**NEWS****A BRIEF HISTORY OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

Black History Month was originally proposed in 1926 as Negro History Week by Dr. Carter G. Woodson, a Harvard-trained historian and founder of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History. Woodson chose the second week of February to mark the birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln. February also marks other significant dates in black history including the birth of W.E.B. DuBois, the passing of the 15th amendment giving blacks the right to vote, the founding of the NAACP, the civil rights sit-in at the Greensboro, North Carolina segregated Woolworth's counter, and the killing of Malcolm X. In the early 1970s, the observance became known as Black History Week and in 1976 it was established as Black History Month, alternately known as African-American History month. Since 1926, the Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History (ASALH) has established a national theme for African American History Month. The theme for 2006 is "Celebrating Community: A Tribute to Black Fraternal, Social, and Civic Institutions." #### IN MEMORY OF CORETTA SCOTT KING

April 27, 1927-January 30, 2006

Human rights advocate Coretta Scott King died January 30 at age 78. Her funeral in Atlanta was attended by thousands. King was born near Marion, Alabama and spent her childhood on her parent's farm, walking five miles a day to attend a one-room school. She majored in music and education at Antioch College and continued her music studies at New England Conservatory of Music in Boston where she met Martin Luther King Jr., also a student in Boston. They were married in 1953 and moved to Montgomery, Alabama after Coretta Scott King graduated from the conservatory. The Kings had four children. Their first child, Yolanda, was born in 1955 two weeks before the beginning of the Montgomery bus boycott. Coretta King shared as a partner in her husbands' work, walking with him in marches, traveling with him, and giving speeches. She was a delegate on behalf of the Women's Strike for Peace at the Disarmament Conference in Geneva in 1962. After her husband's assassination in 1968, Coretta King took it for granted she would continue their work. Four days after his death she led a march of 50,000 people through the streets of Memphis. She helped create and

continually raised funds for the Martin Luther King Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change in Atlanta, which currently covers three full blocks and houses a library and archives of the civil rights movement. She was instrumental in getting her husband's birthday honored as a national holiday. In recent years she spoke out against racial profiling, mandatory minimum sentences and attacks on affirmative action. She was a champion of human rights and spent her life working for peace and justice. #### **READING TOGETHER PRESENTS LANE NISHIKAWA**

Award-winning playwright and director Lane Nishikawa will discuss and show excerpts from his new film, "Only the Brave," on Friday, February 17 from 10-11:30 a.m. in the Center for Meeting and Learning, Building 19, Room 104, presented by Reading Together. Come that evening to the opening night gala presentation of the entire film at

the DisOrient Asian-American Film Festival, Bijou Art Cinema, showings at 5:46 p.m. and 8:25 p.m.

"Only the Brave" is a searing portrait of war and prejudice which takes the viewer on a haunting journey into the hearts and minds of the forgotten heroes of World War II: the all-volunteer, Japanese-American 100th/442nd Regimental Combat Team. On the mainland, 120,000 innocent men, women and children were rounded up and swept into remote internment camps, where they would remain behind barbed wire for the duration of the war. Determined to prove their loyalty, the discharged Hawaiian Territorial Guardsmen of Japanese descent successfully petitioned the U.S. government to allow them to serve. Outstanding among their many exploits: 275 men of the Texas' 36th Division had been trapped for more than a week on a high plateau in France's Vosges Mountains, surrounded by 7,000 experienced German soldiers. When attempts by much larger regular-Army units failed to break through, the 100th/442nd was ordered to finish the job. Though their ranks were already decimated and the Nisei were unimaginably exhausted, they spent four days and nights in brutal uphill hand-to-hand combat while suffering frostbite and trench foot so severe they could hardly walk. The Nisei saved 211 out of the 275 Texans, but suffered more than 800 casualties of their own. During two years of combat, their extraordinary valor resulted in an unparalleled 21 Medals of Honor, 9,486 Purple Hearts, eight Presidential Citations, 53 Distinguished Service Crosses, 588 Silver Stars and 5,200 Bronze Star Medals, making them the most decorated unit of their size and length of service in American military history. 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#### TENT CITY REVISITED

"Remembering Our Roots: Eugene's Tent City Revisited," will be Saturday, February 18, from 1-4 p.m., at Lamb Cottage in Skinner's Butte Park. Eugene's first African American residents were not welcomed with open arms in the 1940s. Substandard housing, limited employment and educational opportunity, and legalized segregation marked the arrival of Eugene's first African American citizens. The Black Student Union Tent City Historical Project is dedicated to remembering the past hardships and victories over racism and discrimination of African Americans who chose to make this community their home. **ACADEMIC ADVISING: A BEST PRACTICE FOR STUDENT SUCCESS**

In an earlier edition of The Daily, the Success and Goal Attainment committee (SAGA) outlined the six best practices for increasing student success. These six best practices are: learning communities; first year experiences; academic advising; supplemental instruction; early warning and intervention systems; and campus climate/supportive learner environment. This spring, we have been featuring each best practice in The Daily and offering tips for student retention and success.

Academic advising, this week's featured best practice, is a developmental process that assists students in clarifying their academic goals and in developing academic plans for realizing those goals. Academic advising is designed to be an open conversation in which both the student and the advisor share responsibility in developing an academic plan. The advisor helps students coordinate their learning experiences through courses and extracurricular activities and the advisor helps students modify their plans as necessary. Best practice academic advising programs are intrusive, requiring students to utilize the guidance of a trained professional when choosing their courses and developing their academic plans. This process enables students to make better choices about which courses to take for their program of study, balancing course loads and learning to successfully maneuver through the college system to attain their academic goals.

We want to encourage Lane faculty and staff to remind students that it is time to get advised for advance registration (for summer and/or fall terms) so that they can register for their classes early and have the best selection.
