LANE'S RAINWATER HARVESTING PROJECT

As part of Lane's sustainability program, a rainwater collection system has recently been installed at Building 20 to conserve water, mitigate stormwater and act as a demonstration. Other potential uses include irrigation for the Memorial Garden or flushing toilets. LCC, the Eugene Water and Electric Board, volunteers and graduate student Tammie Stark collaborated to design and install the system. This thesis project will also serve as a forum for educational workshops (TBA) and green bag lunches (see following item). The system was funded by a grant from EWEB. PRELIMINARY 2004 EARNINGS CREDITING FOR TIER ONE/TIER TWO

The PERS board made preliminary 2004 earnings crediting decisions for Tier One/Tier Two members at its February 18 meeting. The board made the preliminary decision to pay off the Tier One deficit reserve so 2004 earnings can be credited to Tier One accounts. The board slated 8 percent crediting for Tier One accounts. The board preliminarily credited 13.34 percent earnings to Tier Two accounts. If preliminary variable account earnings do not change, variable accounts will be credited with 12.96 percent. Crediting amounts are estimates and actual amounts will be determined when the year-end 2004 annual closing process is completed in late March. The board is expected to do final 2004 earnings crediting at its March 29 meeting. Submitted by Vicki Ellison.

2004 PERS MEMBER ANNUAL STATEMENTS

From the PERS website: PERS has established anticipated timelines to mail 2004 Member Annual Statements. They intend to mail active PERS Tier One/Tier Two Annual Statements during the week of May 2-6. This is a change from previous years when statements were mailed to employers who provided them to members.

Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan (OPSRP) Pension Program 2004 Annual Statements will also be mailed to members' mailing addresses. This is the first year for OPSRP Pension Program Annual Statements. OPSRP was effective August 29, 2003 and qualifying members were eligible for the plan following a six-month waiting period.

The Individual Account Program (IAP) 2004 Annual Statements will be mailed to members' mailing addresses the week of May 9-13. CitiStreet, the PERS third-party administrator for IAP recordkeeping, will handle these statements. All PERS and OPSRP members have an IAP account. The IAP was effective January 1, 2004. Main campus parking enforcement will be active for the safety and convenience of the college community. Violators may be cited or towed as necessary to maintain a safe and orderly campus.

KEEP INFORMED ON I-105 CONSTRUCTION

I-105 construction updates are available at www.keepusmoving.info According to an Oregon Department of Transportation news release, the I-105 Highway Improvement Project includes the construction of four auxiliary lanes between the ramps, upgrades of the bridge rail on nine structures, placing 13 cantilever signs, a shoulder barrier, illumination and other safety improvements. Upcoming stages of work that will include freeway and ramp closures are proposed between April 27-June 20. These five phases will have significant impacts and delays for motorists:

Phase 1: Eastbound I-105 closed at I-5; 8 days beginning April 27

Phase 2: Westbound I-105 closed at I-5; 8 days

Phase 3: Westbound I-105 closed at Coburg Road; 12 days

Phase 4: Eastbound I-105 closed at Coburg Road; 12 days

Phase 5: Both east and westbound I-105 closed at Delta Highway; 3 days

During April 27-June 20, motorists should plan additional time for their commute, avoid I-105, travel during non-peak hours, alter work schedules, and be patient during this complex staging, says ODOT. Submitted by the editor.

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PRESENTATION: GAY RIGHTS UNDER ATTACK?

A bill was introduced in the Oregon legislature February 21 that is designed to permanently deny any current or future relationship rights for same-sex couples. Senate Bill 799, which is sponsored by Senator George and Representative Sumner, would create Oregon law that bans not only same-sex marriage, but also civil unions, domestic partnerships and any "marriage substitute" that provides benefits and protections generally afforded through marriage. It would also prevent the state from recognizing any same-sex marriage or partnership entered into outside of the State of Oregon. Jessica DuBois from Basic Rights Oregon, a leading Gay Rights organization since 1988, will speak on this issue on Wednesday, March 9, from noon to 1 p.m. in Building 1, room 206. NEWS**NATIVE AMERICAN WORD FOR THE WEEK**

Today's Native American word for the week is "Ha-quil-laugh" which is a word in the Wanapam language (which used to be spoken in Washington state) meaning "priest." This was the term recorded by members of John Jacob Astor's Pacific Fur Company personnel referring to a rather unique spiritual and friendly person whom they encountered in the early 19th century. Not much else is known about him. "Priest" is probably an inaccurate title or translation into English (since this figure led ceremonies of the traditional tribal traditions rather than rituals of a Roman Catholic church) but it was the impetus that inspired the Astorians to call the rapids of the Columbia River after him, Priest Rapids, which is near Beverly, and northeast of Yakima today. BOARD REPORT

President Mary Spilde reported at the March 9 Board of Education meeting that the Oregon Supreme Court ruled against two legislative changes to the PERS system. She said it was too early to estimate the impact on Lane, but noted the college reserved funds for this possibility, and commended Marie Matsen for highly accurate projections. She also noted that state revenue is up and the community college funding formula is nearly settled. The president also commented on the transit system strike; lauded the nursing program for its eight-year accreditation affirmation; introduced Division of the Arts Chair Rick Williams; and commended Marketing and Public Relations for promotional assistance with the arts brochure and the faculty art show at the downtown DIVA galleries. The president congratulated the women's basketball team for their best-ever season, including their first Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges Southern Region Title with a league record of 13-1, and a second-place finish in the league championship tournament. She introduced team members present. Finally, Spilde noted with sorrow the passing of scholarship donor Bernice Staton.

In statements from the audience, citizen Ron Stewart complimented baseball fundraising; faculty bargaining chair Stan Taylor expressed frustration with bargaining; coordinator Wendy Simmons promoted the wellness program; and physics instructor Dennis Gilbert expressed concern about a noncredit ghost-hunting class.

The board held second readings on policies regarding financial condition and activities, governing style, and financial reporting, and approved each by unanimous vote. A new purchasing procedure was approved by 6-0 vote with Dennis Shine abstaining. First reading reviews were held for board policies on contractual authority and purchasing procedure.

The board approved the Associate of Science Oregon Transfer Degree-Business (ASOT-Business) by 7-0 vote.

The board passed a resolution supporting congressional and presidential reauthorization of the Secure Rural Schools Act, but tabled a resolution presented by OSPIRG calling on publishers to reduce textbook prices, to allow time for the board to rewrite the resolution in its own language; both by unanimous vote.

The board heard a report on Lane's participation in a national survey of student engagement, and reviewed a benchmark report on the change in employee headcount.

The meeting adjourned at 8:55 p.m. The next regular meeting is scheduled for April 13. Submitted by Joan Aschim, Marketing and Public Relations.
