MAIN CAMPUS ANNUAL POWER OUTAGE: Facilities electricians will cut all electrical power to the main campus buildings on September 11 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for annual maintenance and repair to the 12,000-volt transformers and switch gear equipment. Staff should turn off computers and other equipment that need power before 6 a.m. on September 11 and preferably on Friday, September 9. Refrigerators and freezers will be off during the power outage. Emergency lighting will be on in buildings 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 16, and 19 (Student Services, Business, Heath Technology, Physical Education, Performing Arts, Math/Science, and Workforce Training) but the limited lighting is not intended for working conditions. Heating/ventilation/air conditioning and elevators will be out of service. Staff should not be in the buildings during the outage. Permanently installed emergency generators will provide electricity for essential operations including KLCC, Lane TV and the Instructional Web Server. Telephones will continue to work. CML EXHIBIT WILL HONOR DAVID JOYCE

The Center for Meeting and Learning will dedicate its opening art gallery exhibition to commemorating the life and work of David Joyce. "Studio Mates: Remembering David Joyce through the work of John Bauguess, Bob Devine and Ron Finne," kicks off with a reception on Wednesday, September 21 from 5-7 p.m. It will highlight the artists' work created while they shared studio space together.

"We are so honored to be able use our facility to celebrate such a wonderful person as David," says Peg Allison, director of Conference and Culinary Services at Lane. "We hope the gallery will serve as a great resource for both our guests and our local communities well into the future."

The exhibition also will recognize the generous art donation given in Joyce's memory to the college by the artist's wife, Kacey Joyce. The piece, "Komachin," is a unique digital mosaic comprised of thousands of pictures of school students and staff, and now hangs permanently in the Center for Meeting and Learning main lobby.

Joyce is best known in the local community for his flying people mural at the Eugene Airport and reached national acclaim through his photo mosaics and other work. He was a popular local artist/photographer and taught art and media arts at Lane from 1976-2001. He passed away December 3, 2003 at the age of 57 from non-Hodgkins lymphoma.

The exhibit will be up until the first week in February 2006. The gallery is in the upstairs lobby of CML, Building 19 and is open during normal college hours. MCCULLY EARNS CERTIFIED HOSPITALITY EDUCATOR CREDENTIAL

Joe McCully, hospitality instructor at Lane since 2003, has been recertified as a Certified Hospitality Educator by the American Hotel and Lodging Association. The

recertification is based on his years in teaching, operations, and other activities in the hospitality industry. McCully has a bachelor's degree in hotel and restaurant management from the University of Denver (1969), and a master's degree in hospitality management from Florida International University (2003). He founded and operated McCully's Rooftop restaurant in Bonita Springs, Fla., for 24 years. He grew up the New York restaurant business and is originally from Fort Myers, Fla. SO WHAT IS THIS CULTURAL COMPETENCY STUFF ANYWAY?

"So What is This Cultural Competency Stuff Anyway?" is a presentation sponsored by Lane County Human Resources with nationally renowned consultant and educator, Dr. Edwin Nichols, to be held Wednesday, September 28, from 8 a.m.-5 p.m., at Valley River Inn. Dr. Nichols, a clinical/industrial psychologist in Washington, D.C., provides organizational development training in the U.S. and abroad. The average age of my students was 35 years old, and since I was only 21, we were both a little intimidated by each other. The difference was, I had the skills they needed to move into a new career. The college motto was, 'We're part of the solution!' The community college motto was not half-baked." SO WHAT IS THIS CULTURAL COMPETENCY STUFF ANYWAY?

"So What is This Cultural Competency Stuff Anyway?" is a presentation sponsored by Lane County Human Resources with nationally renowned consultant and educator, Dr. Edwin Nichols, to be held Wednesday, September 28, from 8 a.m.-5 p.m., at Valley River Inn. Dr. Nichols, a clinical/industrial psychologist in Washington, D.C., provides organizational development training in the U.S. and abroad. He explains the meaning of cultural competency from an anthropological perspective that teaches, not preaches -- and he specializes in helping organizations meet their objectives by developing cultural competence. Axiology is based on the pre-historic survival skills of a society determined and reinforced by its geographic origin. Understanding our axiology is a way of explaining cultural differences that avoids the pitfalls of blame or deficiencies (i.e. There is something wrong with them!)

COUGAR SIGHTING

There has been a recent sighting of a cougar on the south edge of campus in the evening near the woods. In evaluating the amount of risk this poses we need to remember that the cougars have been in these woods for many, many years and are sighted periodically. It is, however, prudent to have a buddy when using the wooded paths around campus and to use particular caution at dawn and dusk.

The following information on what to do if you are approached by a cougar is from cougarfund.org/safety.php -- "If you come in contact with a mountain lion that does not run away, stay calm, stand your ground and don't back down! Back away slowly if possible and safe to do so. Pick up children, but do not bend down or turn your back on the lion. do not run. Running triggers an innate response in cougars which could lead to an attack. Raise your voice and speak firmly. Raise your arms and make yourself look larger, clap your hands, and throw something you might have in your hands, like a water bottle. Again, do not bend over to pick up a stone off the ground.
