#### **KLCC IS NOW KMPQ 88.1FM IN ROSEBURG AREA**

At the request of listeners, KLCC has been working to improve its radio signal in the Roseburg area. As of November 24, KLCC was broadcasting from its new station KMPQ 88.1 FM. Generous contributions to the Campaign for Public Radio in Douglas County -- in collaboration with Jefferson Public Radio -- has put a new tower and transmitter on Mt. Nebo in Roseburg. All KLCC programming has moved to the new station KMPQ 88.1 FM. KLCC's old frequency at 88.5 FM has become part of Family Stations, which provides religious programming. Those seeking KLCC will find it at KMPQ 88.1 FM. The new KMPQ signal is more powerful and reaches farther than the old translator that served listeners since 1987. The addition of KMPQ brings the family of KLCC stations to five: KLCC 89.7 FM Eugene; KLCO 90.5 FM Newport; KLFO 88.1 FM Florence; KLFR 89.1 FM Reedsport; KMPQ 88.1 FM Roseburg. ### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

**Q. HOW DO WE KNOW FOR SURE THAT THE COLLEGE IS CLOSED?**

A. When the decision is made to close the college, the college immediately notifies KLCC 89.7 FM and other news media. Stations make announcements as soon as they receive information. Do not call the media because this interferes with their ability to bring you the most current information. When possible, closure information also will be sent to employees via all staff e-mail and voice-mail and posted to the web. Check for closure information at:

**Q. WHAT IF I AM HEARING IMPAIRED?**

A. Hearing impaired people should check for a visual display of closure information on the TV stations noted above.

**Q. WHAT ABOUT COLLEGE LEARNING CENTERS AT HIGH SCHOOLS?**

A. Lane Community College Learning Centers at high schools follow the host high school's closure schedule.

**Q. WHEN WILL WE KNOW THAT THE COLLEGE IS CLOSED?**

A. Weather closures or delays can be announced at any time as conditions worsen; however, every effort is made to report early morning closure/delay information by 6 a.m., and evening closure information by 3 p.m. Evening classes are those that begin at or after 5 p.m. Because conditions can improve during the day, sometimes the college will

close during the day but will open for evening classes, so it is important to stay tuned to the media.

**Q. WHAT DO DELAYS MEAN?**

A. If the opening of classes is delayed, students and faculty should report to the class or lab they would normally have been attending at the new starting time, if at least 50 minutes of class/lab time remains. For example, if opening is delayed to 10 a.m., classes and labs that normally begin at 10 a.m. or are already in session at 10 a.m. would meet, but only if the normal ending time for that class or lab is 10:50 a.m. or later. The remainder of the day would continue on the regular schedule.

**Q. IF THE COLLEGE IS CLOSED, SHOULD STAFF REPORT FOR WORK?**

A. When the college or a college center is closed, classes and activities at the facility are canceled and staff who work there should not report for work or come to the work site, unless they receive specific instructions otherwise from their supervisor or hear such instructions in the news announcements. If one or more facilities are closed and others are open, staff who work at the open facilities should report to work as usual.

**Q. ARE THERE TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES?**

A. When 30th Avenue is icy, some people drive in from the east via Franklin, or ride the bus. In general, LTD operates buses to Lane when the college is open; however, drivers may choose alternate routes. An LTD route change does not necessarily indicate a college closure.

**Q. WILL STAFF GET PAID?**

A. The College Online Policy and Procedure System (COPPS) states under Pay: School Closure, General Guidelines For Compensation: "All bargaining unit members, part-time credit instructors and management employees scheduled to work on the school closure day should be paid as if they worked their regular schedule. Employees required to work when the school is closed on a regularly scheduled work day should be provided time off with pay on a straight-time basis." See <http://www.lanecc.edu/cops/closure.htm>

**NEWS****GOVERNOR'S BUDGET AND FUNDING FORMULA WILL IMPACT LANE**

The ability of Lane Community College to stimulate the local economy through workforce training and to meet the educational needs of working people and students depends on two outcomes in Salem.

First is how the legislature revises the governor's budget released December 1. The governor's budget reduces funding to community colleges by 5.5 percent while increasing funding to most other state-supported services. In the education sector, for example, universities will receive 2.1 percent more, and K-12 will receive 1.7 percent more. Funding for capital construction at six community colleges does not include Lane, and increased funding for state financial aid applies only to full-time students and excludes most community college students who attend school part-time while also working and supporting a family.

Second is the community college formula for distributing funding. This is currently under review by the State Board of Education, which is not expected to make a decision until the new year. It makes it more difficult for Lane to develop budget projections for its 2005/06 budget with the state funding formula still undetermined, in addition to not knowing the outcome of the legislative process.

"Our community and board, students and staff should prepare for another round of difficult budget decisions," says President Mary Spilde. "The governor wants to turn the economy around and the best way to do that is to fund community colleges. We are the premier providers of workforce training. If community colleges are cut to the extent recommended in the governor's budget, fewer students, workers and businesses will be served."

The president acknowledges that Oregon's financial situation is difficult, "but it is unfortunate that funding was actually cut for community colleges. Employers depend on Lane to train people for jobs. Workforce training is the only short term solution to economic recovery." Contact: Editor.

### NATIVE AMERICAN WORD FOR THE WEEK

Today's Native American Word for the Week is "HAA-hi-noo-jah," which is Navajo for "to be foremost in people's minds." The capital letters are spoken at a higher intonation level because Navajo is a tonal language, similar to Chinese and many African languages. The syllable "noo" with two "o"-s means it is spoken as a long vowel, not changed to an English "u" sound. All the other syllables, therefore, are short vowels. What this word means literally, however, is that something "comes up again and again, as a plant which is cut off, only to sprout up anew." In one sense, this term is similar to the idea behind a perennial plant and therefore is one of numerous examples where Native life on the land provides a rich storehouse for metaphors found abundantly throughout Native languages. These are explored in the AIL 100 class, Foundations of American Indian Languages. Dr. Don Addison, 344-4758, instructor.

**NATIVE AMERICAN WORD FOR THE WEEK**

Our Native American Word for the Week is "ki-NA-HAL-gaa-EE-di" which means (at the) White House (in Washington DC) in Navajo. The syllables in capital letters must be pronounced at a higher tonal level, than those who are in lower case, because Navajo is a tonal language. "Kin" is a general name for a place. This word is similar to the term for a two-storied house, all syllables of which happen to be in the lower tonal level (without any capital letters) "kin-bii'-naa-ki-'alh-dei hoo-ghan-go" in which "naa-ki" means "two" and the word for house is "hoohan." Many folks are familiar with the famous Navajo name for "home" or "house" which is "hogan" but less known is the fact that "hogan" actually means (a place where) "they reside at." AIL 100 class (Foundations of American Indian Languages) looks at terms the nature of which outlines the

### BOARD REPORT FOR DECEMBER

A proposal to increase the ASLCC mandatory student activity fee by \$5 for baseball and other athletics will be placed on the student ballot in May, by 6-1 vote of the Board of Education at its December 8 meeting. Dennis Shine voted no. The original proposal was to hold a special student election winter term. Earlier in the evening, community member Dean Hansen updated the board on community fundraising activities for the baseball program.

Tuition for 2005/06 will be adjusted for inflation by 4 percent by unanimous vote. Board policy provides for the annual inflationary adjustment. Effective summer term,

resident tuition will increase from \$64.50 to \$67 per credit hour, and international tuition from \$221 to \$230 per hour.

The membership of nearly 600 people from local businesses and organizations and the college on program advisory committees was approved unanimously. Community members volunteer their time and expertise to help Lane stay responsive to workforce needs. The 45 committees range from apprenticeship to dental hygiene to graphic design to nursing, and more.

The 2005-06 academic calendar was approved 7-0.

Lane will not accept a loan from the Eugene Downtown Urban Renewal agency to spruce up the Downtown Center facade, an idea the agency proposed. Loan terms were not found to be advantageous over ordinary bank loans.

Benchmark reports were given on goal accomplishment of former students; employment of professional technical students in jobs related to their training; professional technical students' satisfaction; and transfer students' satisfaction with Lane preparation.

The quarterly financial report was reviewed.
