I-5 CLOSURE NOTICE

Nighttime Interstate 5 traffic will be detoured to Highway 99 south of Creswell on June 6 and June 7 during the demolition the River Drive overpass bridge at I-5 milepost 180.5.

June 6 at 10 p.m.: Northbound I-5 will close at Saginaw exit 176. Traffic will detour to Highway 99, travel north to the Springfield_ Creswell Highway, and rejoin I-5 at Creswell exit 182. Northbound I-5 will reopen at 5 a.m. on June 7. Southbound I-5 traffic will be unaffected.

June 7 at 10 p.m.: Southbound I-5 will close at Creswell exit 182. Traffic will detour on the Springfield_ Creswell Highway and travel south on Highway 99, rejoining I-5 at Saginaw Road exit 176. Southbound I-5 will reopen at 5 a.m. June 8. Northbound I-5 traffic will be unaffected.

The I-5/River Drive overpass (milepost 180.5) will close for 11 months starting June 5 to remove and rebuild the overpass bridge. The east half of the aging bridge, over northbound I5, will be removed the night of June 6. The west half of the bridge, over southbound I-5, will be removed the night of June 7. A new River Drive overpass bridge is scheduled to open next spring.

Except for the nights of June 6 and June 7, I-5 will remain open to traffic during construction of the new overpass bridge. Drivers should watch for occasional lane restrictions and roadside construction workers. The work is part of the \$35 million Clarks Branch to Tunnel Mill Race bridge project, which is funded through the Oregon Transportation Investment Act. The project is scheduled for completion in spring 2007.

NSF GRANT AWARDED FOR GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS TRAINING

Lane Community College has been awarded a three-year grant totaling \$782,144 from the Advanced Technological Education fund of the National Science Foundation to develop coursework in geographic information science (GIS) curricula. The first-year award is \$280,620 and begins July 1, followed by \$269,052 in 2007, and \$232,472 in 2008. The grant project, "Mapping, Analyzing and Problem Solving Using Geographic Information Science: Implementing a GIS Curriculum for Technical Literacy," will bring GIS learning opportunities to students in science, social science and computer information technology.

Geographic information systems are mapping and analysis tools used in a growing number of workplace settings. For example, when a power outage occurs, a connected network finds and directs a location-specific response. When a police department analyzes crime data, it uses GIS software to map crime areas. Anything that has a location can be mapped, from the migratory patterns of whales to brain activity.

In Oregon, GIS is used by planning authorities, public utilities, human services, public safety, forestry, geosciences, and bio-resources. Other occupations increasingly use GIS to create visual-spatial representations of data, solve spatial problems, and combine quantitative data with qualitative analysis and reporting capability.

GIS literacy is low. Three Oregon community colleges provide highly technical training for GIS specialists, and four Oregon universities offer courses for upper division

and graduate students. Entry-level opportunities are few. "Our project will introduce large numbers of community college students to the potential GIS offers in solving significant social and scientific problems," says grant principal investigator Jane Benjamin.

Lane will address the literacy gap in two ways. GIS activities will be integrated into science and social science courses. The first activities should be in place by spring 2007. In addition, a three-course GIS sequence will be developed for articulation with universities. At the end of the grant period, about 700 students per term will be introduced to GIS through the classroom activities or the GIS courses.

Benjamin, a geography instructor, will work with geology instructor Sarah Ulerick; computer technology instructor Linda Loft; and geography instructor Lynn Songer. The team hopes that the GIS activities will encourage underrepresented students in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. These include women, minorities, first-infamily college students, and rural students. Real-world scenarios will demonstrate social and scientific relevance. Collaboration and teamwork will foster the interpersonal and organizational skills that are prized in today's workplace. Benjamin says, "Basic literacy in this rapidly advancing technology will open doors and prepare students with important job skills and future career choices."

Several community partners will serve as advisors on the project, including the Bureau of Land Management, Lane Council of Governments, Weyerhaeuser Company, Eugene Water and Electric Board, Eugene Public Works, Eugene Police Department, Clackamas Community College, University of Oregon, Oregon State University, and Western Oregon University. LONGHOUSE GROUNDBREAKING SET FOR JUNE 21

The Lane Community College Foundation and the Native American Student Association invite tribal elders and members, students, staff and the community to a groundbreaking ceremony for the Lane Native American Longhouse on Wednesday, June 21, at 10 a.m. The site overlooks the track, northwest corner of main campus. Ceremonies will include drumming and singing followed by a reception.

The longhouse will be the first on a community college campus that is not part of a tribal college.

Students at Lane represent each of Oregon's nine tribes and other tribes from across the country. The college is known for a strong Native American education program. Building a longhouse will enhance the program, benefit all students on campus, and provide additional meeting space for local community groups.

The entry for the 6,200-square-foot longhouse is a hall of honor which will feature the art and culture of Oregon's nine tribes. In keeping with Native American tradition, the longhouse will face cardinal east with an eastern entrance for traditional ceremonies. An indoor-outdoor kitchen allows space for community potlucks. The main hall is big enough for dancing, drumming and other traditional activities. Dressing room space is provided for dancers to don traditional regalia. Outdoor classroom space is planned adjacent to the building.

The architectural firm, StastnyBrun, also designed the Portland State University Native American Center and the Warm Springs Museum. The firm also has a contract to design a heritage center and museum for the Confederated Tribe of Siletz Indians.

Funding will come from a variety of sources. Approximately \$290,000 has been raised through donations from students, staff and Oregon tribes. Lane's Board of Education is contributing \$250,000 from the college's capital repair and improvement fund. In May, students approved a \$3, three-year fee to raise \$225,000 to \$300,000. College facilities staff will construct the longhouse, providing additional savings. The Longhouse Fundraising Committee is now focused on obtaining in-kind contributions of materials to meet the \$1.2 million goal.

Major donors include the Confederated Tribes of the Coos, Lower Umpqua and Siuslaw Indians; Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Spirit Mountain Community Fund; Confederated Tribes of the Siletz Indians; Coquille Indian Tribe; and Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians. Other major donors include the Oregon Country Fair, Oregon Cultural Trust, Santa Fe Tobacco Co. Foundation, and the Willamette National Forest. Several groups at Lane have contributed, including the American Indian Languages Program, Associated Students of Lane Community College, College Operations, Counseling Department, Information Technology Program, Board of Education, and the Native American Student Association. In-kind material donors include Leavitt's Trucking, McFarland Cascade, Moshofsky Truss, Wildish Construction Co., Farwest Steel, and others. Many individuals also have donated to the project.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT UNDERGOING UPGRADE

The construction work next to Gonyea Road at the west entrance to the college is the new wastewater treatment plant. The college has contracted with 2G Construction of Eugene to build the plant for \$1.8 million. Funds for this work will come from the bond project account. The new plant will treat wastewater through a natural process. After treatment, the discharge will be held in the ponds or pumped into Russell Creek. The water stored in the ponds will be of a high enough quality that it can be used to irrigate the athletic fields during the summer without any harmful effects to people coming in contact with it. The schedule calls for work to be completed by next December. Some short interruptions of traffic will occur as trucks bring materials to and away from the site.
