On Friday, July 7, IT applied the long-awaited Service Pack 1 (SP1) to GroupWise 7. The service pack fixed quite a number of bugs in the software, primarily better connectivity and speed to WebAccess. We had some unexpected issues (unrelated to the service pack application) that created some post office and internet mail outages, which we have mostly resolved.

Throughout the summer we will be creating a clustered GroupWise environment, which should make our system more fault tolerant. We will be migrating six physical servers to six virtual servers hosted by three physical nodes. This will be a gradual migration that we hope to complete before fall term.

In the meantime, we would like feedback from all LCC employees who use dial-up to get to GroupWise WebAccess from home. The original upgrade to WebAccess 7 last February created a performance issue with dial-up users that we believe has been resolved by SP1. We would like to remove the WebAccess 6.5 service, as we implemented it only as a temporary solution for dial-up users. I am also looking for demonstrations of material folklore like wood carving, weaving, stitchery, costuming, or the like. Traditional food demonstrations would be fun--the customary practices involving sushi making, for example, or tortillas. How about a tea ceremony? It is important that the demonstrations

are conducted by someone who practices them as part of a tradition--not someone who, for example, learned quilting from a book and is the only person in the family or community to do it. The students have a good understanding of folklore, folk groups, and genres. I have lots of films but it would be so nice to have some live performance. We are studying mythology this week--looking at Mayan and Native American myths. The class meets on Tues./Thurs from 2:30-4:30. Anytime--from now until the end of the quarter is open.
