LAST BOARD MEETING OF 1998/99 PRODUCTIVE, INNOVATIVE

The Board of Education held a special meeting on June 30 to award four bond construction project contracts in time to take advantage of summer construction weather, the decreased traffic and activity of summer term, and because the next regular board meeting will be a week later than usual on July 21.

John Hyland Construction was awarded the child care center project contract for \$1,896,376. The project will be built on the southwest section of campus between July 1999 and April 2000.

Delta Construction Company was awarded the parking lot improvement project contract for \$406,275. This project will include some new parking in front of the child care complex and will pave three of the southwest gravel parking aisles; the other gravel aisles will remain unpaved. Work should occur from July to November 1999.

Gary Burnett Earthmoving was awarded the site preparation project for the science/math building. Soil borings were used to estimate 3,000 cubic yards of rock to be excavated; however, it is difficult to know how much rock will need to be removed, said Bond Construction Project Manager Bob Mention. The board amended the contract award to not exceed \$268,800, the estimated total based on Burnett's base bid of \$97,890 and the unit price for rock removal of \$56.97.

Graybar Electric Company was awarded the requirements contract for building electrical components for one year with two additional one-year renewals at the discretion of the college.

Personnel appointments approved were William DelGaudio, instructor in Social Science and Cooperative Education; Nancy Hart, manager, Disability Services; Michael Samano, instructor in Social Science; Kyle Hammon, temporary instructor in Science; Joe Escobar, instructor in Social Science; Sheila Broderick, instructor in Social Science; and Jeffrey D. Harrison, instructor in English.

All votes were unanimous. Six board members participated by conference call/ speaker phone; board member Larry Romine attended in person. The meeting lasted one-half hour.

BOND UPDATE

MAIN CONSTRUCTION ROUTE. Development of the south access road running between Eldon Schafer Drive and Gonyea Road has been completed. Construction traffic entering the campus will now access the west side of campus via this road. The south access road is restricted to construction vehicles and equipment only. In addition, gravel shoulders have been built up on both sides of the curve adjacent to Oak Hill School in anticipation of increased construction traffic on Eldon Schafer Drive. Shoulder improvements will allow regular and construction traffic to navigate safely on this portion of the drive. In-house production is currently underway on cautionary and construction area restriction signs that will be located at strategic junctures.

PROJECT SIGNS. Funk & Associates Marketing Communications has been retained in the development of bond construction project signs for Lane's major entrances and individual projects. Specific project signs will allow campus users to identify construction sites and provide general project

information. Current discussion regarding the major entrance signs revolves around providing information pertinent to the general project, progress and taxpayer participation.

RETIREE HONORED AT ROSE PARADE

Robert Maxwell was honored in the Portland Rose Parade in June as Oregon's only surviving recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor. He received the award from President Franklin D. Roosevelt during World War II for shielding fellow soldiers from the impact of a grenade explosion and suffering injuries to his foot, arm and head. Maxwell taught at Lane from 1966-87 as assistant professor of mechanics and transportation, auto technology instructor, and auto-diesel instructor. He is now 78 and lives in Bend. BOND UPDATE

NEW LTD SITE DEVELOPED FOR MAIN CAMPUS. Bond construction on Lane main campus necessitates a relocation of the LTD facility and route. Currently, the Bond Project Management Team and architects are considering the Dale Parnell Loop as the new area for LTD's facilities. In so doing, attention is also being given to the moderate enhancement of the current west entrance to the college. Consideration of bus and entrance issues center on several areas. First, a strong effort is being made to incorporate space for buses and people in a manner that is practical, effective, inviting and beneficial to all campus users. Designs are being developed that reflect comfortable shelters that are pleasing to use as well as visually compatible with and complimentary of the environment of Dale Parnell Loop. Secondly, moderate enhancement of the west entrance will reflect design themes incorporated in bus facilities. Congruency in Lane's west entrance and LTD's facilities will produce a sense of purpose, campus character and pleasing functionalism. Next week, preliminary concepts and drawings will be presented to LTD for discussion. Because Lane must relocate the current bus route due to construction, an understanding has been reached regarding LTD's financial responsibility for the new bus facilities and route.

Notices regarding current bond construction activity on main campus have been distributed to departments which are conducting classes during the summer months. Notices contain cautionary information regarding construction traffic on Eldon Schafer Road and Gonyea Drive. By midweek, the Bond Project Management Team anticipates that Delta Construction Company will begin site preparation of the Child Care Center project and west side parking lot improvements. Before site work on the Child Care Center or the parking lots begins, security fencing will be erected around each of these sites, as has been done next to the Science building. Site development for the Science addition also requires the relocation of an existing water line that supplies the fire hydrant at the southwest corner of the Science building. While the exact route for the water line has not been determined, there is a strong probability that the southeast corner of the Forum building will be fenced off while contractors complete the relocation.

PERMANENT DELIVERY ROUTES. Due to the location of the new Welding Technology building, architects are developing a different, permanent delivery route for vendors accessing the Campus Services building.

HEALTH TECHNOLOGY RENOVATION. According to gLAs architects, 50 percent of the Health Technology design development phase is completed. It is anticipated that completion of renovation is in line with the project schedule. The Bond Project Management Team is currently developing a sequencing plan that addresses the relocation order, duration, and housing of all Health Technology students, staff and faculty affected by the renovation.

JULY BOARD REPORT

FIVE BOARD MEMBERS were sworn in at the July 21 Board of Education meeting. Continuing member Kathleen Shelley administered the oath of office to Robert Ackerman, who first served on the board from 1965-73; George Alvergue, Mike Rose and Ralph Wheeler, who begin their first terms; and

Roger Hall, who begins his third term. Each won his March election race. Also continuing service is Larry Romine.

ACKERMAN was elected 1999/2000 chair and Romine was elected vice chair, each by unanimous vote. Hall received accolades for his year of leadership. Ackerman said if he chose a theme for the year it would reflect tough decisions to be made in a civil and professional manner.

THE AVIATION MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN PROGRAM will admit new students fall term following a 5-2 vote with Hall and Shelley dissenting. Administration advised against admitting new students to allow staff to focus on quality instruction for returning students and until all FAA expectations were fulfilled.

THE WORKFORCE TRAINING CENTER will be built as recommended by administration, following a 5-2 vote with Alvergue and Romine dissenting. The vote followed an earlier motion to table the discussion, and another to build the center last; with only Alvergue and Romine supporting the motions. Concerns were that enough classrooms be built, that parking might not be adequate for center activity, that Forum already provided sufficient auditorium capability, and that building the center would not jeopardize other projects. Bond Construction Project Manager Bob Mention said scheduling the center last would interfere with the sequencing of all the projects. He said its construction should not jeopardize other projects and that additional parking is likely to be funded through cost savings. A BOARD POLICY REVISION to strike a requirement that three members must agree before an item can be placed on the agenda received a first reading. The revised policy will allow any board member to place an agenda item. A vote will take place at the next meeting.

SEVEN COLLEGES ABANDONED the legislative agenda set by the Oregon Community College Association and secured extra funding for themselves, reported President Moskus. The colleges were Blue Mountain, Klamath, Mt. Hood, Rogue, Southwestern, and Treasure Valley.

MAIN CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION STATUS

In a sequential construction project such as is taking place on LCC's main campus, attention is generally directed toward those projects that have the greatest amounts of activity taking place. While it is with anticipation that individuals watch parking lot preparation and site development on the Science Addition and the Childcare Center unfold, other bond projects continue to develop. Therefore, an update on the status of all the individual projects on LCC's main campus is important. The following list shows the percentage of work that has been completed on specific projects. Individual projects move through the construction process in the following order: schematic design, design development, construction documents, bidding, awarding of contracts, and construction.

ADDITIONAL INCREASE IN PARKING LOT SPACE

When pavement of the west parking lots is completed, two undeveloped lots will be available for additional development. Budget authorizations for parking lot improvements will allow the two lots to be developed with all-weather gravel. These lots are directly south of the parking space currently being

improved by Delta Sand and Gravel. All-weather gravel development will provide approximately seventy-five new parking spaces.

TEMPORARY ARCHIVE STORAGE

Current construction activities on campus will soon take place in the area in which archives are stored. Consequently, a portion of the records will have to be moved. Since no additional, permanent space is available on campus at this time, the Facilities Management Committee has approved using temporary, off-campus storage. Storing portions of the archives off-campus allows critical classroom space to remain at current levels rather than be utilized as storerooms for records.

BUS REROUTING AND GENERAL TRAFFIC DETOURS DUE TO EXCAVATION ON GONYEA ROAD

Construction work on sewage and storm sewers running beneath Gonyea Road necessitates the following, temporary traffic changes.

Monday, July 26 through Wednesday, July 28, LTD will be using a temporary route and loading zone due to excavation on Gonyea Road. Temporary LTD Route: Gonyea Road to the WEST parking lot where the disabled parking spaces are located. Three of the disabled spaces will be clearly marker off and designated as a loading zone.

Monday, July 26, general traffic accessing southern parts of LCC's main campus via Gonyea Road can expect a detour or delay at the juncture of Gonyea Road and LTD's exclusive drive. Those wishing to access the south side of campus are encouraged to utilize Eldon Schafer Drive on the 26th. The south side of campus is the area adjacent to the back, wooded hill and upper parking lots.

PARKING SPACE IS AVAILABLE IN ALL PARKING LOTS

The only temporary changes are the LTD route/loading zone on July 26, 27 and 28, and a detour or delay on Gonyea Road on July 26th.
