Increasing public use of the online Lane Events Calendar has led to a collaboration between Information Technology and The Daily to simplify how events are scheduled and announced.

Currently, events are scheduled through the Lane Events Calendar and also announced in The Daily, causing duplication of effort and information. Last week, IT upgraded Calendar procedures to require an event description which previously was optional. Beginning May 8, The Daily will publish only Calendar URLs for the day and the week, and discontinue redundant event announcements (exceptions may be made depending on college marketing strategies).

TEST OF EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION SYSTEM PLANNED

The college Emergency Communication System is how we will communicate with all persons on campus in the event of an emergency that requires some action on their part, i.e., leave campus, stay inside, etc.

The week of May 8, the college will conduct a test of the Emergency Communication System on the main campus. A test message will be sent out four different ways: an all campus email, the college telephone tree, the zone phone paging system (this is where selected speaker phones in most areas will just blurt out our message), and departmental communication plans which should mirror the departmental telephone tree.

When your first get the message, by any method, and word or mouth counts, note the time and method. Then, sometime that day, let your department representative know when and how you got the message. Your department representative will compile the results for your area and forward them to the Health and Safety office.

Staff designated to "sweep" areas of buildings should do this. Just give a simple message that we are testing the emergency communication system and they need to note the time and method they first received the notice. Hopefully, this will be only a minor disruption to classes, meetings, etc.

REMINDER: TEST OF EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION SYSTEM PLANNED

The college Emergency Communication System is how we will communicate with all persons on campus in the event of an emergency that requires some action on their part, i.e., leave campus, stay inside, etc.

The week of May 8, the college will conduct a test of the Emergency Communication System on the main campus. A test message will be sent out four different ways: an all campus e-mail, the college telephone tree, the zone phone paging system (this is where selected speaker phones in most areas will just blurt out our message), and departmental communication plans which should mirror the departmental telephone tree.

When your first get the message, by any method, and word or mouth counts, note the time and method. Then, sometime that day, let your department representative know when and how you got the message. Your department representative will compile the results for your area and forward them to the Health and Safety office.

Staff designated to "sweep" areas of buildings should do this. Just give a simple message that we are testing the emergency communication system and they need to note the time and method they first received the notice. Hopefully, this will be only a minor disruption to classes, meetings, etc.

We'll use this information to evaluate and make changes in our system.

After the test of the Emergency Communication System you need to report to your department the time you first heard the message and how you hear it: e-mail, phone page, word of mouth, etc. We are only going to track how people first get the message.

HEALTH CLINIC NOTICE: MUMPS

The recent diagnosis of mumps in Lane County may have raised some questions for you. The county health department has notified all people exposed and is following those contacts closely. Mumps presents initially with fever, respiratory symptoms, ear pain, and usually, but not always, swelling of the glands in and around the mouth and jaw. If you suspect mumps, isolation is important. Stay home from school or work. The infected person must maintain both respiratory and bathroom hygiene (careful hand washing, cover your cough, do not share eating or drinking utensils, etc). People with a documented history of mumps disease, who have positive antibodies, or who have received two mumps vaccines (usually in the form of MMR--measles, mumps and rubella) can be considered immune. If you plan to be seen in the LCC Health Clinic, please notify us when you make the appointment or when you come in that you suspect mumps, so that we can provide a mask for you. The Health Clinic is in ongoing dialog with the Lane County Health Department Infectious Disease Coordinator regarding this and other diseases and we will pass on additional information as it becomes available. HEALTH CLINIC RECEIVES INNOVATION AWARD

The Lane Health Clinic has been named the Innovation of the Year at Lane Community College. Every year, the League for Innovation honors innovations identified by member institutions as capstone achievements that reflect the spirit of the League. Lane is featured on the League website at

www.league.org/league/competitions/innovations/display2006.cfm (scroll down).

Staff who helped develop the Lane Health Clinic include Vice President for College Operations Marie Matsen, Director of Health and Safety Sandy Ing-Wiese, Director of Human Resources Dennis Carr, Nurse Practitioner Mona Arbuckle, and Health Clinic Director Duke Vandervort.

The clinic serves employees as well as students. Inspiration for this innovation came at a time when Lane was faced with rapidly escalating health insurance costs. As one of a handful of community colleges that had a student health center, it made sense to find a way to take advantage of an existing health care resource that had the potential to decease college costs. A pilot project began in summer 2004 offering primary care to qualified students and classified staff. Based on its success, all qualified employees and students became eligible for services in January 2005 and Lane's student health center evolved into the Lane Health Clinic.

Students and employees pay a nominal fee which covers most clinic services. Some services, such as sutures, medications and lab tests are offered at low cost. With the goal of providing optimum patient care, prevention and educational services, the Health Clinic joins resources with the Employee Wellness Program, Counseling Services, and Disability Services. Clinic staff also often work with the patients' primary care providers, achieving more comprehensive, cost effective, and convenient care.

In 2004-05, the clinic provided care for 4,987 students and 796 employees. Twenty percent of patient visits are now employees. About \$125,000 to \$200,000 in annual direct cost savings have been made in employee time saved by going to Lane's clinic vs. going off campus for care. This is based on an average of three hours average time lost from work for a provider visit. OEA Choice Trust data indicates that the average cost of a medical provider visit in Eugene is \$141. The Lane Health Clinic currently sees 100 employees per month: That's \$14,100 per month not billed to insurance. This translates to a \$500,000 to \$700,000 decrease in insurance renewal rates secondary to decreased insurance utilization.

The Lane Community College Budget Committee met May 10 and 17. On May 10 the committee approved 2006/07 budget reduction proposals by 13-0 vote; Stephen Alison abstained. They also approved a new \$30 enrollment fee to replace testing and graduation fees by 13-1 vote; Larry Romine dissented. On May 17, the committee unanimously approved the proposed budget for Board of Education adoption in June; a reduction in international student tuition from \$230 to \$200 per credit hour plus implementation of a \$10 per credit fee for international students; and maintaining the current funding level for PERS. The committee also approved annual tax levies by 13-1 vote; Dennis Shine abstained.

The committee has completed its work on the 2006/07 budget and will not meet again this year. Submitted by Joan Aschim.

BOARD REPORT FOR MAY

The Lane Community College Board of Education met May 10 and 17.

At the May 10 meeting, the board unanimously approved student election outcomes; the faculty contract; a contract to 2G Construction to upgrade the sewage treatment facility; and board policy on conflict of interest.

The board voted 6-1 to submit three capital construction priorities to the Oregon Community Colleges and Workforce Development department: a new health and wellness building, remodel of the Downtown Center, and remodel of the Forum Building. Larry Romine voted no.

In other business, the board heard a fundraising report on men's baseball and women's soccer; reviewed the quarterly financial report; reviewed a benchmark on the percentage of high school graduates attending Lane; and held a first reading of board policy on student-initiated mandatory fees.

The board held a special meeting on May 17. By unanimous vote, the board approved continuing men's baseball and women's soccer in 2006/07, and asked administration to prepare a recommendation on the long-term sustainability of the programs. In other unanimous action, the board accepted insurance coverage proposals

from OEA Choice Trust to provide dental and Section 125 coverage, and from PacificSource to provide medical, pharmacy and vision insurance. The new plans could save the college from \$241,000 to \$800,000 in premiums. The board also voted 7-0 to approve the president's 2005/06 evaluation process.

STUDENT PROJECT REDUCES WATER CONSUMPTION, SAVES ENERGY

This spring, Energy Management Program student Kaytlyn Brown has been coordinating with classmates from the Energy Management Program and fellow students, Facilities staff, and the Eugene Water and Electric Board to reduce the college's water consumption. Student volunteers have installed aerators in over 70 faucets in four buildings on Lane main campus. The aerators restrict the flow of water to 1.5 gallons per minute, down from an original average of 2.5 GPM before installing the aerators. So far, aerators have been installed in Buildings 1, 2, 3, 16, and the Downtown Center. Feedback from building occupants indicates that they have not noticed a difference in water flow and that the aerators are a positive step towards a more sustainable campus. Student volunteers plan to continue installing aerators to save water in all college buildings.
