SCHAFER ENDOWMENT AWARDS ANNOUNCED

The Lane Community College Foundation is pleased to announce the Schafer Innovation Awards for 2003/04.

A Pat-on-the-Back Award for \$250 goes to Sandra Stice and the Dental Assistant Advisory Committee. The Dental Administrative Assistant program is the first program in the U.S. that specifically focuses on the educational training for dental administrative personnel. It was designed to better serve the needs of dentists and provide training in dental office administration. Mixed arrays of students are currently enrolled including employed dental professionals, dentists, dental assistants, and others seeking a career change.

An Eldon G. Shafer Innovation Grant for \$5,000 goes to Ellen Cantor for the Reading Together project.
