When choosing which paper to use, please consider using white or lightly colored paper. White paper is the easiest to recycle and we earn the most money for it. Lightly colored papers are the second best choice, since they contain less dye than darkly colored papers. They are easier to recycle and better for the environment. Right now, Lane receives \$25 per ton for both white and lightly colored papers. We receive the least money for darkly colored paper, including goldenrod and neon colors. The dyes in these papers contain more heavy metals that can harm human health and the environment if released. They are also more difficult to make into new products. Thanks for Recycling. LANE REMAINS TRUE TO ITS COMPREHENSIVE MISSION

President Mary Spilde and Board of Education Chair Robert Ackerman addressed employees at an all-staff meeting on June 4. The president's remarks are available on the President's Office web page at <http://www.lanec.edu/presoffc/june42002.htm>. In addition, here some highlights from the meeting.

Lane is committed to a comprehensive balance of professional-technical and transfer education, said the president. Severe budget challenges did not and will not change this core mission. "I can't guarantee there won't be more cuts next year," Spilde said, "but we're in a better position to deal with them, and they won't be as severe."

Another state revenue shortfall is forecast for next year that will mean further cuts to education. "There's a myth that if we just become more efficient or pay people less that everything will be okay," said Spilde, and called for a grassroots effort demanding funding for public education in Oregon.

Another budget challenge is that PERS employers like Lane will have to contribute more, because PERS lost money in the stock market last year. For Lane, this could mean another \$1.5 million expense by July 2003.

Budget planning for next year already is underway. There will be early opportunities for staff input. The president agreed with a suggestion to increase community involvement. Lane will continue its strategy of restoring fiscal health and will place greater emphasis on revenue when planning growth, taking care to ensure a balance of professional-technical and transfer programs.

Spilde recounted achievements of the past year, such as reaching agreement with the classified and faculty unions. She noted that the college will rely on staff only in the next round of bargaining. She also named several staff and students who won national acclaim for excellence this year, among other successes at the college.

In the coming weeks and months, the president will wrap up the budget for 2002-03; work on the state community college funding formula; prepare for accreditation; work with College Council to revisit the college mission, vision and strategic plan; market to the community that Lane is still here; work on a review process to strengthen programs; and pursue partnerships with the private sector.

Ackerman also discussed the continuing state revenue shortfall. He noted that budget and negotiations occupied most of the board's time last year. He was glad to have reached agreements with the classified and faculty unions, and he was proud of students for having the vision to support an unprecedented tuition increase of \$10 per credit hour, rather than sacrifice quality or lose more programs. His wishes for the coming year, he said, were to resolve budget issues and to work together as colleagues.

A question/answer period followed the presentations. The president elaborated on some of the topics mentioned above and in response to other questions, discussed marketing plans; how the new technology fee will simplify tracking the cost of education and that TACT is developing a plan to distribute fee revenue to departments; that a summary of outcomes will be added to the budget development web page; that the board plans strategic conversations with the unions; and that she is exploring strategies for publicizing the lack of funding for public education.

The president reiterated Lane's commitment to a comprehensive mission and encouraged staff to move forward while bearing the losses of the past year. Once we have achieved fiscal stability, said Spilde, we can focus on placing learning at the heart of what we do, and creating an environment where people can do their best work. She wished everyone a restful summer.

BOARD REPORT FOR JUNE

In her monthly report to the Board of Education at its June 12 meeting, President Mary Spilde said the \$880 million shortfall in the state budget could mean another \$11 million funding cut to community colleges, including an additional \$1.4 million cut to Lane. In other remarks, she said an association's proposal to merge associate degree and bachelor's degree nursing does not have the college's support. She noted that an art faculty vacancy would not be cut. The president also presented a plaque of appreciation to outgoing student body president Jennifer Gainer, and an award certificate to Korrina Yeroyan for honorable mention in the League for Innovation Student Literary Competition.

New ASLCC President Gregory Dunkin was introduced.

The annual budget hearing began at 7:55 p.m. Two speakers advocated for restoring the Chemical Dependency Counselor Training program; one thanked the college for restoring the art faculty position; and Dunkin objected to the disproportionate cost of the tuition increase for international students. After discussion, the board adopted the budget by 5-1 vote. Board member Roger Hall was absent. Board member Lucille Salmony voted no, citing concerns about a lack of long-range vision, insufficient capital repair funding, and others. The president noted that Lane continues to provide a comprehensive balance of professional-technical and transfer education of excellent quality.

A summary of outcomes from the 2002-03 budget process, including lists of professional-technical programs remaining and cut, are on the web at <http://www.lanec.edu/budget/summaryofoutcomes.htm>. The 2002-03 college catalog will have a complete description of offerings and will be available in July.

In other action, the board unanimously approved: purchase of a bookstore computer system upgrade; one-year extension to current agent of record for employee benefits while a collegewide insurance plan is explored; an Oregon Community College Association recommendation to keep community college governance separate from the university governance at the state level; retention of the \$2.65 per hour community education tuition for fall term while a noncredit tuition policy is developed; ballot measures passed by students which increase the mandatory fee for main campus credit students; and a resolution urging the Legislature and governor to prevent further funding cuts to community colleges, and to seek long-term funding for public education.

The board heard and reviewed benchmarks; board policy on treatment of learners; committee work on a parking permit plan; a Rites of Passage program update; and first reading of revisions to board membership policy to align with redistricting.
