NATIVE AMERICAN WORD FOR THE WEEK

Today's Native American Word for the Week is "tohan." This is "when" in the Lakota language, sometimes erroneously called "Sioux." If this word "tohan" is pronounced with the voice stress or accent on the first syllable, "TO-han," it means "when" in reference to an event that took place in the past. If the accent is on the second, or latter syllable, "to-HAN," it means "when" in the future will an event occur. If one were to say "When will you go home?" it would translate as "to-HAN yaGNIN kta hwo?" in Lakota, if the speaker were male, or "to-HAN yaGNIN kta he?" if the speaker were female. Different question enclitics "he" or "hwo" exist, depending on whether the speaker is female or male, marking this sentence as a question. Our phrase "to-HAN yaGNIN kta hwo?" is a future action, and we only know this from the accent when the first word is spoken. The same word, "tohan," when pronounced in two slightly different syllabic stresses, changes the meaning a great deal. Lane's course AIL 100 "Foundations of American Indian Languages" continues this summer, and will be repeated in the Fall. It will be the prerequisite for taking the new courses on actual American Indian languages AIL 101, 102, and 103 that will commence in the fall. Contact: Dr. Don Addison, English Department

Communication is a core building block of effective internal controls. By using employers, students, and student national exam results, they are gaining updated information to make sections of the curriculum more defined and strengthened. The program is initiating a Dental Spanish course through continuing education for additional skills that are not required for the program but will help students be more employable in the future. The dental assisting program gives each student three different cooperative work experiences in dental offices, providing them with excellent hands-on learning. RISK ASSESSMENT

Last week we talked about communication, which is the first installment in a five part series about the internal controls framework. the second is risk assessment, which is the process of identifying and analyzing both internal and external deterrents to achieving Lane's mission, vision, core values and strategic directions. A comprehensive analysis of these risks will form the basis for planning for successful risk management. Some of these risks can be changes in operating environment, new or revamped information systems and personnel turnover.

The risk assessment process can be expressed in five steps. First, determine your control objectives, which form the specific collegewide or application level goals Lane wishes to achieve. Next, prioritize your requirements. Which assets, functions, people or processes are critical to continued operations and safeguarding the public trust? Third, identify risks and potential threats, and fourth determine the probability of occurrence. At that point you have enough information to build a decision matrix to identify and establish relationships between the four assessed items, and a model to create the fifth step: a risk management decision tree.

Okay, real world example: A control objective in the accounts payable cycle is to make sure that payments are only made to vendors that have actually provided an authorized and approved product or service. Priority? Pretty high up there, I'd say! What's at risk? Someone getting a check because Banner procedures aren't written out and the authorization process has evolved without documentation. Or perhaps a collaborator approved a purchase order and authorized payment to a fictitious vendor. Does that violate Lane's mission? The public trust? The law? What are the probabilities it could really happen? We've just outlined a simple risk analysis model to form the basis of a risk management decision that answers the question: "So, what are we going to do about it?" Of all the slogans that have emerged from the advertising world, perhaps the most relevant to this discussion is Just do it!

Lane has created an atmosphere where many business processes are owned at the level of implementation. This means that you, at your desk, forklift or computer, are often the person most in a position to put policies and procedures into practice as designed. The college benefits when we all join in the development and timely implementation of mutually agreed upon goals, solutions and controls. SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTERS MAKE A POSITIVE DIFFERENCE

An independent study completed for the State of Oregon finds that Oregon's Small Business Development Centers have a direct, positive impact on the businesses they assist. Assisted businesses created 3,300 new jobs in 2003 and paid more than \$53,000,000 in new wages. Small Business Development Centers assist over 6,400 small business owners each year.

Small firms with 50 or fewer employees represent 96 percent of Oregon's businesses and employ 49 percent of its private work force. Campbell DeLong Resources, Inc. of Portland conducted the study and interviewed clients served by organizations funded through the Oregon Economic and Community Development Department. Over 80 percent of small businesses assisted by the OECDD are reached through the Small Business Development Centers.

According to the Small Business Program Survey & Assessment Report, the Small Business Development Center Program received excellent marks for quality and service. "Ratings for both importance and quality of the services are consistently high," and "clients give programs credit for their ability to take positive actions." One of the more impressive findings was, " the businesses credit the services with helping them stay in business." Overall clients credit the services they received with having a major positive impact on their ability to improve and/or expand their business by hiring new employees, opening for business, improving profitability or productivity, or increasing sales.

William Carter, state director of the Oregon Small Business Development Center Network headquartered at Lane, said, "It's gratifying when our clients tell independent evaluators of their satisfaction with the services they receive and when we know that the service we give is making a positive impact on Oregon's economy."

The Oregon Legislature established the Oregon Small Business Development Center Network in 1983. Twenty centers around the state provide key services to Oregon's small businesses including business counseling, training, and referrals to other vital resources and services.
