COLLEGE TELEPHONE PREFIX TO CHANGE

Qwest is planning to assign a new, single telephone prefix to Lane to replace the various prefixes currently in use, with two exceptions.

One exception is that Florence and Cottage Grove will retain their current seven-digit numbers for local callers, as well as gain a new seven-digit number with the new collegewide prefix for other callers. College staff will be able to use either the seven-digit numbers or the last four digits.

The other exception is that community learning center phone numbers will not change.

Individual extensions will not change and will become the last four digits of the new seven-digit numbers. Staff will have the option of dialing the last four digits only.

The new prefix will allow direct, seven-digit dialing to every telephone at Lane. For example, Daily readers will be able to dial xxx-2591 to reach The Daily directly, instead of the current procedure of dialing 747-4501 and then extension 2591.

The new prefix will be announced in December and will start working in mid-February. The current main campus number, 747-4501, will work for one year after the change, but the other affected seven-digit numbers will expire two months after the change.

The new, single prefix will allow faster service and accommodate more calls per line. It will also make college numbers show up on caller ID screens.

SAVE THE COLLEGE MONEY BY REDUCING YOUR ENERGY CONSUMPTION

Oregon has some of the cheapest electricity rates in the country, but they are about to go up. EWEB is estimating that our electricity rates will increase by 60 percent in October. This means that Lane's annual electricity expenses on main campus alone will increase from about \$435,000 to \$700,000. That's \$265,000! It is critical that we start saving now.

How can you help? Turn off your computer monitor when you leave your office. This will not decrease the life of your monitor. According to the Environmental Protection Agency's Energy Star website, you can turn your monitor on and off five or more times a day for 20 years. Screen savers do not save energy. In order to save energy, you must turn off your monitor or enable your monitor's power management feature. If all of the college's 1,000-plus monitors were turned off when the user went home for the evening, the college would save \$16,000 per year. ENROLLMENT SERVICES AND STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES ACCESS

Enrollment Services and Student Financial Services are now located in Room 123 of Building 1 (Student Services). This area includes 43 employees working in Students First!, Past Due Accounts, Student Records, Operations Team (formerly part of College Finance), Financial Aid, Sponsored Accounts and Scholarships, and the directors' offices for Enrollment Services and Student Financial Services.

Due to confidentiality of much of the work provided by these offices, walk-in access to the area is limited and exterior doors are locked or have access code keypads. Students and the public needing the services of these offices now begin with a SF! representative. If they need further assistance, they are referred to a team member who meets with them in one of three consultation rooms.
