FOURTH ANNUAL OREGON JAZZ FESTIVAL

Lane Community College and the UO School of Music Jazz Studies program join forces once again for the fourth annual Oregon Jazz Festival, January 18 and 19 at Lane. On Saturday, January 19, high school and middle school jazz groups will perform, receive feedback and attend clinics on jazz performance lead by OJF artist/clinicians throughout the day. The festival has drawn 32 middle school, high school groups from around the Northwest to perform and participate in clinics.

Evening Jazz Concerts take place both Friday and Saturday evenings.

Friday, January 18, 7:30 p.m., Performance Hall, building 6: The Lane Jazz Ensemble and the Oregon Jazz Ensemble perform with festival clinicians David Glenn, trombone (Whitman College); Dan Gailey, saxophone (Kansas University); Dana Landry, piano (University Northern Colorado) and Luis Bonilla, New York trombonist (Temple University and The Manhattan School of Music). Tickets are \$10 general admission, \$7 for students and seniors, available at the door one hour before the concert.

Saturday January 19, 7:30 p.m., Performance Hall, building 6: Headliner guest artist Luis Bonilla, trombone, performs with Randy Porter, piano; Dave Captein, bass; and Gary Hobbs, drums. Also featured will be two outstanding school groups selected from the Jazz Festival's participants. Tickets are \$18 general admission, \$12 for students and seniors, available at the door one hour before the concert. Approximately 100 tickets for the Saturday evening concert will go on sale to the general public on Thursday, January 10. Unlimited tickets are available for Friday's evening concert.

Directors Steve Owen (UO) and Ron Bertucci (Lane) are excited about the development and growth of this collaborative event. The two schools merged their existing festivals in 2005 (the Lane Jazz Festival and the Oregon Jazz Celebration), as both programs share a common philosophy and educational goals.

"Nothing is more important to both programs than to continue offering students of all ages and skill levels a hands-on experience working with some of the world's finest jazz artists and educators." says Owen.

"By teaming up on this event Lane's Music Department and the Jazz Studies Program at the UO School of Music are making a substantial contribution to jazz education in our region", says Ron Bertucci. "We've always shared the philosophy that our jazz festival should be educational and noncompetitive. KLCC RELOCATES

On January 4, KLCC moved all its contents, equipment and staff from its 40-year home on main campus to new digs at 136 W. 8th in Downtown Eugene. That day, Rachael McDonald hosted the final Morning Edition from the old studio. At 9 a.m., Tom Krumm began hosting Fresh Tracks from the new downtown studio.

The new KLCC location includes the SELCO Performance Hall, a space designed for live on-air concerts and a small audience. The inaugural concert will be performed by Misty River on February 2 at noon, during Saturday Cafe.

An Open House will be held the evening of March 7, during the First Friday Artwalk. Don Latarski (http://www.donlatarski.com/) will perform.

The move downtown gives KLCC three times the space and the capacity to deliver an even higher level of public service to all its listening communities. Funding for the purchase and remodeling of the station's new home came primarily from private donations to KLCC's Building Community Campaign, which is close to reaching its \$2.45 million goal.

FM&P PROJECT UPDATES

Projects completed over winter break:

- * Installed a stove in Bldg. 11, Room 131 for Art.
- * Completed the exhaust in the dental darkroom.
- * Replaced 27 domestic water system valves in the Center Building to allow isolation of areas for repairs.
- * Repaired a water line break on the west side of the Center Building.
- * Moved close to 100 lockers from Bldg. 10 to the Aviation Maintenance Training Facility (AMTF) at the airport.
- * Completed the data room and wireless access at the AMTF.
- * Compost mulch was installed around many of the inter campus planting areas.

LONGHOUSE: Gravel was moved and compacted and other preparation is proceeding for installation of the reinforced slab.

KLCC: Remodel of the building on W. 8th is nearing completion with KLCC operating from that location. The elevator jack that allows the elevator to operate to the second floor will be repaired over the next one to two weeks.

BLDG. 7 STORAGE YARD ROOF: Masonry work is complete and workers will be installing roof trusses as early as next week.

IT DATA CENTER UPGRADE: A majority of the electrical work has been completed and IT equipment has arrived. The air conditioning unit is being tested and could be installed next week.

BLDG. 16 CANOPY REPLACEMENT: Bids will be solicited starting next week.

BLDG. 20: The building was demolished over winter break and material was sent to EcoSort for recycling. A report on the recycling efforts will be published in an upcoming Weekly. The grounds will be re-graded and landscaped when weather permits. Orange fencing has been installed in the area to prevent pedestrian traffic through the area.

FLORENCE: A crew went to the Florence campus to complete several maintenance items. Bids will be solicited in about a week for mechanical work. Submitted by Susan Tatar for Facilities, Management and Planning.

DISABILITY SERVICES TIP: LETTERS OF ACCOMMODATION

Disability Services strongly advises students to meet with their instructors during an office hour to discuss their LOA (Letter of Accommodations) privately. The goal for this meeting is for the student and instructor to have a clear understanding of which accommodations the student may be using in class. After the instructor and student review the LOA together and discuss the accommodations, the faculty member is to sign the Faculty Acknowledgment Form. A signed Faculty Acknowledgment Form indicates that the instructor and student have had a meeting to discuss the accommodations and the instructor understands s/he may contact Disability Services to clarify any questions. BLDG. 16 CANOPY REPLACEMENT: The work will commence spring break or earlier with a cover over a pedestrian walkway.

BLDG. 11/131 and 10/200: The only remaining work is cabinet fabrication and installation by Facilities carpenters.

GROUNDS: The grounds crew is keeping up with icy conditions by de-icing stairs, ramps, skybridges, sloped walkways, and some critical areas in the parking lots including RideSource drop-off areas.

SUSTAINABILITY: The Sustainability Office reported that 35 people attended the Global Action Movie Day on January 17 in the Boardroom.

JANUARY BOARD REPORT

KLCC reporter Frank Nearing won accolades, applause and a 7-0 vote of approval on a resolution honoring his service in public news reporting at KLCC, from the Lane Board of Education at its January 9 meeting. Nearing volunteered at KLCC for 23 years after obtaining an associate degree in broadcasting from Lane in 1986. This followed a first career in social service. He has retired. He thanked the board, introduced his wife and daughter, and noted, among other things, that it was his 89th birthday.

The board also passed a resolution honoring Lyle Swetland, a founding member of the Board of Education and former director of development at Lane. Several members of the Swetland family accepted the award. Swetland passed away in November at age 88.

The board approved an inflationary tuition increase by 5-2 vote after a long discussion that centered on board policy regarding tuition increases. Members Tony McCown and Robert Ackerman voted no.

The board discussed using a CM/GC (construction manager/general contractor) alternative contracting process for the health and wellness building. CM/GC brings architects, contractors, and engineers together at the beginning of a project, which helps

avoid change orders. Final approval requires a public hearing, which the board plans for its February meeting.

In other action, the board approved the 2007/08 academic calendar; and board policies on budget preparation and adoption, and board officers.

The board heard about the work of the Career and Technical Education Coordinating Committee which oversees the college's 48 program advisory committees. The committees include more than 600 members from business, industry, labor, and the college who provide expertise and guidance to the college.

In other reports, the board continued its review of the community perception survey conducted in November.

The board reviewed a benchmark on the gender and ethnicity of graduates which showed that females earned 66 percent of degrees and certificates in 2006/07; that 11.7 percent of degrees and certificates were earned by students of color (including international students, or 11.2 percent excluding international students); and that in fall 2006, 13.6 percent of students were students of color (excluding international students).

The next regular meeting is set for February 13 in the Boardroom. Submitted by Joan Aschim, Marketing and Public Relations.

TUITION RATES FOR 2008/09

The Board of Education approved an adjustment for 2008/09 tuition rates using a 3.4 percent Higher Education Price Index, the standard yearly process for making tuition adjustments. These rates are what will be used in budget discussions and final rates for 2008/09 will be voted on in June and Enrollment Services will announce these to the campus at that time. The new rates would begin with summer term 2008. Each new rate was rounded off after applying the 3.4 percent HEPI increase; therefore the non-credit

contact hour remains at the 2007/08 rate of \$4. Upon final approval, 2008/09 rates will be:

In-state resident tuition/states bordering Oregon: \$75.50 per credit hour

International students: \$210 per credit hour Non-residents of Oregon: \$260 per credit hour

COMMUNITY COLLEGE SURVEY OF STUDENT ENGAGEMENT AT LANE

Lane is one of 14 Oregon community colleges and hundreds of other community colleges across the country that will be participating this term in the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). This national survey of students focuses on teaching, learning, and retention in community colleges. The survey is designed and coordinated through the Community College Leadership Program at the University of Texas at Austin.

Lane first conducted the CCSSE in 2005 and findings from that survey were instrumental in helping us create classes like First Year Experience that are intended to improve student success and retention. The findings also helped us design new strategies to improve student engagement even before students get to campus. One of the most recent initiatives linked to our CCSSE findings is the Back On Course intervention that serves some of our highest-risk students, those who had financial aid suspended and who, before this program, usually left Lane.

The survey will be administered in classes randomly selected by staff from CCSSE to ensure a representative sample of Lane students participates in the project and to preserve the integrity of the survey results.

SUSTAINABILITY: On January 31, Lane participated in a nation-wide "teach-in" about solutions to climate change, along with 1,750 other organizations. Twenty-five Lane faculty spent at least 15 minutes in their classes discussing climate change and solutions from their specific disciplines. Forty-five people also attended an afternoon panel discussion during which Lane faculty, staff, and students discussed climate change from the perspectives of science, health, religion, economics, and action.

UPDATE ON E-MAIL SPAM FILTERING

E-mail coming into the college is filtered to prevent spam from reaching your GroupWise Mailbox. The college receives a detailed weekly report of filtering activity. A notable statistic from the week of January 24: 88.5 percent of incoming e-mail was filtered out as spam. That's not a mistype: 88.5 percent of incoming mail was filtered out as spam. While that number is high, it is neither the highest percentage recorded nor unusually high. Our spam percentage consistently runs over 80 percent.

Two other numbers we watch are the number of false positives (e-mail filtered that we want delivered) and the number of false negatives (e-mail received that we want filtered). For the week of January 24 we reported 55 false positives and 229 false negatives. Total incoming messages for the week were 759,937. Submitted by Stephen F. Pruch, AVP for Information Technology.

ASSUME THAT E-MAIL IS PUBLIC INFORMATION

This is not something new, nor is it a change in college practice. It is a reminder of the very public nature of our e-mail communications. E-mail feels like a very private way of communicating; it's not. The college may be required to disclose it upon request or court order. E-mail created, received or stored with any college owned e-mail system (GroupWise being the primary one) or that relates to the conduct of the public's business is considered both college property and public information. This means, given a demonstrated need and/or a public request, that the college may examine the contents of your e-mail account. It also means that, given a valid public information request, the college is required to make e-mail public. This happened last year during the "gates" debate when the Register-Guard requested and received copies of e-mail relating to the installation of security gates. With very few exceptions, e-mail that either relates to the conduct of the public's business or that is contained on a system owned by a public entity is non-exempt and subject to public disclosure. Any college examination of e-mail accounts follows the protocols of college policy and union contracts. You've heard it before: "Don't type it unless you are comfortable seeing it on the front page of the Register-Guard". With very few exceptions, e-mail is public information. Submitted by Stephen F. UPDATE ON EMAIL SPAM FILTERING

Email coming into the college is filtered to prevent spam from reaching your GroupWise mailbox. The college receives a detailed weekly report of filtering activity. A notable statistic from the week of February 14: 87.3 percent of incoming email was filtered out as spam. That's not a mistype: 87.3 percent of incoming mail was filtered out as spam. While that number is high, it is neither the highest percentage recorded nor unusually high. Our spam percentage consistently runs over 80 percent.

Two other numbers we watch are the number of false positives (email filtered that we want delivered) and the number of false negatives (email received that we want filtered). ELECTIONS OFFICE ANTICIPATES HIGH PRIMARY ELECTION PARTICIPATION

Oregon's Primary Election is scheduled for Tuesday, May 20. It is anticipated that participation will be high at this year's primary. With frequent nationwide coverage on other states' primaries and many questions as to how Oregon Primary elections work, there is some important information that Lane County citizens may need to know:

Oregon has what is called a closed primary. If registered as a Democrat, a voter receives and qualifies to vote for nominating Democratic candidates, and all nonpartisan offices and measures. If registered as a Republican, a voter receives and qualifies to vote for nominating Republican candidates, and all nonpartisan offices and measures. There is a registered Independent Minor Party in Oregon. Such voters are referred to as Not Affiliated with a Party or Unaffiliated. If registered as any minor party, such as Independent, Libertarian, Pacific Green, etc., a voter receives and qualifies to vote only for all nonpartisan offices and measures.

The last day to change party affiliation on voter registration is April 29. A completed registration card must be filled out, signed, and received by Lane County Elections by 5 p.m. on that date. Postmarks do not count.

The last day to register to vote is April 29. A completed registration card must be filled out, signed, and received by 5 p.m. at Lane County Elections by that date or can be postmarked by that date if a new registration to Oregon. To ensure there isn't a conflict with change of party deadlines on an update, it is always better to contact the elections office to inquire if already registered or to be sure received by the 5 p.m. April 29 deadline.

As soon as anyone turns 17 years old they can register to vote. They must register by April 29 to qualify to vote in the May Primary, and turn 18 years old by Election Day.

Those registered to vote by April 29 and who are at least 17 years old at that time, and will be 18 years old on Election Day, will receive a ballot in the mail.

SELLER BEWARE

Recently a "book buyer" approached one of Lane's instructional departments, offering to purchase books from faculty. Many faculty members and departments receive "complimentary" and "free copy" books they have not requested and do not need. Items you receive in your capacity as a college employee may not be sold for personal gain. To do so violates the Oregon Government Ethics statute (ORS Chapter 244) and Board Policy D.080 (COPPS, Board of Education Policies, Miscellaneous, Conflict of Interest.) Such a sale exposes the seller to both civil penalties and disciplinary action.

The Bookstore does not buy "free" or "complimentary" books from students, faculty or used book wholesalers as such a practice is considered unethical by the academic, publishing, and retail communities. In a twist on this practice a "book buyer" has been offering to accept books for resale with the proceeds being donated to the Foundation. While this avoids legal penalties the college still cannot approve a practice considered inherently unethical. Inducing a public official to violate state law is also a violation of state law and if you are approached by a "book buyer" please notify a manager or Public Safety.

This does not mean you must hang on to valuable texts you don't want or need. You may send any excess "complimentary" books to Bookstore Manager Shelley Dutton, 5675. The Bookstore will work with the Library, resource centers, and student groups to make the books available for student use as appropriate. Submitted by Greg Morgan, 5516.

USING COLLEGE OWNED COMPUTERS

This is a reminder that the college has an Appropriate Use Policy for computers and network resources. The policy says that "Computing and networking resources are provided for the educational, academic, and administrative purposes of the college." NINETY PERCENT OF INCOMING E-MAIL IS SPAM

E-mail coming into the college is filtered to prevent spam from reaching your GroupWise Mailbox. The college receives a detailed weekly report of filtering activity. A notable statistic from the week of March 13: 90.2 percent of incoming e-mail was filtered out as spam. That's not a mistype: 90.2 percent of incoming mail was filtered out as spam. While that number is high, it is not the highest recorded. Our spam percentage consistently runs over 80 percent.

Two other numbers we watch are the number of false positives (e-mail filtered that we want delivered) and the number of false negatives (e-mail received that we want filtered). For the week of March 13 we reported 24 false positives and 217 false negatives. Total incoming messages for the week were 1,041,391.

Strategy #2 in the document linked at the end of this paragraph will enable you to stop searching through your quarantine for student e-mails. Strategy #4 describes how to whitelist all quarantined student e-mails at one time, so you won't have to look at your quarantine for the rest of the term. See http://lanecc.edu/it/hdrefs/digitar-external-emails.pdf

Whether a student is in your frequent contacts or is responding to an e-mail from you will have no effect on whether or not their e-mail will be quarantined. The quarantine is based on the characteristics of the incoming mail only. Whitelisting the student e-mails at the DigiTar quarantine, as described in the link above, will ensure that those addresses are never quarantined again.

FM&P PROJECT UPDATE

LONGHOUSE: Bids were opened for the log erection and wood framing on April 23. The apparent low bidder was McBeth Builders. The bid award has to be approved by the board at its May meeting. Work will also begin soon to pour the concrete slab for the building.

MAINTENANCE: FMP staff priorities this week are risk management and safety items required by an insurance audit.

BLDG. 1 LIGHTING: The lighting system is currently on override which means all lights are on 24/7 pending repairs to the system. The repairs are a high priority energy conservation issue so Facilities staff and an electrical contractor have been working to identify what parts and adjustments are needed.

BLDG. 16 CANOPY: The canopy has been installed and workers will be sealing joints to prevent leaks.

PRESSURE WASHING: With the arrival of spring, workers will be scheduled to pressure wash some buildings on campus over the next couple of months.

FMP PROJECT UPDATE

SOLAR ELECTRIC PROJECT: Work began last week on the east side of building 24 to prepare for the installation of photovoltaic panels by the Renewable Energy Technician class. Contractors drilled a large hole to hold one pole for the project this spring and one for the future. Once students install the panels, an electrical contractor will connect the panels to bring electricity from the sun to the building Finally we will install an educational sign that will help explain the project for our students, staff and the public. LONGHOUSE: McBeth Builders, Inc. will have a large crane delivered and plans to begin log erection this week.

BUILDINGS 1 & 16 LIGHTING PROJECT: Building 1 first floor is nearly done but parts need to be replaced for the second floor. Christensen Electric is working in building 16 replacing parts and commissioning.

CENTER BUILDING RELIEF FANS: Bid opening is next week for a contractor to replace old relief fans in the Center building. The new equipment will save energy and maintain air pressure so doors don't fly open or become difficult to pull open.

RETURN TO SERVICE BUILDING: A bid is out to build a metal stairway to the second level storage area at the RTS building near the airport. This work is in preparation of the Aviation Maintenance move from building 10 to the RTS building. Design work is in progress to prepare for all the equipment connections needed at RTS.

BIO-SOLIDS DRYING: Drying of the bio-solids in the lagoon ponds will continue this spring when FMP has bid results next week. The selected contractor will use equipment with an auger to turn over the material to speed up the drying process. Weather permitting, the process should be complete in lagoon #1 in about two weeks and in lagoon #2 in about two-to-six weeks.

KLCC PAINTING PROJECT: The painters completed painting the exterior of the KLCC building downtown but dry rot was discovered around a window frame. Work to replace that second floor window will be done this summer.

PAVING PROJECTS: Main campus parking lots will undergo maintenance and repairs this summer. Facilities staff will be coordinating with events that are scheduled. In addition, we will be working with the users at the Wildish building to schedule an overlay, re-striping, and installation of signs and bumpers next to adjacent buildings.

HEALTH & WELLNESS BUILDING: Programming is continuing with meetings between LCC staff and the architects. Commissioning agent proposals are being received and evaluated.

We are considering getting pricing from several local professional firms that specialize in preserving and relocating established nests in accordance with all laws, regulations, and policies. BOARD APPROVES BOND MEASURE

The Lane Community College Board of Education voted unanimously Wednesday to place an \$83 million bond measure on the November 4 ballot to fund facilities renovations, upgrades and remodels for workforce training and education.

The 15-year bond would continue the investment of approximately 25 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value that property owners are paying on the current bond, which retires in 2009.

"Lane's mission is to help people achieve their dreams," said board chair Pat Riggs-Henson. "As a responsible steward of the public's resources, we need to update our classrooms and infrastructure."

"This would make a huge difference for Lane," said President Mary Spilde. "Over the past few years we've focused our scarce resources on instruction and services. This is an exciting opportunity to reinvest in and renew Lane Community College."

Many buildings on main campus are more than 40 years old and need new heating and cooling systems, plumbing, roofing, and other upgrades. Classrooms and labs need renovations to increase access and allow multiple uses, alleviate crowding during peak demand times, and provide appropriate instructional technology and equipment.

NEW AFTER-HOURS DISPATCH SERVICE FOR PUBLIC SAFETY

Effective July 11, Campus Public Safety will have a new after-hours dispatch service. Junction City Police Department will answer the emergency line (5555) in the evenings after 5 p.m. and on weekends. Public Safety will continue to answer the emergency line between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Junction City Police will be responsible to dispatch emergency calls to Campus Public Safety officers and assist officers with contacting outside emergency services such as fire, police and ambulance response.

"This is a collaborative partnership that will enhance service response and the professionalism of our dedicated Public Safety team," says Katherine Vos, Operations Manager of Public Safety. The emergency phones (including the new blue phones) will invisibly transfer to Junction City where the trained dispatcher will answer "Junction City Police." The dispatcher will have maps of the campus and many are familiar with LCC as most attended classes here campus.

Vos reminds everyone that the emergency line should only be used for those situations that warrant an immediate public safety, fire or medical aid response. All other non-emergency calls for service should be directed to Campus Public Safety non-emergency line, 5558. Non-emergency service calls are those that don't require an immediate response such as unlocking a door, lost and found items, and informational questions. The non-emergency line is answered during normal business hours. Public Safety officers check the non-emergency line periodically for messages and will return calls during non-business hours. SEVEN TIMES IN SEVEN YEARS--TOP MARKS FOR THE PRESIDENT

President Mary Spilde received her seventh straight outstanding performance evaluation from the Board of Education at its July 9 meeting. "Mary Spilde is Lane Community College's greatest asset," said past chair Pat Riggs-Henson. The president was evaluated on several points within each of seven performance categories on a scale of 1 to 5. The categories were: leadership and strategic direction, educational outcomes, board relations, financial management, staff management and supervision, communication, and decision-making and governance. Ratings of five dominated every category. Nothing came in less than four, and perfect scores were given for achieving educational outcomes, and making effective decisions.

Accomplishments noted by the board were launching innovative new programs with little or no added burden to the general fund. The board also credited the president for "significant advances towards long-term fiscal stability" in difficult economic times by working with legislative and government officials and increasing fundraising efforts.

The board commended the president for her new leadership roles as co-chair of the Post-Secondary Quality Education Commission, and chair-elect of the American Association of Community Colleges.

LEAVING DOGS IN HOT VEHICLES IS NOT COOL

Public Safety reminder: As the summer heats up, it's important to be aware of the dangers of leaving companion animals inside hot cars. Every year, dogs die after being locked inside cars while their guardians work, visit, attend class, or enroll. These tragic deaths are entirely preventable.

Every time we drive with a dog, we need to ask ourselves, "Is it too hot to take my dog along today?" Warm weather can literally be a killer for a dog left inside a car. When it's 85 degrees out, the temperature inside a car - even with the windows left slightly open - can soar to 102 degrees in 10 minutes and can reach 120 in just half an hour. On hotter days, the temperature will climb even higher. A dog's normal body temperature ranges from 101 to 102.5 degrees. Dogs can withstand a body temperature of 107 to 108 degrees for only a very short period of time before suffering brain damage or death.

If your dog is overcome by the heat, immediately soak them with water and seek veterinary care as soon as possible. And if you see a dog in a potentially dangerous situation in a hot car, call either LCC Public Safety (if on campus), your local police department or the Humane Society. MILLER FOUNDATION ISSUES SCHOLARSHIP CHALLENGE

Oregon's 17 community colleges have been challenged to outpace their fundraising for student scholarship money next year, thanks to a challenge grant from the James F. and Marion L. Miller Foundation.

The Miller Foundation, an independent, private organization established to enhance the quality of life of Oregonians through support of the arts and education, has offered to donate \$1.5 million in total to the 17 community colleges. The challenges range from \$50,000 up to \$320,000 depending on the size of the college. Lane would receive \$150,000 and possibly more if other colleges do not meet their target and funds are redistributed to colleges who meet or exceed their target.

To get the donation, each college's foundation has to raise an equal amount in new money.

If the colleges can meet the challenge, it would result in hundreds of additional scholarships for some of the most financially strapped students throughout Oregon.

FACILITIES PROJECT UPDATE

LONGHOUSE: LCC carpenters are siding with cedar shingles and the framing contractor will complete their work this week. The weather-tight shell is on schedule to be completed by October 1.

EXCEPTIONAL QUALITY BIOSOLIDS: Drying is complete to 75 percent solids. Test results will be back on September 8 to determine if the material meets the requirements for Class A biosolids. Material will be removed from the ponds after tests are complete and approved.

RTS REMODEL AND MOVE: Stairway construction will start on August 25 and is expected to be complete September 5 at the AMTF building at the airport, also known as the Return to Service or RTS building. Bids are out for the Utility Upgrade Package for the RTS and hangar, but a construction start of August 20 is pending permit approvals.

CHILDCARE BUILDING 25 IMPROVEMENTS: Child Care building 25 will undergo a remodel to prepare a portion of the building for use by Head Start. Facilities staff and architects are fast-tracking the project for completion in the fall.

FLORENCE HVAC CONTROLS UPGRADE: The contractor is in the process of submitting a schedule and getting approvals for materials to be used for the work.

COTTAGE GROVE WALL REPAIR: Bids have been advertised for work to repair the wall on the southeast side damaged from leaks. Once we have a successful bidder, work will begin in late August and finish before fall term starts.

PARKING LOT RE-STRIPING: LCC painters have been working on parking lots to complete painting lines and curbs by fall term.

BUILDING 7 REMODEL: The remodel to relocate Public Safety to Building 7 is progressing with the electrical shop moving from the second floor to the first floor area once occupied by the grounds department. Frank and his crew now have an office in Building 32, which was once just equipment storage.

DENTAL LAB UPGRADE: The Building 4 dental lab upgrade largely paid for by grant funds will be complete by August 15. Cabinets were refinished, plumbing repaired

and installed, and new countertops installed. An instructional podium and new flooring are scheduled to be installed this week. Most of the Facilities trades were involved in the project, as well as IT staff for the upgrade to smart classroom equipment.

POWER WASHING CONCETE: Facilities staff has been working around campus to clean off concrete walkways, stairs and terraces this summer to get ready for students returning fall term.

LANE STUDENTS TO ATTEND NATIONAL CONVENTIONS -- DEMOCRATIC AND REPUBLICAN

Two Lane Community College students with a passion for politics are headed for the national presidential nominating conventions. Matt Keating of Eugene will represent the 4th Congressional District as a delegate to the Democratic National Convention from August 25-28 in Denver. Keating, 32, is a theater arts major. He organized the Lane Community College chapter of Oregon Students for Obama. Chase Connor of Eugene will serve as a page at the Republican National Convention from September 1-4 in Minneapolis. He co-founded the Lane County Young Republicans. Connor, 20, is a hospitality major.

Each student will report on his convention experience through Lane's blog, Life@Lane, available from the college homepage. While they couldn't differ more in their political opinions, both students have completed internships through Lane's Cooperative Education program and each credits Lane faculty, including political science instructor co-op coordinator Steve Candee, for inspiring them to pursue their dreams. Through the co-op program, Candee connected the students with people and opportunities that matched their interests. Each has made close friends through their internships and each has done canvassing, signed up voters, and advocated for their respective causes and candidates. Connor says working on a campaign is the only way to go. "Democracy is not a spectator sport and you can't teach campaigning in a classroom. You have to experience it in real life." For each student, going to the convention is an unprecedented thrill.

Candee teaches political science and coordinates internships in political and legal offices. He is well known by local and state elected officials, and many of them give guest lectures or join panel discussions in his classes. This fall, for instance, he is lining up a discussion with Eugene mayoral candidates Kitty Piercy and Jim Torrey. Candee has bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Oregon and has taught at Lane for 22 years.

"I really want to get students to challenge their own beliefs and to gain more confidence in their beliefs and understand why they feel the way they do and be able to back it up," says Candee. "It's my job to find out what students' interests are and help them find opportunities to grow in those interests. My goal is to act in the interests of my students. That's my bottom line."

Cooperative education integrates on-the-job work or volunteer experience with academic studies. Students earn credit and a grade while working full-time or part-time in positions related to their career and academic goals. About 2,000 students and 800 employers participate in the co-op program each year, and Lane's program is one of the largest at any U.S. two-year college. EARLY INDICATORS SHOW INCREASED DEMAND

Admissions and financial aid staff are accustomed to seeing an increase in students as fall term approaches, but demand is noticeably up this year.

- Early orientation and registration sessions attracted 2,000 students, or 67 percent more than last year's attendance of 1,200.
- Applications for admission have been completed by 7,897 new students, compared to 6,215 last year as of last week, an increase of 27 percent.
- Financial aid applications are up 23 percent. Financial aid staff say their colleagues at other Oregon community colleges report similar increases.

"It's common in a depressed economy and in times of higher unemployment for people to go back to college to seek training or retraining so they can qualify for new employment opportunities," says Helen Garrett, Associate Dean of Student Affairs for Enrollment and Student Financial Services.

A recent study shows that a one percentage-point increase in the unemployment rate leads to an increase in total FTE (full-time equivalent) enrollment of 1.093 percent. The study used an econometric regression model and enrollment data for all Oregon community colleges from 1986-87 through 2005-06.

Lane does not report official enrollment figures until the fourth week of each term. Submitted by the editor.

TUTORING SERVED 3,100 STUDENTS; GRADES IMPROVED

The coordinated effort to serve credit students with peer tutor support continues this academic year. Last year the combined departments served over 3,100 students and generated more than 56 FTE. Students surveyed expressed a significant increase in grades earned due to the tutoring support. Of those surveyed, 37 percent expected an A or B before tutoring. That grew to a whopping 81 percent after tutoring. Likewise, the 15 percent who expected non-passing grades before tutoring dropped to 1 percent.

Tutoring will continue in the following subjects: Academic Learning Skills, Accounting, Business, Computers, Math, Music, Psychology, Science, Speech and Writing. Hopefully you have received a sticky pad with 25 pre-printed notes listing the locations of tutor centers. Please stick one on the first assignment returned to students to help get the word out. Tutors will begin week two. Instructors are encouraged to bring classes to the appropriate tutor center for a tour. By talking about tutoring as the student success strategy that it is, we can help reduce the stigma that keeps many students away.

And remember, just because a student has visited a tutor, does not mean that the assignment will be done perfectly. Tutors work with students at their current skill level. Like weight loss, improvement happens gradually with persistence. The earlier in the term a student begins working with tutors the better. Thanks for spreading the word. Questions? LEE IMONEN PARTICIPATES IN REGIONAL ART EXHIBIT

INDOOR TEMPERATURE GUIDELINES

We at Facilities Management and Planning understand the importance of a comfortable work and study environment and want to work with everyone to save energy and maintain comfort.

With the change of season upon us this is an appropriate time to remind everyone of the indoor temperature guidelines, adopted in 2006 as part of the energy policy, and in an effort to balance a comfortable learning and working environment with energy conservation. We recognize that comfort varies for individuals and have developed indoor temperature guidelines based on scientific studies to create comfortable conditions for the greatest number of students and staff.

Warm Weather Month Guidelines: 74 to 77 degrees F

Cool Weather Month Guidelines: 68 to 73 degrees F
Ancillary Space (Hallways, Lobbies, Stairwells): 63 to 82 degrees F
Notes:

- During transition months, such as October and April, guideline ranges expand to 68 to 77. These expanded ranges also apply during extreme weather conditions and periods of high electric demand.
- Guidelines are applied during normal business hours.
- Staff and students are encouraged to wear clothing that can be adjusted to maintain personal comfort.

KLCC RAISES A RECORD \$290,180 DURING FALL RADIOTHON

KLCC reached its Fall Radiothon goal of \$290,000 with five minutes to spare at 11:55 a.m. on Thursday, October 9. A total of \$290,180 was pledged, the largest raised in KLCC history. More than 3,500 Oregon households contributed. Online contributions came from as far as Alaska, Missouri, and Spain. Radiothon began with \$162,550 in the bank, thanks to 2,026 "Thon Busters" who contributed in the weeks before Radiothon. The remaining \$127,630 came from 1,526 listeners who phoned in a pledge or contributed online during the seven days of Radiothon. Member contributions help cover the cost of NPR news, nationally syndicated programs, locally programmed music, community information, live broadcasts of special events, and intelligent entertainment all year long. FACILITIES SUMMER PROJECTS UPDATE

LONGHOUSE: Cedar shakes and roof are on and the longhouse is almost weather-tight for winter. Doors, windows, insulation, fire protection, and heating will be installed to complete this phase. Additional site work is being done to provide utility installations.

EXCEPTIONAL QUALITY BIOSOLIDS: Material from the lagoon ponds was removed and distributed throughout the campus for landscaping projects. The wastewater treatment project is nearing completion after several years of hard work and extensive planning with regulatory agencies.

RTS REMODEL AND MOVE: At the Aviation Maintenance Training Facility (AMTF) also know as Return-to-Service at the airport, contractors have installed a new stairway to a storage area and are working on infrastructure to provide electrical, gas and power to the equipment that will be moved from building 10. The move from building 10 has started with LCC staff and will continue through winter term. This work is needed to improve synergies within the Aviation Technology programs and provide swing space for the upcoming bond work (hopefully).

BUILDING 3 ADMINISTRATION REMODEL: Planning and pre-construction has started on creating offices from the conference room on the second floor of building 3. LCC trades will do the work.

CHILDCARE BUILDING 25 IMPROVEMENTS: Head Start is ready to occupy part of building 27 so LCC trades and a contractor made improvements were made to building 25 to accommodate LCC functions. Signage at the childcare buildings was updated to reflect the department changes.

ART DEPARTMENT REMODELS: Building 11, room 131 and building 10, room 200, have been remodeled to accommodate changes in the art program. Carpenters, general services, the locksmith, and electricians have been involved.

FLORENCE HVAC CONTROLS UPGRADE: The controls contractor has completed two visits to test connections to the existing building management systems in preparation for the installation phase of the project.

SOLAR ELECTRIC INSTALLATION: The solar panel has been installed at building 24 and work is proceeding in preparation for the project's final electrical inspection. This work includes installing concrete at the base of the poles and installing signs on electrical equipment.

EXTERIOR LIGHTING CONTROLS UPGRADES: 12 electronic controls systems were installed this summer to upgrade daylight saving time and increase energy

efficiency programming options. The project covers a substantial part of the parking lot and exterior building lighting on main campus. Commissioning by the electrical shop staff and energy analyst started on October 3. We appreciate your patience as we work on programming schedules and staff training for these new systems.

COTTAGE GROVE WALL REPAIR: A persistent leak in a wall has been repaired by outside contractors with help from LCC trades. The blue tarp has finally been decommissioned.

PARKING LOT IMPROVEMENTS: LCC painters with extra part-time help painted lines and curbs in parking lots this summer. Several more ADA parking stalls were added to the campus inventory. A contractor did patching and overlay in some of the lots. An improved drop off/pick up shelter area with ADA access is being installed north of building 7 Campus Services. Future plans are for improvement to the Ride Source van drop off/pickup area.

BUILDING 7 REMODEL: Facilities electrical shop and grounds shops were relocated this summer with the help of part-time staff.

DENTAL LAB UPGRADE: The building 4 lab has been completed and ready for use fall term.

CENTER RELIEF FAN REPLACEMENT: The project to help control air in the Center building has been completed except for some air balancing. Some staff has noticed the doors now close. Indoor air quality will improve with more fresh air and better control of cooking smells and fumes re-entering the building.

POWER WASHING CONCETE: General Services staff worked during the summer to power wash stairs and walkways around campus.

OTHER PROJECTS:

- Smart Classroom Upgrades: Carpenters, electricians and other trades assisted IT to install new podiums and equipment in several classrooms.
- Smoking shelters were relocated by facilities staff and will be permanently installed.
- Satellite dish used by KLCC was removed.
- Building 11 art kiln ducting was improved.
- Safety items: Numerous items were completed including installing 10 new eyewash stations.
- Siltcoos boathouse was re-roofed and the Florence building was painted by LCC painters.
- KLCC building on West 8th was painted by LCC painters.
- Ceilings were replaced in several locations by the carpenters.
- Flooring was replaced in six building 11 classrooms.
- Enrollment Services Lektreiver file system was removed and re-installed in Facilities, and electricians and carpenters assisted IT and College Finance in installing the LobbyVision and Higher One ATM.
- Enrollment Services is having Steelcase reconfigured by facilities staff.
- Re-keying was done for the Wildish building and keys were made for staff.
- Indoor Environmental Quality issues were taken care of in building 17 and archives.
- Building 5 ceramic tile in the showers was repaired with the help of part-time staff.
- The grounds crew landscaped Classified Hill between buildings 3 and 4.
- Repairs to electrical equipment discovered with thermal imaging is ongoing by the electrical shop.

The electronic mail function which enables collegewide distribution of messages ("LCC Employees" distribution list) should be used only for messages of urgent, collegewide importance. Only messages directly related to college business should be distributed using the "LCC Employees" distribution list. General information of collegewide interest should be distributed through The Weekly.

The purpose of this guideline is:

- 1. To minimize network traffic;
- 2. To minimize staff reading time (each global message consumes roughly four hours of staff time which equates to well over \$200);
- 3. To ensure college resources are used for college business (and not for peripheral or superficial issues); and
- 4. To maintain the solemnity of the "LCC Employees" distribution list; i.e., when a message appears addressed to "LCC Employees", it should be regarded as highly important and read immediately.
