The PERS online retirement benefit estimate calculator for tier one and tier two members has been updated and now calculates an estimated retirement benefit that includes:

1. Look-back calculation
2. Variable annuity adjustment (City of Eugene vs. PERS settlement)
3. Tax remedies (HB3349 and SB656)

The online benefit estimate calculator provides an estimated account balance at retirement and an estimated monthly benefit amount for each of the 13 retirement options under the PERS plan. The online calculator uses the most recent actuarial tables, effective July 1, 2003, for all estimates except the look-back. The look-back estimate uses the actuarial tables in effect on June 30, 2003. The online calculator provides estimates only and PERS is not bound by figures produced by the program. NEWS**HEALTH CLINIC FLU VACCINE UPDATE**

The U.S. supply of flu vaccine has been reduced by approximately 50 percent due to the license revocation of Chiron Corp., an English manufacturer of the vaccine. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control strongly recommends that if you do not meet criteria to be considered high risk you consider not getting vaccinated this year. High risk criteria are:

- * Children from 6-23 months
- * Adults 65 years or older
- * People with underlying chronic medical conditions
- * Residents of nursing homes or long-term care facilities
- * Children on chronic aspirin therapy
- * Providers of direct patient care
- * Day care providers
- * Household members of children younger than 6 months

If you are high risk or think you may meet the criteria we suggest that you contact the Lane County Health Department or your private healthcare provider.

Please remember, we are in the very early stages of the flu season. We usually start our flu clinics during the last week of October and continue through mid-November. We often have a fairly late flu season here, so we hope to have the vaccine in ample time to provide it.

We are currently on a waiting list with Aventis, the U.S. manufacturer, and will be notified in early November if we will be receiving any vaccine. If you are not high risk and

are still interested in being vaccinated, please check with us in early November.

BOARD REPORT FOR OCTOBER 2004

The Lane Community College Board of Education met at Lane's Florence center on October 13 to show appreciation to Florence citizens for their support of the college. In a work session, the board reviewed the work of the Florence center.

In regular session, the board discussed outreach activities. The consent agenda passed 6-0; Larry Romine was absent. There were no statements from the audience. A second reading was held of the board policy on Ethical Conduct for Lane Community College Employees and was approved unanimously.

A second first reading was held on the board policy on Possession of Firearms after being referred for legal review in July to assure compliance with Oregon law. The policy states, "No person, including students, employees, college patrons and vendors may bring, possess, conceal brandish, use or be in possession of a firearm, destructive device, or other dangerous weapon as defined by law, or give the appearance of being in possession on college-owned or controlled property or at activities under the jurisdiction or sponsorship of the college, except as provided by Oregon or federal law." A second reading and action is scheduled for the board's next meeting.

By unanimous vote, Dr. Dale Parnell was named President Emeritus of Lane Community College in recognition of his service as Lane's founding president, and a lifetime of influential leadership in the community college movement nationwide.

The board decided to keep reports by board members, student and staff leaders, and the vice presidents at the end of the agenda.

The board reviewed benchmark reports on unduplicated student headcount, and number of FTE by reimbursement category. A status report of the college's K-12 initiatives was reviewed.

The next monthly meeting is set for Tuesday, November 16, in the Boardroom, Building 3, main campus. Work sessions may be held prior to that date; details to be determined. The meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.
