#### LCC BUS PASS IS A GOOD DEAL

Students and staff taking a credit class on main campus are eligible for the LCC Bus Pass at no extra charge. Sessions to get a photo ID for the bus pass will be held in Building 19, Room 117 from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on September 23, 24, 27 and 28. You will be required to show your ExpressLane schedule and a photo ID to have your picture taken for the bus pass. If you already have a bus pass photo ID, you do not need to get a new one, but you do need a fall term 2004 sticker. ESL students at the Downtown Center or at main campus are eligible for the bus pass beginning fall term and will have special photo sessions at both locations. ## ALTERNATIVE FUEL VEHICLE SAVES MONEY AND REDUCES IMPACT

In April 2004, Lane added a Toyota Prius to its fleet of motorpool vehicles. The Prius is a gas-electric hybrid vehicle that uses 51 miles per gallon on the highway and 60 mpg in the city. Other similar-sized motorpool vehicles use 26 mpg on the highway and 19 mpg in the city. Because of the fuel efficiency of the hybrid vehicle, Lane will save an estimated 566 gallons of gasoline and \$1,035 per year.

Alternative fuel vehicles cost somewhat more than conventional vehicles up front but an energy incentive and the savings on fuel costs make up for the additional upfront costs in about four months! More information is available at

#### UPDATE ON BOMB THREAT

As most of you know, on July 27 Lane received an anonymous telephoned bomb threat and the 30th Avenue campus was evacuated and closed. Subsequent investigation by Public Safety and the Lane County Sheriff's Office has not resulted in charges or identification of the caller. In the meantime, staff have been busy gathering input on what worked well, and what needs improvement. This will be an ongoing process as we strengthen our ability to respond to future emergencies. Four areas of emphasis have been identified:

Communication: Goal: Quick and effective initial communication to all involved staff, and to the public. Actions: Emergency telephone tree is being revised and restructured. A campus voice mail tree and the campus email system will be used in the future along with the phone tree. Explore the cost and feasibility of an all campus, non-phone based communication system such as an intercom. Provide sufficient detail to facilitate evacuation, including stating the reason for evacuation. Provide hourly updates to media.

Assisting Person with Disabilities: Goal: Provide timely, safe evacuation for all persons. Actions: Clarify areas of rescue and improve signage. Conduct staff training on assisting persons with disabilities.

Staff Training: Goal: A well-trained staff who knows how to respond to various emergencies. Actions: The employee emergency brochure is being revised and updated

for all employees. Department managers will be assisted with developing emergency tools within their departments. We will continue to develop the network of staff designated as Building Representatives.

Traffic Control: Goal: Safe and efficient movement of traffic off campus. Actions: Coordinate Public Safety and Facilities to post additional staff at campus entrances to keep cars from entering when we are trying to evacuate. There are some givens: There are only two exits to campus; local law enforcement is not sufficiently staffed to assist with traffic control; LTD needs time to re-deploy busses to assist with evacuation; and college Public Safety officers must deal with the underlying safety issues requiring evacuation.

## BOARD REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER

President Mary Spilde presented a plaque of appreciation to Mike Rose at the Lane Community College Board of Education meeting September 8 to recognize his past year of service as chair.

The evaluation included board member's review and upward review by staff.

A benchmark on the number of contracted employees led board member Roger Hall to note that the number of management employees has decreased by 25 percent from 1988/89 to 2004/05.

The Accreditation Self Study document was presented and has been mailed to evaluators, who will conduct a site visit October 6, 7 and 8.

#### TRAFFIC AND FALL TERM PARKING NOTICE

Students and staff wishing to drive to campus and park are again expected to outnumber the available parking spaces at the start of fall term. Public Safety is working with Facilities, LTD, Lane County Sheriff's Office (LCSO), and Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) to minimize the frustration and help everyone get parked as quickly as possible.

WHAT WE ARE DOING:

Facilities is dedicating some personnel to help direct traffic.

LTD and Public Safety will again run the contra lane to allow buses to flow past the stopped cars on Gonyea and get their riders to the station on time.

LCSO officers will assist with traffic control on 30th Avenue if they are not needed for an emergency someplace.

ODOT will place the "congestion ahead" notice on I-5.

Public Safety will begin directing vehicles into the next available space as soon as the traffic starts backing up. We anticipate this happening about 8:30 a.m. but it may be sooner, it may be later. We will have every officer and on call officer on duty to help.

Once directed parking starts you will be directed into the next available space.

Exceptions will be made for persons with disabled parking permits, dropping children off at child care, and dropping off other persons. No other exceptions will be made. We realize that the space you are directed into probably will not be where you would choose to park and that it may not be as convenient as an open space in another lot. However, given the number of personnel available to direct traffic and the number of cars expected we are not able to make exceptions other than those listed. Our goal is to get as many people parked and on their way as quickly as possible so they can start the term with a smile.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Take the bus - buses will flow past all the cars waiting to park and let you arrive refreshed and pleased that you have avoided the stress of parking. Remember, if you take a credit class you already have paid for your bus pass.

If you must drive plan to arrive early to get a space of your choosing. Allow extra time for the traffic so you can park and still be relaxed.

If you arrive after we have started directing traffic please park in the space where you are directed. Yes, we know, it probably isn't where you want to park, but it is just for today.

When all the spaces have been initially filled: Eventually, it happens. We have filled all our spaces at least once. At that time PS pulls the traffic direction people and you are free to cruse through the lots looking for spaces that have been vacated since the whole parking event started. This will not happen until all spaces have been initially filled.

Remember, there may not be a legal space for your vehicle and you must park in a legal space. Again, I mention the bus as a way to avoid all of this hassle.

## CHEMICAL DISPOSAL PROCEDURE

Please contact Jennifer Hayward in Facilities Management and Planning prior to disposing of any chemicals. "Chemicals" include a very wide range of materials, so please ask if you are not sure. Chemicals may include things like paint, paint thinner, science lab chemicals, empty aerosol cans, empty propane tanks, or general cleaners that staff may have in their offices. Chemicals that are considered hazardous waste are disposed through Facilities Management and Planning. FMP will help determine whether chemicals are hazardous waste.

A recent incident illustrates the importance of proper disposal of chemicals. A can of pepper spray was dropped off at the Reusable Office Supply Exchange and a staff member picked up the pepper spray and accidentally sprayed himself with it. Chemicals, including pepper spray and cleaners, should not be dropped off at the Reusable Office Supply Exchange.
