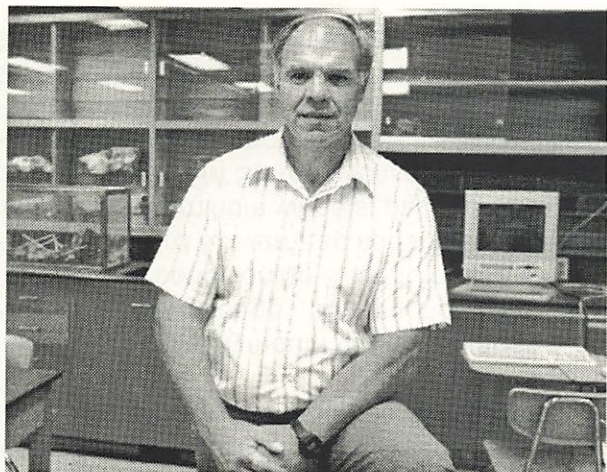
