GROUPWISE WEBMAIL NOTICE TO MACINTOSH USERS

Some Macintosh users have reported problems when they accessed GroupWise webmail. There are two primary issues with the new webmail version that affect Mac users.

When logging into GroupWise webmail, there is a delay of approximately 30 seconds while the program loads. This is a known problem and affects all users, not just Macs. The IT department is investigating the issue and will correct the delay as soon as possible.

After logging in successfully, Mac users have found that some older browser applications do not work properly with the latest version of GroupWise webmail, with intermittent results such as blank pages. Apparently some older browsers do not support the new version of Java that GroupWise uses. If you are having problems, the IT department highly recommends that you download and install the latest version of the free Firefox web browser at http://www.getfirefox.com, as it is known to work well with GroupWise.

BOARD REPORT FOR FEBRUARY

President Mary Spilde told the Board of Education on February 15 that the deficit for 2006/07 includes a \$700,000 decrease in state funding and a \$700,000 increase in early retirement set-aside for faculty and managers.

In statements, Rob Spooner commented on budget issues, and Dennis Gilbert commented on full-time part-time faculty issues.

Board members Paul Holman and Susie Johnston reported on their participation in the 109th Community College National Legislative Summit in Washington D.C. February 8-9. For the story and photos, see http://www.lanecc.edu/mpr/news/newsatlane.htm

In unanimous action the board approved meeting minutes, a second reading of board policy on firearms, and the appointments of Dennis Shine and Chris Turek to the Budget Committee.

The board held a first reading of its policy on intoxicants.

A decision on whether to go out for a local option levy was postponed until March. After long discussion, the board wanted time to ask K-12 leaders what the impact on schools might be. Lane could collect a maximum of \$1.3 million under a local option levy, but might receive only \$700,000 after "compression" calculations.

The board commented on Oregon Community College Association goals. They also reviewed benchmarks on student retention and success, the quarterly financial report, and monitoring reports on financial condition and activities, financial planning and budgeting, emergency president succession, and communication and support to the board.

WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH AND INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

March is Women's History Month. March 8 is celebrated as International Women's Day, an event first proposed by the German socialist and feminist leader Clara Zetkin and first celebrated in the United States on February 23, 1909, when socialist working women declared it a holiday. Their goal was to win bread and roses: to improve women's working conditions and to gain respect as women. Lenin officially declared it a holiday in 1922 and eventually all communist countries celebrated it. Due to its association with socialism and communism, the holiday went "underground" until 1968 when a group of women in the Chicago Women's Liberation Union threw a party to honor International Women's Day. On March 8, 1969, some 50 Berkeley feminists paraded in early-20th-century costumes marching with the slogan "Bread and Roses." In 1977, women's historian Gerda Lerner organized a Summer Institute on Women's History. Participants decided to adopt as their class project the goal of creating an annual Women's History Week. They (and others) successfully lobbied Congress to recognize Women's History Week in 1981. In 1987, women activists got Congress to expand the week into a month. FORENSICS TEAM CONTINUES TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE

The Lane Community College Forensics Team competed at the National Qualifying Tournament February 24 and 25 in Salem at Willamette University. Skippy Coatsworth and Kendra Taylor qualified for nationals, to be held at the University of Florida in Gainesville. Skippy qualified in Dramatic Interpretation and both Kendra and Skippy qualified in Dramatic Duo. Kendra is the first alternate in After Dinner Speaking and Steve is the second alternate in Informative Speaking. Skippy is a veteran of forensics, participating in high school and qualifying last year while competing at Lane. This makes two years in a row that Skippy has qualified for the national tournament. Kendra has never competed in speech or debate prior to this past fall. It is rare for someone without experience in this activity to succeed so quickly, and at the highest levels of inter-collegiate competition (senior division competition).

LANE EVENTS CALENDAR INFORMATION

There has been some confusion and questions arising from recent changes to the display functionality on "Lane Events." To help clarify what Lane Events is and how it functions, here is an outline of the system:

Overview: Information Technology and the Space Implementation Team coordinate to maintain the system by providing ongoing training and support. This group of technical and functional support staff continues to improve the functionality of the software system. Lane Events is the college's web display system for events and classes that are scheduled within the college district. Events are built by a designated scheduler directly through the R25 client software or through requester entry into Lane Events using "My Requests".

Event Categories: During the event building process, the requester determines several key data items determine where the event will eventually be displayed in Lane Events. These key data items include: location, event type and the organization requesting the event. Hot Events: One event type is key for display and that is a "Hot Event". A Hot Event is defined as an event that is open to the public, has general collegewide interest and/or involves members of the community. Hot Event designation can be made at the time the event is built either by the requester or the scheduler. Hot Event examples include such events as athletics, theatre productions, concerts speakers, open houses, gallery exhibits and fund raising dinners etc. Please specify in the "Comments" to the scheduler that you want the event to be listed as a Hot Event.

Filters: There are groups of like events that are selected for display using a "Filter". These filters are located on the right side of the Lane Events page and are available for searching for specific types of events by location or type.

Default View: The default event page has recently been changed to list district Hot Events to focus on events of college-wide interest, increase the speed of the initial load of the Lane Events page and decrease the main campus centric feel to the system.

The college began the conversion to GroupWise 7 on President's Day weekend. Staff noticed the first phase of the conversion as a major change in the web mail interface. For most staff, the changes were positive with many new features that make using web mail easier and more intuitive. We all notice a significant delay while logging in, but after that the interface performs well. Novell is aware of the login delay and assures clients that it, along with other known issues, will be addressed in a soon-to-be-released service pak.

We heard from a few staff that the upgrade seriously degraded their access. We are working with the feedback we receive, with other Novell clients and with our own tests to try to pin down the common issues that lead to degraded performance. We are beginning to get a picture that hardware, operating system, browser choice, and connection speed and type are all variables that can affect performance. Needless to say, their are a lot of potential combinations here when you consider that we all live in different areas, with different service possibilities and make our own choices about personal computer types, operating systems, browsers, internet connections, etc.

The Information Technology Department is working to implement a Novell supplied "simple" interface to offer as an alternative for those staff whose personal situation is not working well with the new web mail interface. We will continue to offer the new interface because that seems to work well for most staff. We hope to have the "simple" interface available in the next couple of days. We are also creating a web

information page with advice about the best browser to use based on your personal computer configuration. We are learning that just changing browsers can clear up many of the issues being reported.

Please call the Help Desk at ext. 4444 if you are having any difficulties with GroupWise. Watch for an announcement of the new interface and the information page in the next Daily.

CAMPUS CLIMATE/SUPPORTIVE LEARNER ENVIRONMENT: A BEST PRACTICE FOR STUDENT SUCCESS BROUGHT TO YOU BY SAGA

Everyone at Lane has a role to play in creating a "supportive learner environment," and thereby improving the retention rate of students (and FTE.) A key fundamental in retention is providing a student-friendly and service-oriented learning environment. In addition to the quality of teaching, some of the key areas in this "best practice" are: admissions, registration, the library, financial aid, advising, counseling, food service, building and grounds maintenance, safety/security, the bookstore, health services, computer labs, disability services, multicultural and women's centers, and student life programs such as clubs, recreational sports and student government.

Because there is a strong correlation between student satisfaction and persistence, improving student success begins with evaluating and then improving the institution's service systems, policies, and processes. Lane has several initiatives that reflect this "best practice" of evaluation and quality improvement of the campus climate such as: the establishment of the Student Success and Goal Attainment (SAGA) committee, IRAP's administration of the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) and the ACT Student Opinion survey, Strategic Learning Initiatives (SLI), the Diversity Plan and Coordinator, Diversity Training, establishment of Learning-Centered College principles, and the Strategic Directions to enhance the college climate.

Lane administered the CCSSE survey in 90 classrooms during winter term 2005. Dan Timberlake (Counseling) and Craig Taylor (Institutional Research, Assessment and Planning) have been disseminating the results to the board and campus groups. Lane will use the CCSSE results as benchmarks to evaluate the effectiveness of retention initiatives at Lane.

BOARD REPORT FOR MARCH

The Lane Community College Board of Education voted 5-2 at its March 8 meeting to ask voters to approve a local option levy in November. Board members Jay Bozievich and Paul Holman opposed the levy. The county assessor's office reported that Lane could collect about \$1 million from a maximum \$1.37 million levy, following the "compression effect" of other local option levies and projected collection rates. President Mary Spilde said K-12 districts reported that a levy by Lane would not significantly impact their own revenue. Reasons favoring the levy included acting in the college's best interests by raising as much revenue as possible given continuing state funding shortfalls. Concerns included "voter fatigue" and that a levy does not address the long term issue of expenses exceeding revenues. Administration will return with ballot language at the next meeting.

By unanimous vote, the board approved a new retail management certificate program. The program includes existing courses in business administration, math, public speaking, computing, and accounting.

In other unanimous action, the board approved the selection of Kenneth Kuhns & Company as college auditor; and the second reading of board policy on the use of intoxicants and controlled substances.

In statements from the audience, faculty bargaining chair Stan Taylor, a former flight tech instructor and an air traffic controller discussed issues for part-time faculty and advocated settling the faculty contract.

The board held a first reading on a board policy to acknowledge Oregon Senate Bill 300 which increases access to college courses for 11th and 12th grade students. The board also reviewed a benchmark on changes in employee headcount.

The president said the Executive Team will begin to develop budget proposals after March 20. The proposals will be presented to College Council, and then to the board in April. She said that no decisions have been made.

CAMPUS CLIMATE/SUPPORTIVE LEARNER ENVIRONMENT: A BEST PRACTICE FOR STUDENT SUCCESS BROUGHT TO YOU BY SAGA

Everyone at Lane has a role to play in creating a "supportive learner environment," and thereby improving the retention rate of students (and FTE.) A key fundamental in retention is providing a student-friendly and service-oriented learning environment. In addition to the quality of teaching, some of the key areas in this "best practice" are: admissions, registration, the library, financial aid, advising, counseling, food service, building and grounds maintenance, safety/security, the bookstore, health services, computer labs, disability services, multicultural and women's centers, and student life programs such as clubs, recreational sports and student government.

Because there is a strong correlation between student satisfaction and persistence, improving student success begins with evaluating and then improving the institution's service systems, policies, and processes. Lane has several initiatives that reflect this "best practice" of evaluation and quality improvement of the campus climate such as: the establishment of the Student Success and Goal Attainment (SAGA) committee, IRAP's administration of the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) and the ACT Student Opinion survey, Strategic Learning Initiatives (SLI), the Diversity Plan and Coordinator, Diversity Training, establishment of

Learning-Centered College principles, and the Strategic Directions to enhance the college climate.

Lane administered the CCSSE survey in 90 classrooms during winter term 2005. Dan Timberlake (Counseling) and Craig Taylor (Institutional Research, Assessment and Planning) have been disseminating the results to the board and campus groups. Lane will use the CCSSE results as benchmarks to evaluate the effectiveness of retention initiatives at Lane.

Lane continues to broaden the responsibility for retention of students and to improve the "supportive learner environment." For example, SAGA has created a website, http://www.lanecc.edu/saga/ to make Lane retention information more accessible to staff. Faculty have submitted tips to the website to share with other faculty how they have helped students succeed. More departments are including retention in their Unit Plans and goal setting. GROUPWISE UPDATE

There are now three ways to access GroupWise e-mail using a browser (the web interface). You can see each option when you follow the GroupWise link from the LCC home page. While working on campus, most staff use the "client" version of GroupWise. When working from home or while traveling, staff use the web interface. This update concerns only the web interface.

The newest version of GroupWise is available as the "graphic interface." We recommend this for staff with newer computer systems and a fast Internet connection. The next two options are for staff with older computer systems and/or slower connections. This latter group experiences performance problems when they try to use the "graphic interface." The "text interface" is a very stripped down implementation of GroupWise 7. The GroupWise 6.5 interface is intended for those who have no other option. Our recommendation is try each interface and see which one works best for your individual circumstances.

We know that operating systems and browsers really affect performance. Please see the information page at http://www.lanecc.edu/it/hdrefs/gw7webmail.html for our recommendations. If you have questions or need help with your personal connection situation, please call the Help Desk at 4444.

The IT department contacted Novell and they assure us that this is an issue that all Groupwise sites are experiencing. There is nothing we can do with our local installation to reduce or eliminate the delay. MOODLE ADOPTED AS THE COMMON LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR LANE

The Executive Team and Office of Instruction have approved the faculty-led decision to adopt Moodle as Lane's common learning management system (LMS), supported by IT, starting in fall 2006. Lane will cease the use of WebCT when the license expires in September. Moodle will be supported by Lane's IT department both in terms of technical server and student support. In addition to being comparable to other commercial LMS systems such as Blackboard or WebCT, Moodle is open source software, which will save Lane thousands in licensing fees and support costs.

WebCT has been in use at LCC since 1998, and Moodle has been used since 2004. Currently, there are 38 instructors actively using WebCT and 69 actively using Moodle. The 38 WebCT-using faculty will have spring and summer terms to make arrangements for training and conversion of their existing WebCT courses that begin fall term 2006. Lane's three faculty webmasters will offer workshops and individual training for faculty making the conversion from WebCT to Moodle. Course conversion and training is the webmasters' top priority for spring and summer 2006. Stay tuned for additional information, via announcements and targeted e-mails.

POLITICAL SIGNS NOT ALLOWED ON STATE HIGHWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY

From an Oregon Department of Transportation news release:

With primary elections approaching in May, campaign workers are reminded that signs may not be posted on state highway right-of-way. There also are restrictions for signs on private property that are visible from state highways.

Political signs placed on a state highway right-of-way will be removed without notice. Removed signs are held at local ODOT district maintenance offices for 30 days. Signs are prohibited on trees, utility poles, fence posts and natural features within highway right-of-way. They also are prohibited within view of a designated scenic area. The width of state highway right-of-way can vary considerably depending on the specific location.

If you're uncertain whether you're placing a sign on private property or highway right-of-way, call Lynn Stuckrath at (541) 744-8080 for Lane County.

Temporary political signs are allowed on private property within view of state highways with the following restrictions:

o New signs are limited to 12 square feet.

- o No flashing or intermittent lights, animated or moving parts are allowed.
- o Signs must not imitate an official highway sign or device.
- o Signs are not allowed in scenic corridors.

ART HISTORY AND STUDIO ART CLASS WILL EXPLORE THE MEDIEVAL AND RENAISSANCE PERIODS

MOODLE ADOPTED AS THE COMMON LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR LANE

The Executive Team and Office of Instruction have approved the faculty-led decision to adopt Moodle as Lane's common learning management system (LMS), supported by IT, starting in fall 2006. Lane will cease the use of WebCT when the license expires in September. Moodle will be supported by Lane's IT department both in terms of technical server and student support. In addition to being comparable to other commercial LMS systems such as Blackboard or WebCT, Moodle is open source software, which will save Lane thousands in licensing fees and support costs.

WebCT has been in use at LCC since 1998, and Moodle has been used since 2004. Currently, there are 38 instructors actively using WebCT and 69 actively using Moodle. The 38 WebCT-using faculty will have spring and summer terms to make arrangements for training and conversion of their existing WebCT courses that begin fall term 2006. Lane's three faculty webmasters will offer workshops and individual training for faculty making the conversion from WebCT to Moodle. Course conversion and training is the webmasters' top priority for spring and summer 2006. Stay tuned for additional information, via announcements and targeted e-mails.

FINAL REMINDER: MOODLE ADOPTED AS THE COMMON LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR LANE

The Executive Team and Office of Instruction have approved the faculty-led decision to adopt Moodle as Lane's common learning management system (LMS), supported by IT, starting in fall 2006. Lane will cease the use of WebCT when the license expires in September. Moodle will be supported by Lane's IT department both in terms of technical server and student support. In addition to being comparable to other commercial LMS systems such as Blackboard or WebCT, Moodle is open source software, which will save Lane thousands in licensing fees and support costs.

WebCT has been in use at LCC since 1998, and Moodle has been used since 2004. Currently, there are 38 instructors actively using WebCT and 69 actively using Moodle. The 38 WebCT-using faculty will have spring and summer terms to make arrangements for training and conversion of their existing WebCT courses that begin fall term 2006. Lane's three faculty webmasters will offer workshops and individual training for faculty making the conversion from WebCT to Moodle. Course conversion and training is the webmasters' top priority for spring and summer 2006. Stay tuned for additional information, via announcements and targeted e-mails.
