BOND UPDATE

THIRD LARGEST MAIN CAMPUS PROJECT WARRENTS ADDITIONAL FUNDING. The Board of Education on September 8 awarded the contract for the Campus Services addition to McKenzie Commercial Contractors, Inc. of Eugene, with a base bid of \$903,400. Although the bidding was competitive, the base bid was still \$167,195 above the budgeted \$736,205, of which Laundry and Printing/Graphics reserves supplied \$66,200. Additional funding for the project will be drawn from budgeted but unspent funds from completed Community Learning Center projects. Rebidding was ruled out for several reasons: rebids might diminish costs only if already minimal designs are reduced, rebidding would cause a delay of approximately two months, and construction must be completed by April 2000, allowing Laundry to be housed in the new building for the start of its busiest time of the year. Construction is expected to begin in early October and conclude in April 2000.

ALL-WEATHER GRAVEL LOTS OPEN FOR PARKING. With the installation of concrete wheel stops, the upper gravel parking lots are now open for parking. The first gravel lot immediately to the south (up the hill) of the paved lots will be the construction entrance to the Child Care center site. The west end (closest to the Child Care site) of this lot will also house construction equipment. Parking will be available at the east end of this gravel lot, but those individuals utilizing the lot must do so at their own risk due to construction traffic.

COMMUNICATIONS FOR BOND PROJECTS TO BE COOPERATIVE EFFORT. INSURANCE IN RETIREMENT

FACULTY employees must have two years of immediate prior coverage with OEA Choice or HMO Oregon before retirement to be eligible to carry their insurance into retirement. Once retired, you cannot add a spouse or same sex domestic partner, or dependent, or change insurance carriers. MANAGEMENT employees should remember that changing insurance carriers and/or adding a spouse, same sex domestic partner, or dependent must be done at open enrollment prior to the date of retirement so the insurance coverage may continue into retirement.

DON'T MISS OUT ON MEDICARE

Medicare becomes available at the beginning of the month in which you become age 65, whether you are retired or still working. You should apply prior to the month of your 65th birthday. When you enroll in Medicare Part A (hospital insurance), you also are automatically enrolled in Medicare Part B (medical services by doctors, clinics, outpatient tests), unless you tell the Social Security Administration that you don't want Part B because you have group insurance through employment. When you enroll in Part B within their time limit, you pay the normal monthly premiums. Late enrollment in Part B will require you to pay higher premiums. For answers to your questions or to enroll in Medicare contact the Social Security Administration at 1-800-772-1213. You can also consider purchasing a Medicare Supplement plan from a private insurance company. If you are a PERS retiree, you may contact PERS Health Insurance Program at 1-800-768-7377.

Kielty GC, Northwest Carpet Gallery, Doug Palmer Electric, and Twin Rivers Plumbing, for a total of \$596,049; an award for a hydraulic press brake machine went to Fahey Machinery Company of Lake Oswego for \$143,406.

IN REPORTS, STUDENT HOUSING sites under the Ashlane lawsuit settlement will be recommended at the next board meeting, said Vice President Mary Spilde. A REVIEW OF NONREIMBURSEABLE FTE was presented by Vice President Marie Matsen; board members praised the report as comprehensive and helpful. A LEGISLATIVE UPDATE was presented by Vickie Totten Chamberlain, executive director of the Oregon Community College Association. She said community colleges must stand together to effectively compete for funding, particularly following last session's split by several colleges and their local legislators. President Jerry Moskus said Lane has stood by the shared agenda but may have to reconsider if unity is not achieved.

HOW INTERNAL CONFLICTS ARE ADDRESSED was discussed following various statements from audience members, staff and board members at this meeting, and recalled from previous meetings. Some statements were characterized as attacks on other personnel and it was asked how shared governance can be served in such an atmosphere. Chair Robert Ackerman defended the right of free speech but also said it was unfair and unproductive to "trash" someone. He advocated using grievance procedures where possible, respecting arbitrated decisions, and solving problems rather than rehashing them. Faculty union president Margaret Bayless also disparaged trashing but contended that when issues are not resolved in the workplace, the board must be informed.

All votes were 7-0 unanimous. The next board meeting is a week early on October 6.

STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OFFICE RENAMED, REASSIGNED

The change completed the lengthy evolution of community college governance from a function of the Oregon Department of Education to that of a distinct department reporting directly to the State Board of Education. Vicki Totten Chamberlain of the Oregon Community College Association lobbying group said, "The agency functioned like a department for many years in terms of both fiscal and policiy matters. Yet we were connected to the Department of Education in a way that resulted in confusion between K-12 and community college issues, especially in the legislative arena."

Planners will present a proposal to the Facilities Management Committee which will make a recommendation to the president. The relocation decision will take a few months. LTD is involved in the planning process. FMC meetings are open and notice is published in The Daily.

ARCHIVES storage is destined for PE 122-A and B, returning to main campus materials now stored at the old Montgomery Wards building on Franklin Blvd. To make the most of the space, shelves may be mounted on a space-saver track system.

BOND UPDATE

GRAND OPENING FOR MCKENZIE CENTER. The Lane Community College Learning Center at McKenzie High School will hold its grand opening tonight, September 27, from 6-8 p.m., to coincide with the high school's open house and celebration of its new gym. Activities will include opening remarks, entertainment, and mini-classes. The address is 51187 Blue River Drive in Finn Rock.

WELDING CONCRETE POUR A HI-TECH OPERATION. Contractors poured the floor slab of the new Welding Technology Building on Friday, September 24, beginning at 3 a.m. and ending later that morning. High-tech equipment made it possible to pour the entire 18,900-square-foot floor in one seamless operation. A laser screed was used to level the concrete. It had a telescoping arm with a roller and blade which smoothed 12-foot swaths of concrete to perfect height and levelness based on laser signals received from devices set up at site perimeters. Worth about \$300,000, laser screeds have been used in Oregon for about eight years. Two riding troweling machines also were used to polish partially-set concrete. These one-man machines allowed operators to whirl around the floor operating levers which spun brush wheels over the concrete. The completed welding floor has four-inch and six-inch slab sections depending on projected use. About 360 cubic yards of concrete were poured. Today, crews will raise the steel roof structure into place.

LTD will remain at its present location on the north side of the Apprenticeship Building until construction of the new Student Services Building begins, currently projected for February 2000. During construction of the Student Services and adjacent Workforce Training Center buildings, buses will stop near the main entrance fountain. Current thinking is that after construction, about August 2001, the buses will return to the old, or present, location. LTD says its new buses have significantly improved emissions. LTD reports average boardings last year of 1,200 riders a day to main campus.

CAMPUS SERVICES SITE WORK UNDERWAY. Contractors began hauling away dirt on Friday from the Campus Services Addition site on the east end of the existing building. Earlier in the week, Lane facilities staff moved two kilns and a small foundry from the area to a Mechanical Technologies+ concrete cell for temporary storage. If county building officials approve, the kilns will be relocated to an area between Air Technology and Machine Technology prior to art student use later this fall. The new location will use the portable roof from the old site and will be surrounded by a chain link fence with slats.

CHILD CARE FOUNDATION WORK CONTINUES. Work on the Child Care complex on main campus west side continued last week with concrete footings and rough mechanical and electrical work for the north and east buildings. This week+s work will include the south building.

ALL-STAFF NOTICE: SUNDAY POWER SHUT-DOWN MAY AFFECT YOUR COMPUTER

A power outage planned for Sunday, October 3, from about 7-11 a.m., will affect four buildings including Business, which houses the college mainframe and servers. 4. Disconnect both of the cables from the XCD box.

5. Check all equipment BEFORE October 1 to make sure you know where to find power switches on equipment, XCD boxes and cables, etc. If you have problems, call the help desk at Ext. 4155 for assistance.

The outage also will cut power to Administration, Apprenticeship, and Industrial Technology buildings. The outage will allow campus electricians to energize a transformer to provide power to the new child care buildings under construction on main campus, west side.
