MONITORING CONTROLS:

Communication, risk assessment and subsequent implementation are subject to decay. Just like peaches in the fridge, what began as a beautiful thing can mutate into a science project when left to its own! The finest system of Internal Controls differs only in the magnitude of the consequences.

Monitoring controls is the fourth in a series of five tools for our study. Once controls are in place, best practice objectives indicate periodic monitoring to ensure consistent implementation. Many Lane processes are co-designed by management, business process owners (you) and internal controls (me). Together we will verify implementation of processes as they were designed. To apply this step to our accounts payable example, we'd test new vendor requests, payment documentation and approval. Why? Alarmingly, nationwide statistics collected by the Institute of Management and Administration reveal that the error rate on vendor payments averages 1.6 percent. These are duplicate payments! With processes initiated in so many different departments, consistently applied and well-designed procedures can make Lane operate at a far superior level (Note: we probably already do - Marsha, Holly and Julie are being good sports letting me use their department as an example).

Monitoring also applies to the internal controls department. Board members and other authorities make sure that we are carrying our out mandate to implement solutions that address controls weaknesses and inefficiencies that jeopardize regulatory compliance and directly impact bottom-line performance. The best possible outcome is that procedures are being followed consistently. Sometimes solutions are a precursor to growing pains. Strength of conviction will teach that the benefit from the growing eventually outweighs any initial pain. Sounds like another well used slogan: No pain, no gain? CULINARY ARTS PROGRAM WINS PRESTIGIOUS ACF ACCREDITATION

Lane's culinary arts and food service management two-year associate of applied science degree program has received an Initial Grant of Accreditation for five years through June 30, 2009, from the Accrediting Commission of the American Culinary Federation. The college received informal notice by e-mail July 21 and by official letter August 5.

"We were fully accredited without a probationary period," Lane President Mary Spilde told the college's Board of Education at its July 27 meeting. "This is a testament to our faculty and staff. It will really benefit our students to graduate from a program with this accreditation."

Lane is one of only three colleges in Oregon with ACF accreditation and the only one offering a two-year degree in culinary arts and food service management.

ACF cited four major areas of strength at Lane. First was the program's advisory committee for guiding, supporting, employing the students and providing the direction of the program with the coordinators, faculty and staff. The committee includes 20 industry members and 13 faculty, staff and students. Also commended was an "excellent cadre" of support staff, a continuous quality improvement process, and the Center for Meeting and Learning with its state of the art professional food service equipment and kitchens. Students have the opportunity to cater events in the CML for groups as large as 350 seated at table.

The site report recommended gathering more placement graduate data, and providing employers more opportunity to assess the program.

The culinary arts and food service management program is offered through the Conference and Culinary Services department, directed by Peg Allison. - Ed.

Telecommunications Devices for the Deaf (TDD), also called a TTYs (Teletypewriters), are used by hearing and speech impaired individuals to contact others with TTYs. There must be two TTYs in use, either one on each end (caller and receiver), or one used by the caller and another used by a communication assistant (an operator) at the Oregon Telecommunications Relay Service, who will place the call for you, functioning as an "interpreter" for your conversation, maintaining strict confidentiality. If your office doesn't have a TTY, you can make calls through the OTRS Relay Service by dialing 9-7-1-1, then giving the communication assistant the phone number of the person you are trying to reach. BOARD REPORT JULY 2004

The Lane Community College Board of Education elected Paul Holman of Florence as chair and Kathleen Shelley of Vida as vice chair, for the 2004/05 year, by unanimous vote at the board's July 27 meeting.

Seven speakers from the audience advocated for more Native American representation on a hiring committee for the Native American program advisor position.

The consent agenda passed 7-0. Included was an award of \$149,000 to Morris P. Kielty General Contractor to do remodeling work in Building 5. Also included was the appointment of district clerks for the 2004/05 fiscal year: Mary Spilde as district school clerk; and Marie Matsen, Sonya Christian, Stan Barker, Dennis Carr, and Tim Craig as deputy clerks.

The board approved a new schedule for community fundraising for men's baseball and one women's sport to be determined, by 7-0 vote. The schedule calls for reports each December and May until a two-year reserve has been established. If the goals are not met, the board may end the programs. President Spilde emphasized honoring the two-year commitment to recruited student athletes.

Second readings were held of board policies on Governing Style, B.110; Student Activities Fees, D.090; Affirmative Action, D.100; Tuition, D.110; and Board Members' Code of Conduct, B.160. The policies were approved 5-2 with Dennis Shine and Larry Romine voting no. First readings were held for policies on Sexual Harassment, D.020; Possession of Firearms, D.030; Conflict of Interest, D.080; and Treatment of Staff, A.030. The firearms policy was sent back for further legal review. A new policy on Ethical Conduct for Lane Community College Employees was reviewed.

The board adopted goals for the college's strategic directions by 7-0 vote.

Board members were reappointed to community organizations; Jay Bozievich was added as an alternate to the Lane Council of Governments.

Management Employees Working Conditions for 2004-05 were approved by 7-0 vote.

A benchmark on general fund revenues by source was reviewed. Monitoring reports were presented on treatment of learners and treatment of staff.

The next regular meeting will be Wednesday, September 8, in the Boardroom, Building 3. Submitted by Joan Aschim, Marketing and Public Relations.

NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

INTERNAL CONTROLS ENVIRONMENT

The first paragraph of this article is condensed from a piece in the Washington Business Journal (Aug 16, 2004) called "Don't Let it Happen to You." "In an ideal internal control world, an organization would employ a group of closely monitored employees with rigidly enforced, properly segregated duties ... lack of internal controls may not necessarily lead to embezzlement, but it does provide the employee with not only the opportunity to steal but also the chance to cover it up. ... To protect your business from embezzlement, a working internal control system must be in place."

Contrast the tone of the above article with an excerpt from a book called "Stewardship" by Peter Block, Berrett-Koehler Publishers, which concludes, "For stewardship to be widespread, controls should be designed for others with great caution and dialogue. The act of faith is that with good information and good will, people can make responsible decisions about what controls they require and whom they want to implement them." I live within both perspectives, and seek an ideal balance. Perhaps, as Block says, we need to renegotiate the contract toward stewardship. In the midst of this paradox, I feel so honored to work at Lane, and to experience the integrity of staff and leadership here. I hope that you enjoy the same privilege, and receive an opportunity to contribute to the positive environment of others today. Best wishes for a productive and fulfilling week! Today's Native American Word for the Week is "A-yun-wee-ya" which means "Indian" or "Cherokee" in the Cherokee language. Actually, they call their language "Tsala-gi" rather than "Cherokee" because there is no "r" in the Cherokee language. Interesting is the breakdown of the syllables of today's word. "Yun-wee" literally means "a people" and the first "yun" is pronounced as a very nasalized sound. The last syllable, "ya," really means "basic, real, true, or essential." Therefore "A-yun-wee-ya" actually means "The Real People." This fall's class AIL 100 Foundations of American Indian Languages will again feature the introduction to various Native languages and some new guest speakers will be visiting the class this fall. ANNUAL POWER OUTAGE SCHEDULED

On Sunday, September 12, Facilities electricians will cut all electrical power to the Main Campus Buildings.
