SOUTHWEST PARKING LOT UPGRADE

Eugene Sand & Gravel has begun work on the gravel lot in the southwest corner of main campus. The lot will have another row added and will be paved and striped by the first day of fall term. The lot will have swales incorporated in the island areas so that the storm water run-off will infiltrate into the swales and recharge the ground water. A second component is for the swales to cleanse the storm water run-off and remove pollutants. Funds for the project come from the transportation fee. The gravel lot will be blocked off and there will be frequent truck traffic between Eldon Schafer Drive and the lot so please use caution when driving or walking in the construction area.
