When the word "Confidential" displays at the top of any Native Banner form or in ExpressLane, you must not release any information to the requestor. You must say, "There is no information available on that person." Unless the requestor can produce a password or a photo ID, to prove that they are the student, you may not release any information.

ROSE, HOLMAN TO LEAD BOARD

The Lane Community College Board of Education elected officers for 2003/04 at its July 9 meeting. Mike Rose will chair the board and Paul Holman will serve as vice chair. Both votes were unanimous.

Also at the meeting:

Linda DeWitt presented the last monthly LASR report. She received a standing ovation for her dedicated leadership of the project.

The consent agenda passed unanimously.

Board policy for naming buildings and facilities was reviewed. It was decided that a proposal for naming in recognition of distinction or financial support constituted a first reading.

Scott Mueller of Kenneth Kuhns & Co. explained changes in college audit reports to align with Government Accounting Standards Board changes.

Cynde Leathers gave a presentation on distance learning. Lane now has an interactive classroom as well as an array of online courses and telecourses.

Board committee assignments were approved: Roger Hall to the Foundation; Dennis Shine to the Lane Council of Governments; Jay Bozievich to the Lane Economic Committee; Mike Rose to the Oregon Community College Association; and Kathleen Shelley to Centro Latino Americano.

Changes to the aviation maintenance program were approved unanimously. AMT now will enroll students only once a year, under a cohort structure, to reduce expenses in light of enrollment decline. Curriculum will be more student-directed and use a core curriculum common to all advanced technology disciplines. The changes make it possible to leave a faculty vacancy unfilled and to exclude the program from differential pricing.

A benchmark on trends in revenue sources showed a decline in state funding and an increase in tuition and fees since 1990 when ballot measure 5 passed. A benchmark on student race/ethnicity showed that 12.3 percent of credit students report that they are students of color, compared to 9.4 percent of the county population, and 13.4 percent of the state population.

Most of the evening focused on board and college governance, including a work session preceding regular session. It was debated whether to have a first reading of proposed changes in board policies. Majority consensus was to go ahead. "This is a direction, not the plan," said board chair Mike Rose.

The board does not plan to meet in August. The next regularly scheduled meeting is September 10.

DIESEL TECH STUDENT WINS THIRD IN NATIONAL COMPETITION

"It's the best we've ever done," says diesel technology instructor Steve Webb. "Ryan is a natural."

He's talking about Ryan Sederlin of Leaburg, a second-year diesel technology student at Lane. Last month, Sederlin and Webb traveled to Kansas City, Missouri, for the SkillsUSA-VICA national vocational skills competition sponsored by the Vocational Industrial Clubs of America. Sederlin placed third among 47 competitors in the post-secondary division. He qualified for national competition in April when he won first place in the state competition. Two years earlier, he won first in state in the high-school division while a student at Thurston High.

A Lane student has won first place in the state VICA competition for the last four years, and 8th, 12th, and 3rd, respectively, in national competition for the last three years. Webb attributes the success rate to student talent and dedication. Sederlin, for example, worked on lawnmowers and other engines since childhood and has worked for a logging company since he was 15. "It's what I love to do," he says.

Sederlin has received job offers from the Caterpillar national office and local businesses.

VICA is a national organization for trade, industrial, technical, and health occupations students in public high schools, two-year colleges, and vocational schools. The organization enjoys strong industry support. "Corporate Caterpillar looks favorably on diesel programs across the country that are involved with SkillsUSA-VICA," says Webb. "In fact, it is a determining factor for the financial support that we have been so fortunate to receive for several years now."

Numerous local companies donate cash and equipment to Lane, and many serve on the program's advisory committee. In return, Lane provides a reliable source of highly-trained job candidates, and students have good employment opportunities upon graduation.

COMING SOON FROM COMPUTER SERVICES -- ANTI-SPAM SOLUTION

You may have noticed this past year brought with it an increase in junk e-mail. A year ago, surveys showed that the average user spends approximately one hour per day managing their e-mail. The ever increasing volume of junk mail now requires that users spend even more time managing their email.

Industry statistics show that 80 percent of all e-mail is spam. This affects network traffic, management of resources, database size, increased hardware requirements, staff production, not to mention the annoyance factor

Computer Services will begin to implement an anti-spam solution over the summer and will attempt to filter out as much bulk e-mail as possible, using existing hardware and software and adding additional anti-spam services. The anti-spam software is available at no cost to the college at this time.

We will be relying on the software vendor to maintain and provide us with the most up-to-date filtering rules, same as with our anti-virus software. However, due to the nature of the filtering rules, there is a possibility that legitimate email will be filtered out. This is common across any anti-spam software implementation.

We will begin testing the anti-spam solution August 1. The testing phase will last approximately two months. During this period any input you have will be appreciated. Please contact Ardene Toney at 464-3359 if you suspect that legitimate e-mail is being filtered.
