Configure Google Scholar to Link to Library Databases

Google Scholar can be a powerful source of scholarly information. It's very easy to use, looking and feeling just like Google, but the results you will get are very different. Lane Community College Library participates in Google Scholar's Library Links program. This means that when you search Google Scholar, you can easily see what articles you have **free access** to through LCC Library's database subscriptions. You don't need to configure Google to take advantage of Library Links when you are on campus. It is automatic. But if you are off-campus:

1. Go to [Google Scholar](#).
2. Click on the hamburger menu in the upper-left hand corner of the page (the three horizontal lines).
3. Click on "Settings," then click on "Library Links."
4. Search for Lane Community College, then put a checkmark by it and hit save.

When searching, look for articles labelled "Check Full-text@LaneCC." Click on this link to access the article. That's it!

New Library Database: JSTOR



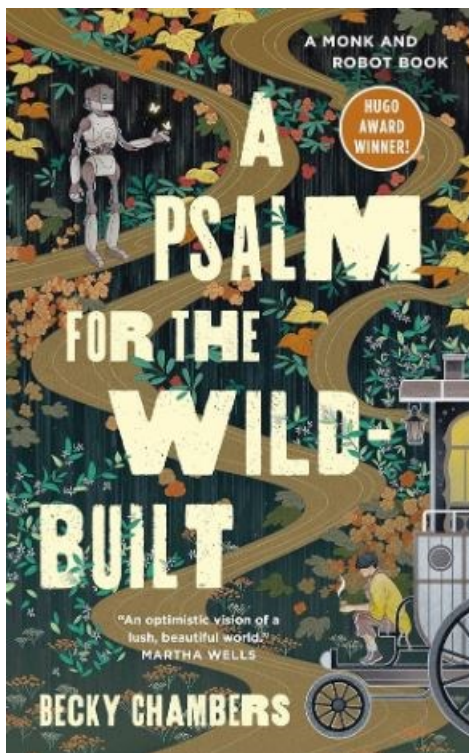

A Psalm for the Wild-Built is the first book in a two-part sci-fi series called Monk & Robot. Dedicated to "*anybody who could use a break*," the story reminds us that even the most difficult questions in life can be approached with gentleness and care.
