DAILY BECOMES WEEKLY

Lane's staff newsletter is now a weekly and has a new name: Lane Weekly.

The transition from a daily to a weekly reflects a work rebalance in Marketing and Public Relations due to budget reductions and the need to invest more time in marketing and information activities that contribute to the college's future fiscal stability.

An online readership survey conducted in June drew 401 responses. Of those, 301 respondents suggested a name, most of which included the word "weekly." Experts say newsletter names should be short, straightforward and include the organization's name. That's how we arrived at Lane Weekly.

Lane has published a staff newsletter since 1965. Frequency has varied from weekly to daily to three or four times a week. The first name was The Roundup. It became The Daily in 1970.

NEWS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS**LOCAL OPTION LEVY REFERRED TO VOTERS**

The Lane Community College Board of Education has referred to the voters of the Lane Community College District a five-year local option instructional levy. The levy will be measure number 20-120. Lane's electoral district includes portions of Linn, Benton and Douglas Counties and most of Lane County.

If passed, the college would levy \$1,366,372 annually for five years beginning July 1, 2007, for a total of \$6,831,860 for tax years 2007/08 through 2011/12. This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent. Passage requires a majority of votes cast, with no turnout requirement.

It is estimated that the proposed tax would result in a rate of 6 cents per \$1,000 of assessed property value, or \$9 a year in additional property taxes for a home whose assessed value is \$150,000 in tax year 2007/08. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an estimate only based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate.

Adoption of this levy would reduce additional budget impacts such as program eliminations and lay-offs necessitated by reductions in state funding. Funding from state sources has declined 20.3 percent, from \$30.9 million in 2001/02, to \$24.6 million in 2006/07. In the same time period, the cost of tuition to students has increased 83 percent, from \$38 per credit hour for resident students in 2001/01, to \$69.50 in 2006/07.

If Measure 20-120 passes, the college would use levy proceeds to support funding for instructional programs and services including certificates and degrees that prepare students for professional technical careers; lower division college classes that students may transfer for credit towards a higher degree; skills-based classes that improve employee productivity; business development and management classes that assist owners of small businesses; and foundational academic, language and life skills classes that prepare students for college-level courses and/or entry into the workplace. and used as overflow parking. This will create a significant increase in the number of available parking spaces. Stay tuned for where these overflow lots will be located.

Staff are requested to use the overflow lots the first two weeks of fall term.

As lots fill, Public Safety will put up "lot full" signs to help you avoid circling in an already full lot.

SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Lane Community College Board of Education met September 13.

In statements, student Justin Blakely requested a partial refund; community members Dean Hansen and Jeff McKay advocated for continuation of men's baseball; and student Pete White objected to parking policies and complaint procedures.

The board approved its policies on harassment, and advertising, by 7-0 vote, following second reading reviews. First reading reviews were held for policies on equal opportunity, and equal opportunity in admissions.

Men's baseball and women's soccer were approved by 7-0 vote to continue through 2006/07, with the college to cover expenses beyond community fundraising of \$100,000.

Feedback was given on the Oregon Community College Association strategic plan.

A study, "The Economic Contribution of Lane Community College," was reviewed. The Association for Community College Trustees funded economic impact studies across the nation, including individual college reports. An executive summary is available at www.lanecc.edu/presoffc or from the President's Office.

The board reviewed its strategy for increasing community involvement, an outcome from its annual evaluation. The strategy includes continuing listening forums with constituent groups; conducting sessions with professional technical employers; and continuing or increasing representation on other community groups.

A benchmark report on the percent of county population was reviewed.

The next monthly meeting will be held Tuesday, October 17 - not the usual second Wednesday date - at 6:30 p.m. in the Boardroom, Building 3. Submitted by Joan Aschim.

SEPTEMBER BOARD WORK SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Lane Community College Board of Education held a work session on September 20. Topics discussed included strategic planning, new board member orientation, interaction between the board and staff, and budget development. The Learning Council Plan, Student Affairs Plan, and the Technology Council Plan were discussed as to their alignment with Lane's strategic direction. The board requested strategic direction monitoring reports be prepared to ensure assessment of progress (Plan/Do/Check/Act). LANE WINS NATIONAL RECYCLING AWARD

Lane Community College has won the Outstanding College or University Program award for 2006 from the National Recycling Coalition. The award will be presented at the coalition's conference October 22 in Atlanta, Georgia.

The award is a result of a competitive process between four- and two-year university and college recycling programs affiliated with NRC. NRC is a national professional association of public, private, and nonprofit recycling programs and businesses.

Recycling at Lane began with a student initiative in 1978 to recycle paper. Last year, the college recycled 60.67 percent, or 485.18 tons, of its outgoing material including paper, cardboard, metal, plastic, glass, wood, and grounds debris. Even kitchen food waste is recycled--6.5 tons in 2005 were composted into four tons of soil for grounds keeping.

EARLY WARNING AND INTERVENTION SYSTEMS: MID-TERM PROGRESS REPORTS: A REQUEST FROM SAGA

One of the six best practices for student retention and success identified by the Success and Goal Attainment committee (SAGA) is Early Warning and Intervention Systems, which detect students who are having academic or personal problems before they begin to fail and respond with a customized plan for addressing each student's unique needs. A mid-term progress report system helps students know where they stand in classes early enough in the term so that they can seek additional resources or adjust their behavior to be successful in their classes

Although we do not have a campus-wide system for mid-term progress reports, we know many instructors and some departments inform their students about their mid-term status. Since we are at that time of the term, we encourage instructors to share your tips about how you provide mid-term progress reports to your students and what resources you encourage them to use. Please send your tips in a brief format to the SAGA Communication Subcommittee@lanecc.edu. The tips will be published on the SAGA webpage.

If you do not typically provide mid-term progress reports to students, we encourage you to find a time this week to talk to your students who are in danger of not receiving a passing grade. That way students will have time to make changes that will improve their grades before it is too late. In other action, the board approved budget development documents for 2007/08 including process, principles and criteria, data elements, priorities, assumptions, and strategies.

A resolution to provide tuition waivers to the children and spouses of soldiers killed in the war on terrorism passed 7-0. The resolution was prompted by Gov. Kulongoski to Oregon institutions of higher education.

The board renewed its policies on equal opportunity and equal opportunity in admissions, following second reading reviews. They conducted a first reading review of board policy on the definition of a balanced budget.

They reviewed highlights from a new community perception survey, summary notes from their conversation with health care leaders, and benchmarks on unduplicated student headcount and student FTE by reimbursement category.

In audience statements, Rob Spooner of Florence promoted his website.

Board members gave updates on their speaking engagements and interviews about the local option levy. President Mary Spilde said she interviewed with the Chronicle of Higher Education about education funding in Oregon. The article and a photo from October 17 are online at <http://chronicle.com/cc/>

IT UPDATE ON SPAM

Statistics derived from a number of different reputable sources including Google, Symantec, Jupiter Research and others, indicate that early in 2006, 40 percent of all e-mail was spam. Annual spam in a 1,000-employee company is 2.1 million. Later in 2006, Wesleyan University reported over 90 percent of its incoming mail was spam, and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee reported 85 percent of its 1.2 million e-mails per day was spam.

However, spam statistics are quickly outdated. Spam writers have the same tools that we currently have, except they use the filters to write more intelligent spam. As they out-maneuver current filters, we wait for updated spam lists to stop delivery of new spam into mail boxes. The faster we detect and block spam the faster they write code to by pass the filters. By its very nature, the war against spam is always behind the curve.

We are filtering spam two ways: 1) Routing internet mail (inbound and outbound) to a specific folder that Guinevere (our current spam solution) scans for spam; and 2) configuring GroupWise to use a "black list." This is a free third-party spam blacklist that is updated weekly by internet e-mail community resources.

Guinevere was a \$500 software package with an open source (free) spam plug-in, purchased five years ago. We know we have taken this technology as far as it will go and are looking into proprietary spam blocking solutions. We are currently considering one or more temporary trial solutions to see which solution works best. We will update the college with new information as it becomes available.

BOARD REPORT FOR NOVEMBER

At its Nov. 8 meeting, the Board of Education considered three scenarios for 2007/08 budget development. The best case scenario assumes \$529 million in state funding for Oregon's 17 community colleges, the State Board of Education's recommendation, which would result in a \$1.7 million deficit at Lane. The mid case scenario assumes state funding of \$500 million, or a deficit of \$3.5 million. The worst case assumes state funding of \$470 million, the governor's current proposal, or a deficit of \$5.5 million.

The board discussed how to get the Budget Committee more involved. The committee includes board members and their appointees but cannot officially meet until a proposed budget has been presented. However, committee members can meet with the board for educational purposes, and anyone can access budget information at www.lanecc.edu/budget/0708. Appointees also receive board agenda materials.

The transportation fee was increased from \$16 to \$19 for main campus credit students, effective winter term, due to increases in LTD fees. The noncredit fee remains \$5. The fee goes toward bus passes and parking lot maintenance.

In other action, the board passed a resolution advocating in-state community college residency for enrolled members of federally recognized tribes of Oregon; and gave second-reading approval to its policy defining a balanced budget.

All votes were unanimous.

The board held a first reading of its policy on unappropriated ending fund balance; and reviewed a benchmark on grants and contracts by funding source; strategic directions; and the quarterly financial report.

In comments, board members and others expressed dismay at the defeat of Lane's local option levy and stressed obtaining the governor's and legislature's support for community college funding.

The next regularly monthly meeting is set for Dec. 6. Submitted by Joan Aschim.

BOARD WORK SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Lane Community College Board of Education held a work session prior to the Nov. 8 board meeting. The board reviewed the information gathered at the September strategic conversation on health care in which health care leaders provided their perspective. The findings from the conversation were grouped into three categories: nursing, dental hygiene, and continuing education and contract training. Strategies for meeting the needs of health care education in our community were identified, including partnerships and collaborations with industry, expanding the programs, and developing new areas of health care education. SECURING THE EAST SIDE OF CAMPUS

Public Safety is having two open forum to explain and gather input on the proposed plan for physically securing the east side of campus, on December 6 and 7 from 2-4 p.m. in Building 17 (Forum) Room 308. All are invited. Proposal summary:

Background: Currently the two west entrances to the college have gates that are closed when campus is not open to the public. This has reduced non-college related traffic on campus during closed

hours. However, the east entrances are wide open and this leads to frequent episodes of vehicles with no known business on campus coming on campus during closed hours. This creates a security concern for both property and for people legitimately on campus during these hours. The college also has a need to be able to secure the campus perimeter in the event of an emergency on campus that creates a post-emergency opportunity for looting. Eldon Schafer Dr. is a county road and the college may not gate or otherwise obstruct it.

Goals: To provide a method of quickly securing the east entrances to the campus; to provide easy access for those persons who need to access campus during closed hours--vendors, some staff, etc.; to provide convenient access for persons who have an infrequent need to access campus during closed hours; to allow Public Safety to monitor who enters and exits campus during closed hours; to provide a way for Public Safety to patrol the entire campus with the gates secured.

The plan: Install gates, similar to those on the west side of campus which will be opened and closed daily. Install electronic gates on selected entrances/exits which will have card key access. Card keys will be issued to staff and persons needing routine after-hours access. Public Safety would be issued remote key access to facilitate emergency response. Install a campus phone direct to Public Safety at one of the entrances so that the occasional visitor can directly contact Public Safety to be let onto campus. Public Safety will remove bollards from Center Building access road during closed hours. This, plus the remote electronic access, will allow for patrolling of entire campus during closed hours.

WEEKLY CALENDAR DISPLAY IN GROUPWISE

Question: I don't like the new calendar display. I don't want the monthly calendars to the left of the weekly calendar. It scrunches up the weekly calendar too much. Can I change it?

Answer: There are two views of the week calendar: Week (Default), which has the month calendars on the left, and Week, which does not include the month calendars. To change your view from Week (Default) to Week, follow these steps (this procedure is not available in the Mac version, but if you do it on a PC, it will change the display on your Mac accordingly):

Select View > Change Calendar View

Highlight [Week - Week (Default)] and select Edit

Open the View drop down list and select Week

Click on OK to close each of the windows

Done. You can change any of the listed calendar views in this way.

You may also find it useful to open the calendar views in a new window. This allows you to answer emails about your schedule while simultaneously viewing your calendar. To do this, select: Window > Calendar > Week (or other calendar view of your choice.) On the Mac, this would be: Window > New Calendar Window.
