### NATIVE AMERICAN WORD FOR THE WEEK

American Indian languages instructor Dr. Don Addison offers the following Native American Word for the Week. "Chi-DI-nat-AEE" is Navajo for "airplane." (It is pronounced by saying the syllables in capital letters at a higher tonal level than the others, and the "chi" is similar to saying the first three letters of "chipmunk.") Literally, however, it is made up of the words for "car" (chi-DI) and "flying" (nat-AEE). The whole expression really means "car, the one that flies." As Native peoples have had to adapt to Euroamerican cultures and inventions, terms had to be created in Native languages that best reflect their view of what that invention appears to be, or do. In the AIL 100 Foundations of American Indian Languages course this winter term, participants learn how Native Americans exhibit a great deal of creativity and imagination as they form new words in their traditional languages with which to refer to items from the Euroamerican English-speaking community at large.

### WATCH FOR SUSPICIOUS E-MAIL

If you use another mail system (for example, Hotmail), you will need to check through the documentation for that system if you don't know how to tell if a message has an attachment or not.

### WINDOWS PC USERS: HOW TO RUN THE SYMANTEC ANTIVIRUS CLIENT SCAN

The scan can take a while to do so you might start the scan before you go to a meeting, class or lunch. If you are sharing the PC, make sure you communicate with the other users as to what you are doing. To find the Symantec Antivirus Client, go to Programs or All Programs - Symantec Client Security - Symantec Antivirus Client. Open the Symantec Antivirus client and go to Scan - Scan Computer. Click on the box to the left of C: in the screen that comes up. Make sure you see a mark in the box. Then click the button labeled "Scan" in the lower right hand corner to start the scan. If you see a message asking for a password to scan a network drive or if the Scan button is grayed out, double-check that you have clicked a mark into the box to the left of C: Please do not scan network drives or drives labeled with any letter other than C:

#### ROSA PARKS REMEMBERED

Rosa Parks Birthday is acknowledged in the Multi-Cultural Center and everyone is invited to watch a 20-minute video repeating throughout the day, Wednesday February 4, 11 a.m.-2 p.m. "The only tired I was, was tired of giving in," says Parks in "Rosa Parks: The Path to Freedom," a biography. Parks demand for civil rights led to the social changes in the sixties. The video contains an overview of the events that took place in Montgomery, Alabama; her arrest, the boycott, and the segregation laws that were finally overturned. On December 1, 1955, Parks sparked a revolution by sitting still. Her act of defiance against racial segregation on city buses inspired the African American community of Montgomery, Alabama, to unite against the segregationists who ran city hall. Over the course of a year, the Montgomery Bus Boycott would test the endurance of the peaceful protesters, overturn an unjust law and create a legacy of mighty times that continue to inspire those who work for freedom and justice today. ### SIX DEGREES OF SEPARATION

This award-winning comedy/drama written by John Guare, plays in the Blue Door Theatre, Building 6 at 8 p.m. Fridays and Saturdays, February 6, 7, 13, 14, 20, 21, with a Sunday matinee at 2 p.m. on February 15. Director Patrick Torelle, instructor of Theatre Arts at Lane says, "It's rare to find a work that covers so many subjects, so profoundly, and is as funny as "Six Degrees of Separation". The play deals with class, race, art, money, education, sex, and literature, just to name a few of the intertwining themes. It also examines the threads of chance that link one person to another, claiming that any two people in the world can be connected through only six other people. #### **NATIVE AMERICAN WORD FOR THE WEEK**

Dr. Don Addison, American Indian languages instructor at Lane, offers the following as the Native American Word for the Week. "Shun-ka" is a Lakota (Sioux) general descriptive term for any member of the dog family. "Shun-ka O-ya-tay" or "dog nation" includes wolves and coyotes. "O-ya-tay" or "nation" refers to beings with similar characteristics, not just political borders on a map. "Shung-ma-nee-tu" refers to "coyote" and represents a shortened version of "shun-ka" with "ma-nee-tu" which is often translated as "the wilds" or "wilderness"--and this is misleading. "Ma-nee-tu" really refers to the areas out on the great Plains where no humans reside. So it carries a special, almost spiritual view of "coyote" who is held in deep reverence by the Lakota. Add to this, however, "tan-ka" or "large" or "big"--and "wolf" becomes "Shung-ma-nee-tu-tan-ka" because of its great size and strength. Lakotas felt wolves were so awesome that their term for them conveyed that deep respect and regard. In the AIL 100 "Foundations of American Indian Languages" course this Winter term, participants learn how Native Americans exhibit a great deal of creativity and imagination as they form words in their traditional languages to refer to various creatures, viewed very differently from the Euroamerican English-speaking community at large.

Also reviewed were reports on Asset Protection, Policy A.070; Financial Conditions and Activities, Policy A.050; Emergency President Succession, Policy A.060; Communication and Support to the Board, A.090; and Efficiency Team recommendations.

The board reviewed benchmarks on the number of transfer graduates who enroll in the Oregon University System and how well they perform.

All votes were unanimous.

Dr. Don Addison, Native American language instructor at Lane, offers the following Native American words for the week. "The words "HaSHI waTONlak" (pronounced with an emphasis on the syllables in capital letters) is the traditional Choctaw name for the month of February, and literally means "The Month of Cranes." The month of March is called "HaSHI mahLI" meaning the "Month of Winds." The life cycles of animals and the weather were driving forces in the development of American Indian languages and even their terms for the months. Students learn in this term's AIL 100 class "Foundations of American Indian Languages," that this world view places living in balance with all other beings on the planet and cooperating in harmony with the environment are basic indigenous cultural principles students can discover and appreciate in learning these languages.

### \$1 MILLION GIFT TO CREATE FIRST ENDOWED CHAIR AT LANE

An anonymous donor from the local area has given Lane Community College \$1 million to establish the college's first endowed chair.

"An endowed chair is one of the highest honors bestowed on an academic institution," notes President Mary Spilde. "This is a long term investment in the students and the community for generations to come. It reflects the trust and regard this donor has for Lane and the work we do in the community."

The gift will increase Lane's flexibility to respond to the educational needs of a changing community and workforce and to create innovative approaches to student learning. The gift will enhance student learning by recognizing, promoting and developing excellence in teaching. In contrast to endowed chair programs at four-year institutions that aim to attract preeminent researchers, this program recognizes and supports faculty for instructional leadership.

The donor intends the chair to be used wherever it can best help the college, says Spilde. Possible uses include attracting nationally and internationally recognized faculty with expertise in selected areas of learning; helping develop new fields of study at Lane; increasing the number of faculty in programs with high demand for graduates; or bringing a visiting scholar to Lane.

Janet Anderson, Foundation director, says the donor attended Lane in the mid-'60s before main campus was constructed. "She remembers traveling back and forth between LCC classes held in Bethel and Springfield, and going to JC Penney to buy bloomers for her gym outfit. But most of all, she remembers the wonderful teaching and being made welcome as an older student." The donor enrolled after her children reached high school age.

The gift is in the form of a charitable remainder unitrust. A unitrust is a legal document that allows a donor to transfer property to the Lane Foundation, giving the donor a tax deduction and income for life. ### **SLIDE SHOW TELLS STORY OF RED SEA MURALS**

Tom Madison and the American Association of Women in Community College would like you to join them for a presentation of "108 Days in the Saudi Sun," a slide show and lecture on the negotiating, planning and execution of 12,000 square feet of murals inside and outside a private aquarium on the Red Sea Coast of Saudi Arabia. The presentation will be held Wednesday, March 3, at noon in Building 19, Room 102. The AAWCC is sponsoring the event and providing refreshments.

Over a two-year period in the late 1990s, Madison traveled back and forth between Saudi Arabia and the U.S. to inspect, negotiate, research, and oversee wall preparation and paint large scale murals of life sized, indigenous Red Sea flora and fauna, from clown fish to minke whales. All were rendered in their appropriate habitat at a private aquarium on the West Coast of Saudi Arabia. Madison's company, Madison Design, specializes in marine biology illustration. His work with the Oregon Coast Aquarium, the Oregon State University Hatfield Marine Science Center, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association and other marine organizations paved the way to the mural work in Saudi Arabia. Madison continues to travel to Saudi Arabia on an annual basis to perform maintenance on the existing murals, as well as design new buildings and interiors for the private palace and other ventures spawned from his business there. He also takes a cultural anthropology approach to his travels and has studied Arabic culture and women's rights and Islam, and was a guest lecturer on the latter subject for the AAWCC in the past.
