How to Determine whether or not the LCC Library Provides Access to a Particular Journal

You can use our online catalog to find out whether or not we subscribe to a particular journal via one of our databases. Start at our home page, library.lanecc.edu. Type in the title of the journal you are looking for in the catalog search box, then instead of "All Items," select "Journal Titles."

Find **books, ebooks, dvds, magazines, etc.** in the library catalog

Instead of "LCC + Summit," select "LCC Only"

Hit the search button. If we offer access to the journal, you'll see it on the next screen. To see which database has it, click on the name of the journal, then on the next screen, after "Full text available at," click on the name of the database:

Available from 1994.

If it's an EBSCOhost journal, you can click on the name of the year and then the issue number to find a particular article. Or you can click on "Search within this publication" to search within this single journal. When you click on it, EBSCO will fill in the blank with the name of the journal you are searching. Insert an "AND" between the name of the journal and your search terms, like so:

JN "Journal of American College Health" AND vaccinations

If the LCC Library Doesn't Have the Journal Article You Are Looking for, Request It via Interlibrary Loan!

The Library provides a simple online form you can fill out and submit if you would like us to get a copy of a journal article for you from another library. To find it, start at our website at library.lanecc.edu and click on “Use the Library” at the top of the page:

Then click on “Borrow From Other Libraries”

Then click on “Interlibrary Loan”

Then click on the green “Place an ILL Request” button:

Then fill out the form with your contact information and information about the article you are looking for. It says that “materials usually arrive within seven to ten days, but they may take as long as four weeks to arrive.” But journal articles often arrive in your email inbox within a few days.
