The Library subscribes to a newspaper database called *US Major Dailies*. *U.S. Major Dailies* provides access to the five most respected U.S. national and regional newspapers, including *The New York Times* and *Washington Post, The Wall Street Journal*, and exclusive access to *The Los Angeles Times* and *Chicago Tribune*. The titles offer researchers thorough and timely coverage of local, regional,

and world events with journalistic balance and perspective. Here is a complete list of titles and date ranges accessible through *US Major Dailies:*

## New Database! Ethnic Diversity Source



Ethnic Diversity Source is new resource that supports the study of many different ethnic populations with respect to their cultures, traditions and lived experiences. Ethnic Diversity Source covers the experiences of African Americans, Jewish Americans, Asian Americans, European Americans, Arab Americans, Asian Americans,

Latinx Americans, Native Americans, Pacific Islanders and Multiracial Americans. It provides full text from a growing list of sources including magazines, ebooks, biographies, primary source documents, and almost 350 peer-reviewed journals. It also includes over 900 relevant, curated videos from the Associated Press.
