DISABILITY SERVICES AWARENESS TIP #7

Here are tips to use when you're working with someone who uses a wheelchair or scooter:

- * Understand that the wheelchair or scooter is part of the individual's "personal space." Don't lean on or touch the equipment without permission.
- * To show support for an individual, pat the upper arm or shoulder as you would with anyone sitting in a chair. Never pat the top of the head.
- * If you have an extended conversation, try sitting or crouching down to eye level. This will ease neck strain and be more respectful.
- * Offer to give a push and wait for permission to do so.
- * Don't avoid terms such as "go for a walk" or "run across to the next building."
- * The appropriate speed for a motorized wheelchair or scooter is the pace of the walking traffic around the motorized wheelchair or scooter.

E-MAIL RETENTION PERIOD EXTENDED

When the college installed the Novell GroupWise product in 2000, there were only two options for automatically deleting e-mail, appointments, tasks or notes: delete after 250 days or retain forever. The college chose to auto-delete after 250 days. In the last four years the GroupWise database size has grown by 3000 percent. A recent upgrade to the GroupWise software allows us to increase the retention period to 365

days. This means that any mail you receive today will automatically be deleted from your mail box in one year. In order to keep mail longer than 365 days you need to archive it. If you would like help archiving your e-mail, call Michael Levick at 463-3359.

DISABILITY SERVICES AWARENESS TIP #8

Here are some tips to use when working with someone who has a hearing disability:

- * When meeting with someone who is deaf or hard of hearing, you can use paper and pencil, as well as your computer, to write out a conversation.
- * Arrange for the individual to sit at the front of the room, or place furniture in a circle or semicircle.
- * Be aware of noise level. Students may be very sensitive to background sounds that tend to "mask" speech.
- * Avoid standing in front of a strong light source because it puts your face in shadow, making it nearly impossible to "speech read."
- * Face the individual when speaking, not the board when writing. Walking about also makes it difficult to read your lips.
- * When using an overhead projector, stand to the side of the projector so that it doesn't block your face.
- * Use visual aids whenever possible, but allow time for the student to look at them before resuming your lecture.
- * If an individual is working with a sign language interpreter, speak directly to the student, not the interpreter.
- * Do not walk or pace between the interpreter and the person who is working with the interpreter.
- * Give the interpreter time to catch up with your lecture or conversation.
- * When showing a videotape, make sure it's captioned and that the television has a decoder.

BOARD REPORT FOR JUNE

The Lane Community College Board of Education adopted the 2005/06 college budget by 7-0 vote at its June 8 meeting. There was no public comment offered at the annual budget hearing held prior to the vote. The budget is a roll-over from the current year with a general fund of \$79,790,760. President Mary Spilde said the state legislature still has not appropriated funding. She is planning to hire an associate vice president of finance and budget to continue strengthening the college's fiscal stability. She invited Tamara Pinkas to update the board on League for Innovation activities. Finally, the president awarded plaques of appreciation to outgoing board members Kathleen Shelley and Dennis Shine for their dedication and leadership, and to Laura Tamura, who is retiring after 22 years as assistant to the board and president. The three received many accolades.

The board continued its pledge of \$250,000 for the longhouse and gave the goahead to begin planning for March 2006 construction, by 6-0 vote. Jay Bozievich abstained, saying he supports the project but was concerned by the board's decision not to tie the pledge to fundraising efforts, as it has other times. President Spilde said approving construction will allow a materials list to be developed for in-kind donations. Earlier, under statements from the audience, retired Native American program director Frank Merrill and student body president Jeremy Riel, advocated for the longhouse. The board authorized staff to proceed with bid awards for the health clinic remodel before the July meeting; and approved a contract for replacement of the Center Building mansard roof; both by 7-0 vote.

A first reading review of the board's tuition policy was held.

In reports and discussion, the board reviewed its evaluation; a summary of the strategic conversation with Lane County commissioners; a report on the treatment of learners; and benchmarks on students' reasons for attending Lane, students by age group, student gender and enrollment status, and student race-ethnicity.

The next meeting will be July 13. - Joan Aschim, Marketing and Public Relations.
