BOARD REPORT FOR JULY: PRESIDENT EARNS FIFTH STRAIGHT OUTSTANDING EVALUATION

At the July 19 Lane Community College Board of Education meeting, President Mary Spilde received her fifth straight outstanding performance evaluation since becoming president in 2001. She was given high marks in each of seven areas including leadership and strategic direction, educational outcomes, board relations, financial management, staff supervision, communication, and governance. Her communication skills earned a perfect score, and she was strongly commended for compassionate leadership in an extremely difficult budget year.

In other action, Jay Bozievich was elected 2006/07 chair and Pat Riggs-Henson was elected vice chair.

The board approved local option levy ballot language (see article below).

The consent agenda passed, including the president's annual purchase authorizations; rejection of bids for the KLCC downtown building remodel and authorization to submit a new invitation to bid; and acceptance of a SAIF proposal for workers' compensation insurance.

The board renewed its policy on affirmative action.

Annual appointments to community organizations were approved including Roger Hall to the Lane Foundation, Susie Johnston to the Lane Council of Governments, Jay Bozievich to the Lane Economic Committee, and Mike Rose to the Oregon Community College Association.

The board revised its procurement policies to permit the president or designee to approve contracts of up to \$150,000 for improvements and up to \$100,000 for goods and services; to require a formal bid process for procurements above \$100,000; and to revise the value of asset capitalization to \$10,000.

All votes were 6-0 unanimous; Pat Riggs-Henson was absent.

Ten people spoke under Statements From the Audience, most of whom advocated for classified staff and the current seniority contract language.

A lengthy discussion on athletics fundraising was tabled. Administration will bring additional enrollment cost data to the next meeting.

The board reviewed its policy on harassment, and a new policy on advertising.

A benchmark report on the numbers of budgeted contracted staff FTE and student FTE was discussed.

The meeting adjourned at 8:37 p.m. The board will not meet in August. The next monthly meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, September 13. Submitted by Joan Aschim.

#### LOCAL OPTION BALLOT LANGUAGE APPROVED

Local option levy ballot language was approved 6-0 by the Lane Community College Board of Education at it's July 19 meeting. Pat Riggs-Henson was absent. The caption will read, "Five-year local option instructional levy." The question will read, "Shall the Lane Community College District levy \$1,366,372 annually for five years beginning July 1, 2007, to provide for college instructional programs and services? This measure may cause some property taxes to increase more than three percent." The summary will read, "Lane Community College District would use levy proceeds to fund instructional programs and services. Adoption of this levy would minimize additional budget impacts, such as program eliminations and lay-offs. Passage requires a majority of votes cast, with no turnout requirement. Passage of the levy would impose, over five years, a total of \$6,831,860, levied in five equal annual amounts of \$1,366,372 for tax years 2007-08 through 2011-12. It is estimated that the proposed tax would result in a rate of \$.06 per \$1,000 of assessed value, or \$9.00 a year in additional property taxes for a home whose assessed value is \$150,000 in tax year 2007-08. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of the estimate."

The levy will be on the November 7 ballot. The board decided in March to ask voters for support given continuing state funding shortfalls. Submitted by Joan Aschim.

# PRESIDENT SAYS STATE BOARD WANTS \$529 MILLION FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGES

In her report to the Lane Community College Board of Education on July 19, President Mary Spilde said the governor has pledged \$480 million for the state's community colleges, if re-elected. That's \$52 million more than this biennium's appropriation. However, the State Board of Education suggests that the amount be even greater and recommends \$529 million. Leigh Anne won the Erma Bombeck Humor Writing competition with her true essay on how her first mammogram caught on fire. In 2004, she won the humor in food writing contest, and in 2005 placed second in the Mona Schreiber Humorous Fiction competition. Her play, "Are We There Yet," was produced to sold-out audiences in January and May 2006 and her screenplay, "Star Struck", placed in the finals of the San Diego Film Festival in 2004. She just completed her first novel, "Life is Funny." Leigh Anne previously ran the wellness program of the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston. The original upgrade to Web Access 7 last February created a performance issue with dial-up users that we believe has been resolved by SP1. We would like to remove the Web Access 6.5 service, as we implemented it only as a temporary solution for dial-up users.
